They need to learn to be part of a Christian community and to work with others to spread the Gospel through acts of love and service.



In the Gospel at Mass, Jesus replied to those who say there is no resurrection ~ *The God of Abraham is God of the living, for all are in fact, alive to God*. The ones who lived only for this life without hope of life with God forever, were the "Sadducees". We who have a relationship with Jesus have hope you see.

How can we know this? We come to know we are alive to God when we have a personal relationship with God who is alive to us. In the first reading we hear how four brothers could say "We are prepared to die rather than break the laws of our ancestors". 2 Mac 7:2 They did die because they believed "the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever".

If we think that breaking the law to eat a little bacon is not that important and certainly not worth dying for, then we miss the point. Eating pork for the Jewish people was the first step in denying their religion. Worshipping idols as gods was the last step. These brothers were committed to God who was faithful to their people, the descendants of Abraham. They followed the law God gave to Moses. They would not betray that relationship with their God.

This is a challenge for us: Who among us would be prepared to die for our belief that Jesus rose from the dead? Well the martyrs did witness to their belief in resurrection and they put up with torture and death.

How do we come to believe in resurrection? We ask and we seek for this faith to be given. We receive a gift. Therefore, we ask and pray to the Giver, for the presence and power of the Holy Spirit to reveal this mystery to us. We seek to know Jesus and we trust "relying on God's promise we shall be raised up by him". 2 Mac 7:14

We can become alive to God through Jesus living in us. This is our faith. We say it in the Creed at Mass.

I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
