Dear Parishioners,,

The month of November is traditionally a time when we remember and pray for all those who have passed from this world into the fullness of Gods loving embrace. In a particular way, this Sunday also commemorates the Centenary of the Armistice that brought an end to the horrific years of conflict that is known as World War 1.

Significant numbers of Australians were present in various theatres during this time, and at all Masses this weekend we honour their service and commitment, and the families who suffered so much with their absence and loss. Please note that the proper prayers of the Mass this weekend will be taken from "The Mass for the Preservation of Peace and Justice."

I would also like to draw your attention to the special Memorial Mass for parents who have experienced pregnancy, infancy and child loss which will take place on Thursday 29th November at OLHC church at Epping. Everyone, whether parishioners or not, are most welcome! For more information please see today's bulletin.

Secondly, this Sunday marks Prison Sunday, an opportunity to remember and do all we can to reach out to prisoners, their families, prison chaplains (of which we are blessed to have at least one in our parish along with those other parishioners who regularly visit various prisons throughout Sydney), victims of crime and all those working in the prison system. During this Year of Youth, the Australian Catholic Prisoners Pastoral Care Council has chosen to raise awareness, in particular, of youth in juvenile detention. Recent events in the Northern Territory have highlighted the importance of Australians responding urgently and justly to this huge challenge within our prison system. May the Holy Spirit guide us in our response!

Thirdly, I once again ask for parishioners to seriously consider assisting in the parent role essential to the continuation of Antioch in our parish. If, as many of you have said on numerous occasions, the parish needs to be serious about youth being a priority and support the growth in faith of our young people, then it is up to you, the parishioners to provide the ministry required.

If no one comes forward I will then presume that you, the parish have spoken, and I will have no option but to cease our Antioch youth ministry. Given the high quality of our young people currently involved, it would be a tremendous shame if this was to be the case. At the very least, let us all seriously take this matter to prayer.

Finally, our end of year social this year will be a "Parish Thanksgiving" on the evening of Thursday 22nd November, an opportunity for all of us to come together before the end of the year and thank God for all God's blessings on our parish throughout the course of 2018. The evening will commence with Mass at 7pm followed by supper in the parish hall. If you haven't done so already please RSVP no later than this week. Everyone is welcome!

Prison Sunday to focus on youth justice

Media Release

October 12, 2018

Inspired by the Australian Catholic Church's Year of Youth, the focus of Prison Sunday on November 11 will be youth justice and juvenile detention.

Prison Sunday commenced in 2016, during the Year of Mercy, as an initiative of Pope Francis to observe the Jubilee for Prisoners.

"We need to nourish the roots of our hope so that they can bear fruit ... despite whatever evil we have done. There is no corner of our heart that cannot be touched by God's love," Pope Francis said at the time.

Bishop Terry Brady, Bishops' Delegate to the Australian Catholic Prisoners Pastoral Care Council (ACPPCC) and chair of the Bishops Commission for Pastoral Life, said youth detention systems in some Australian states and territories were under significant stress, leaving vulnerable young people without the services they need to turn their lives around.

"At any time, for example in Victoria, there are around 200 children and young people, aged between 10 and 24 years old, incarcerated in youth justice centres. The Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the Northern Territory last year also highlighted the need for fundamental reform in detention and child protection systems in the Northern Territory," he said.

"Prison Sunday provides a time for all Catholics to think about the conditions in our prisons and what we as Catholics – in our schools, parishes and welfare organisations – can do to make a difference.

"As the [ACBC Social Justice Statement noted in 2011-2012](#), we know that the majority of Australia's prisoners come from the most disadvantaged sections of the community: Indigenous people, the underprivileged and those suffering mental illness.

"Prison chaplains are a key group working alongside prisoners, their families and prison authorities. Through their ministry they personify the Scripture quote from the Book of Ruth: 'Wherever you go, I shall go'.

"We thank those working in prison chaplaincy for their tireless, difficult and dedicated work, serving those unseen members of our community and supporting prisoners' families through trying times," Bishop Brady said.

"We pray also at this time for those innocent people impacted by crime and the affect that crime has had on their lives.

"We remember the words in our Prayer for Prisoners, that God has great love for us all and that he is a 'God of Mercy and forgiveness'."



Congratulations to Margaret Wiseman, Chaplain at Silverwater Women's Correctional Centre for her care and dedication to all those Inmates. May God continue to bless her in her ministry.

Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel—Trust

There were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years and a severe famine spread over the entire land. It was to none of these that Elijah was sent, but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon (Luke 4:25-26).

Sent though he is, Elijah seemingly forgets to help the widow and her tiny son at all. Instead he asks her to get food and drink for himself (First Reading).

She says she has "only a handful of flour" at home in her jar, and "a little oil" in her jug. She is collecting wood to cook the very last meal she and her young son will ever eat. After that they will die of starvation and thirst.

When the chips are down, let go and let God. Even in your last extremity. Elijah still seems to demand their very last meal for himself. He asks for water; the widow turns on her heel to get her last little trace of water. As she goes, Elijah shouted after her, "Please bring along a bit of bread"! He might just as well have said, "Gimme." But God has a trick up his sleeve.

We hear it when Elijah now repeats what God had commissioned:

The God of Israel says, "The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth."

Who knows what our widow made out of these words, which were all she had to rely on.

But rely she did. She bakes her last tiny bit of bread—in front of the wide eyes of her son—and takes every bite of it to Elijah.

Does this story make sense? Not so far. Then what is it saying?

That the widow trusted in God's goodness even in the face of impending death. She instinctively responded by releasing her own control of things. This is the root meaning of trust. When the chips are down, let go and let God. Even in your last extremity.

And so, after all, God had sent Elijah to help the widow not rob her.

In the Gospel another widow illustrates the same kind of generosity, putting the last two pennies she has to her name into the collection box. Jesus sees this act and observes the depth of her faith.

Today in California or Florida or Puerto Rico or Central America or Syria or so many places in need we find people struggling to place their lives in the hands of God—in whatever way they know God—and then working like crazy to survive.

Are they failing in their relation to God? Just the opposite.

For that matter, how much do you and I trust God?

Or do we rely on fear?
