Dear parishioners,

Christ is risen!! On behalf of Fr Bogdan, our seminarian Martino and myself, I would like to extend a very blessed and I hope, even in the midst of this Covid-19 crisis, a peaceful Easter to you all! Today we celebrate the very heart of what it means to be 'Christian'.....that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, truly conquered death in His Resurrection from the dead and as a result, we too are 'risen' in Him!

I'm sure though that the question for many at this time in the history of our world is "what does 'Resurrection' look and feel like?" From a faith perspective, where do we see the traces of Resurrection during this pandemic? Where is God in all this? Of course, these are questions that many have asked during every major epidemic in our history and it is clear that Jesus never made it possible for us to escape from the common fate of humanity. In Jesus Christ, God has subjected Himself to the consequences of the universe He has created. When Jesus died in terrible agony on the cross, he showed himself to be at one with suffering humanity. He also showed that suffering can be transformed into life; that evil can be overcome by love. This is both the message and challenge for us this Easter!

Of course, this meaning of Easter will be experienced in different ways within different people. For some this time of deprivation could allow us to rediscover family life such as taking time to pray together or sharing a meal which is not rushed or interrupted by the 'other' demands which so often distract us or focus us away from those who we love and are most important.

If nothing else the power of Easter 2020 may be that for the first time in quite a while we are forced to slow down and really listen to the many 'voices' in our lives and what they are inviting us to in terms, as I said in last week's bulletin, of our relationships with ourselves. God and one another.

As one writer put it "social distancing does not mean spiritual distancing". I pray that is true for all of us as we celebrate the Easter Feast.

One final note concerns the news of the acquittal of Cardinal Pell following the quashing of his convictions and his release from prison. As predicted this news has been greeted in various ways with strong emotions on both sides. Many of you I'm sure will be relieved to hear this news. We are to be grateful that we live in a society where such a rigorous legal process is possible when it comes to such cases. At the same time our resolve as a Church must always be a commitment to support **all** those who suffer especially those who have suffered horrific abuse at the hands of certain Church personnel. All those impacted need to be held in our prayerful hearts especially at this Easter time while we continue to commit ourselves to the ongoing inner transformation which is required within our Church if we are to be truly the bearer of the "Good News" of the resurrection of Jesus Christ for all Gods people.

Finally, a reminder that our Holy Week celebrations, including the celebration of the Easter Vigil, are available online and can be accessed via the link on the parish website or Facebook. Where possible we have attempted to upload them to YouTube so that they are available as close as possible to the times they would normally begin in our parish Churches. My sincere thanks to ALL who assisted in the preparation and celebration of our Holy Week liturgies 'online'!!...your generous service, time and gifts were appreciated more than you

Plenary Council First Assembly postponed

In response to the dramatic changes caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the bishops of Australia have made the "difficult, but necessary" decision to postpone the first assembly of the Plenary Council.

Changes in the ways people live, work and communicate due to the pandemic led the Bishops Commission for the Plenary Council to consult with the advisory and planning teams, as well as the wider Australian Catholic Bishops Conference.

The decision was made to postpone the assembly scheduled for October this year.

Plenary Council president Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB said in a time of such upheaval, including severe restrictions on travel and group meetings, the postponement was unavoidable.

"Even though it is possible Australia may have moved through the worst of this health crisis by October, our capacity to adequately continue the process of discernment and formation – for everyone in the Church and in particular for the delegates – is severely compromised," he said.

Archbishop Costelloe said the Church's focus at the moment, and for the foreseeable future, is ensuring people continue to be cared for pastorally, spiritually and emotionally during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The bishops will consider proposals for an alternative timeline for the Council's two assemblies at their biannual meeting in May.

"The bishops remain committed to the Plenary Council journey and affirm that two assemblies will take place. This allows for the maturation of the discussions and discernment of the first assembly to develop with clarity and lead into the second gathering," Archbishop Costelloe said.

"The timing, the order and the location of the two assemblies will need to be re-examined, but it is hoped that having one assembly in Adelaide and the other in Sydney might still be possible."

Plenary Council facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins said work has already begun to consider how the changed timeline provides opportunities to embed the practices of dialogue, listening and communal discernment.

"There is obvious disappointment in the postponement of the first assembly, especially so soon after the excitement of announcing the Plenary Council delegates," she said.

"But once the pandemic has eased, people will have a thirst to look to the future – and the Plenary Council is about the future of the Church."

Announcements and up-to-date information will be made available through the Plenary Council website, the PlenaryPost electronic newsletter and social media channels.

Coronavirus and the Eucharist Fr Thomas O'Loughlin writes **This crisis calls on us to care for one another and thank God at home**

The virus has struck

So if we cannot gather because of COVID-19, can we still offer thanks to the Father through Christ? Let's re-learn some basics.

1. Jesus is present with us

Many Catholics treat church buildings as if they were pagan temples, as if God is only "in there". But God's presence is everywhere and the risen Christ is not limited by space.

This presence of the risen Jesus among the community was captured in this saying preserved in Matthew's gospel: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Mt 18:20).

Even in the smallest gathering of just two people, staying two meters apart so as not to spread the virus, the Risen Lord is among them. They might be two people in a house, or two people linked by phone or Skype.

This was expressed in another ancient Christian saying that is preserved in the *Didache* (a first century new disciples' quide): "Whatever the things of the Lord are spoken about, there the Lord is present" (4:1).
