

VATICAN CITY — Reading the Bible and praying with it is "the best vaccine" against Catholic communities closing in on themselves or focusing only on self-preservation, Pope Francis said.

God wants "a church that does not speak from itself or about itself but has in its heart and on its lips the Lord and draws daily from his word," the Pope told members of the Catholic Biblical Federation.

Greeting 200 federation members from 68 countries April 26, Pope Francis said that when Christians basically proclaim themselves instead of Jesus, they transmit nothing to the world.

"It is the word of God, not our own," he said, and "it removes us from being at the centre, saves us from self-sufficiency and triumphalism and calls us continually to go out."

The Catholic Biblical Federation, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary, was founded to make the Bible more accessible to Catholics and to highlight "the central role of the Word in faith and mission," Philippine Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle of Manila, president of the federation, told Pope Francis.

The teaching of the Second Vatican Council, reaffirmed by then-Pope Benedict XVI in his 2010 exhortation "Verbum Domini" ("Word of the Lord"), Tagle said, asks individual Catholics and the whole church if the word of God really inspires and guides their view of the world, pastoral priorities and use of resources.

"If the word of God does not inspire all of these ecclesial actions, then where does the inspiration come from?" the cardinal asked. "It's not a rhetorical question."

Agreeing, Pope Francis said, "it would be beautiful if the word of God increasingly became the heart of every church activity, the beating heart that gives life to the members of the body.

As Ephesians says, "The word of God is life," the Pope reminded the federation members. "It neither dies nor even grows old," and when it is the foundation for all the church says and does, it keeps the church young, too.

"The Bible is not a beautiful collection of sacred books to be studied; it is the word of life to be sown, the gift that the risen Lord asks us to welcome and distribute so that there would be life in his name," the Pope said.

The Bible gives the church a constant and necessary "injection of life," he said, which is why homilies based on the Scripture readings at Mass are so important.

"Preaching is not a rhetorical exercise or a collection of wise human ideas," he said. Rather, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, it is a sharing of "the divine word that touched the heart of the preacher."

"So many words pour into our ears each day, transmitting information and giving us multiple inputs, so many — perhaps too many — that they often surpass our ability to take them in," he said.

"But we cannot do without the word of Jesus, the only word of eternal life," the Pope said.

God's word, he said, should not leave people serene, but should cause them to question and to seek. And "a church that lives by listening to the word is never content with its own security. It is docile to the unpredictable newness of the Spirit.

A church enlivened by the word, he said, "never tires of proclaiming, never gives into disappointment and never tires of promoting communion, because the word calls people to unity and invites each one to listen to the other."

Pope Francis prayed that in sharing the Bible with others, federation members would be filled with the enthusiasm of the disciples immediately after the Resurrection. "They all run: the women, Peter, John, the two on the road to Emmaus they run to encounter and proclaim the living Word."



Children's Sacramental Journey -First Eucharist 2019

This week, we enter into our second session: This is My Body. In this session, we explore the connections between the Jewish Passover meal, the Last Supper and the celebration of the Eucharist at the Mass using these known stories in the Bible to teach the children our Christian history. The children also learn about "transubstantiation", that which takes place when the bread and wine on the altar becomes the Body and Blood of Christ, although the appearances remain as bread and wine. The parents are guided to explain to their children that as we are fed by Jesus in the Eucharist, the Holy Spirit helps us to grow as a community of love; we become the body of Christ.

The group sessions are family-centred and encourage parent-child interaction with activities to help children explore the key concepts of the sacrament in an ageappropriate and fun way.

Children's Liturgy of the Word – 4th Sunday of Easter

Children's Liturgy (Kidz Word) is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word offered at the 9:30am Sunday Mass at Carlingford and the 10:15am Mass at Epping during school terms. The presiding Priest calls forward the authorised adult leaders and children just after the Collect (Opening Prayer) and the children are invited to go with the leaders to the parish meeting room.

During Kidz Word, the leaders lead the children through prayers, songs/mimes and readings. The children reflect on the same Scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They are taught a simplified message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their family and friends after Mass.

This week, Kidz Word explores the Gospel story on a Shepherd caring for his sheep. The children learn that Jesus is like a shepherd. He cares for us and shows us how to live. He promises to protect us and keep us safe. We trust Jesus and follow Him. There is an activity sheet of a picture of a lamb to remind us we belong to Jesus.

Adult volunteers are needed to lead Kidz Word each week, as well as to assist with the supervision of the

children. This is a great opportunity for adults and middle/high school youth to help these eager youngsters celebrate God's Word. A Working with Children's Check will be required, which we can assist you with.


