Dear Parishioners,

**What will you do for Lent this year?** Our traditional Lenten penances are *prayer, fasting and almsgiving*. Much is written and said about the relative benefits of 'giving something up' (fasting) versus 'taking something up' (almsgiving more broadly). Christian philosopher Dallas Willard makes a helpful distinction between *spiritual disciplines of engagement* and *spiritual disciplines of abstinence*. Disciplines of engagement are reading, study, prayer with our active faculties, journaling, small group sharing, communal prayer & worship, spiritual direction, the sacrament of Reconciliation, acts of charity and kindness. Disciplines of abstinence are silence, solitude, stillness, fasting from food, fasting from entertainment, refraining from work, refraining from shopping, retreat and sabbath.

It requires wisdom, and some discernment to know which spiritual disciplines will be best for us at any given time. When we find ourselves in a rut or on a plateau, bored or sliding into laziness it is good to take up a discipline of engagement. But when we are overly busy it may be that proactively choosing small disciplines of abstinence will be most beneficial.

These spiritual disciplines are helpful, but they are not ends in themselves. Some years ago I had planned a particularly rigorous set of penances for myself for Lent. My wise old spiritual director gently admonished me that it wasn't the virtuosity of how much I did, but whether or not any given discipline would allow God to work in and through me for my transformation. I scaled back my plans, and had a very fruitful Lent.

We want to offer you a range of possible spiritual disciplines this Lent: the sacrament of Reconciliation, giving through Project Compassion, Lenten small groups, ecumenical liturgy & prayer, the silence and stillness of adoration. I invite you to pray into your preparation and seek God's help to find the one which is most helpful for you. Or it may be to simply switch off the television or the tablet for a day a week, or a few hours a day, to make some time for silence and prayer. May your Lent be fruitful.

As Lent calls us to renewal it also calls us as Churches to overcome the barriers which have divided fellow Christians for so long. Please be part of our shared Ecumenical Lenten Celebrations on the Tuesday evenings of Lent. Full details will be found in the notice on page 3.

Weekday Mass is a rich way of entering into Lent: the daily Scripture readings offer food for our reflection and the Eucharist is our spiritual food for the Lenten journey.

## The Season of Lent

is an opportunity for us to deepen our focus on our prayer life and our Christian virtues. In addition to your own personal acts of penance, prayer and almsgiving, we want to offer you some opportunities to make this Lenten season a valuable time in your life:

- Adoration
- Reconciliation
- Ecumenical Prayer
- Small prayer and discussion groups.

Information about each will be in the bulletin this weekend and next.

**Reconciliation:** During Lent Fr Bogdan and Fr Jim will be offering the sacrament of Penance (or Reconciliation, or Confession) at additional times to the usual Saturday morning and afternoon. Fr Jim will offer this from 6pm – 7pm on Monday nights commencing on 22 February at OLHC, and Fr Bogdan will offer this from 7pm-8pm on Friday nights commencing on 19 February at St Gerard's. Our hope is that this will give people who have not had the opportunity to receive this sacrament for a long time will be able to come, and that we will be able to give them the time they need.

**Adoration:** We will be making a quiet hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available at the same times as Reconciliation: 6pm – 7pm on Monday nights at OLHC, 7pm-8pm on Friday nights at St Gerard's. There is a wonderful stillness and deeper silence which can be encountered before the Eucharist in this way. It's also a very Covid-safe way to pray for people who still don't yet feel comfortable being in larger crowds. Come for the hour, or just call in for a few minutes to enjoy the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

**Our Parish** has a strong history of ecumenical relationships with our neighbouring Christian churches. In this relationship we don't argue about our differences, rather, we come together over the great many things which we share in common, and in doing so, find that we are part of the larger Body of Christ. Every Tuesday night in Lent there will be a one hour shared prayer service (not Mass) at one of the local churches, including here at OLHC on Tuesday March 16<sup>th</sup>. It's an opportunity to experience another church's prayer tradition and hear another Christian minister preach the gospel.

**Greeting at Mass:** In this past year the role of greeters at Mass has become indispensable as we ensure Covid compliance and record contact details. But even when Covid is no longer a factor, the role of greeters remains important to both the health and growth of our parish. Greeters help to ensure that every parishioner old and new is made to feel welcome in their parish. They are the ones who can make the sometimes daunting experience of coming to church easier and more engaging for families and individuals who are coming to Mass for the first time. In the coming weeks Fr Jim and members of the Pastoral Council would like to meet with the greeters of both churches to ensure that they have the resources needed to do their ministry. We would also love to welcome anybody new to this ministry – it just takes a welcoming smile, a desire to see our parish grow. This Sunday night Fr Jim invites greeters at OLHC church to join him in the church at 5pm, just for 45 minutes before the 6pm Mass. ## Online booking for Mass

In last week's bulletin, you may have read that we will be moving to online booking for Mass in the next few weeks. While there will be assistance available for those who have difficulty with online systems, most people will be able to book in advance and have certainty of a place at Mass. Many parishes have extensively used the Try Booking platform we propose for several months, and we believe it will be a more comfortable experience for you as familiarity increases.

Additional benefits for parishioners include:

- The ability to see beforehand which Masses have seats available and plan your attendance rather than "first in, first served",
- Ease of use - the online system is straight-forward, and door check-in will be faster and more hygienic, Freeing you from needing to stay abreast of the latest government rules as the booking system will automatically adjust beforehand.

We would like to thank you in advance for your understanding and generosity of spirit as we implement this change. We know change can be annoying; however, we are confident that we must move online for the Easter celebrations and afterwards.
