Welcome back to Mass!

With the announcement that NSW will reach 80% vaccination on Oct 16-17, from Monday Oct 18th we will resume our usual Mass and liturgical schedule. It's been awhile so as a reminder it is:

We will also offer an additional Mass at 11.30am on Sunday Oct 24 at OLHC, as 10.15am is usually the parish's largest Mass and exceeds the 100 person cap. We will announce at

that Mass, based on the numbers attending the 10.15am and 11.30am Mass that day whether this Mass will continue or not.

We'll also have an extra Mass at OLHC on Monday Oct $18^{\rm th}$ at 7am to celebrate the end of lockdown.

As per the NSW Government roadmap, churches will be open to everyone, regardless of vaccination. Masks will be required and electronic check using the Service NSW app, a Service NSW Check-in card, or a computer tablet which will be at the door of each church. There will be welcomers at each weekend Mass to assist you.

Covid safe protocols: As with when we emerged from lockdown previously, there will be a few modifications given to us by the diocese as to how we can safely celebrate Mass. Please sit in every second pew to provide spacing between you and the next row. Congregational singing will not be allowed (until December), but up to 10 vaccinated choir members can sing (this is the only ministry where vaccination is a requirement). Communion will be the Body of Christ only, and while it is preferable and safer to receive Communion on the hand at this stage, people who wish to receive Communion on the tongue will be able to come to the priest at the end of the Communion procession, with the priest sanitising his hands between each person. We will not exchange a physical sign of peace. There will be no collection basket passed around, but donations can be made into the red or blue boxes in the church. There will be no procession of gifts nor junior servers at this early stage. In time, each of these will hopefully be eased.

Special Ministers of Communion at St Gerard's: We may have up to 150 people at Mass with several points distribution of Communion. As such, we will again require the ministry of our Special Ministers of Communion. The numbers of ministers required at Mass may vary though, depending on number of priests and the number of people at the Mass. To simplify the role of our ministers, there will no longer be a roster for Communion Ministers at St Gerard's. Instead, there will be crosses on a lanyard hanging by the door of the sacristy for each Communion Minister required.

If you are a designated and trained Communion Minister you may take a cross and wear it to signify that you will be doing the ministry at that Mass. Communion Ministers at OLHC will continue to be rostered.

Ordinations: On Monday Oct 18th at 11.30am Deacons Aldrin Valdehueza, Roger Delmonte and Sam French will be ordained to the Order of Presbyters at our diocesan cathedral, Our Lady of the Rosary at Waitara. Many of you will remember Deacon Aldrin from his time on pastoral placement in our parish, and Deacon Roger from his short time here also. Please pray for them. You can watch the ordination livestream at www.bbcatholic.org.au/ordination. **November** is the month of remembering those who have died. We often receive more Mass offerings than there are Masses in November, so this year, if you would like to make an offering to have Mass celebrated in memory of a deceased loved one, these will be sent to the priests of the Diocese of Mendi in Papua New Guinea to be celebrated there, where the donation will be of great support. This is the diocese which Fr Bogdan and Fr Marek both ministered, and they will be able to ensure that the Masses are said and the donations go directly to support the clergy there.

All Souls' Day will be celebrated on Tues November 2nd. In addition to the regular 12.15pm Mass of that day, there will be additional Masses at 6pm at OLHC and 7.30pm at St Gerard's. We recognise that in these past two years many people have been unable to travel to funerals for people they love, and so this will be an opportunity to pray at Mass for someone you love.

Justice: During September we celebrated Migrant and Refugee Sunday. We now have a number of Catholic resources for this important justice issue on our parish website at https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/epping-carlingford/groups-and-ministries/refugees/a-wider-we

Pope Francis has called for a multi-year plan for addressing the care of creation following his landmark encyclical *Laudato 'Si.* With the upcoming COP26 Climate Summit there is an opportunity for us to view this through a Catholic lens. St Gerard's Meeting Room can be used by groups again, but there are a number of restrictions. The St Gerard's Meeting Room is 111smq (excluding the kitchen), from Oct 11th the capacity is 27 people. Check in with a QR code is required. Vaccination is required (the exemption for unvaccinated people is for places of worship only). Masks are to be worn. Singing is not permitted indoors. Eating, drinking and singing can be done outdoors only. Each group may consider whether all its members will be able to attend under these conditions, or whether to continue to meet online. Restrictions are likely to ease from Dec 1st.


