Dear Parishioners,

Starting in the parish: Thank you for the warm welcome I have received from so many parishioners in my first week in the parish. I had the privilege of concelebrating one Mass with Fr Bogdan at St Gerard's and one with Fr Peter at OLHC to see how the community celebrate and worship here. It was wonderful to hear Fr Peter's words of farewell, and to see the well deserved standing ovation given to him on Sunday night. During the week I have begun to meet with some members of the parish staff and some key leaders to help me understand the workings of the parish. Please bear with me as I become accustomed to the rhythm of this community's prayer, worship, learning and fellowship. I look forward to all that God will do in our lives this year. – Fr Jim

Mark's Gospel: This year is "Year B" in the liturgical cycle and we read from Mark's gospel for most of the year. As this is the shortest of the three synoptic gospels it is also supplemented by some passages from the fourth gospel, such as this weekend when we read of Jesus' invitation to "Come and see" what life with him is like. You may like to read through Mark's gospel from start to finish and re-discover the drama of Jesus' story. Mark has less teaching and more action, with a lot happening in just a few lines. It takes only two hours to read the whole gospel – try it in a single sitting!

Life with Covid: The Chief Health Officer has stated that even with the commencement of Covid vaccinations we must expect social distancing rules and restrictions to be in force for some time. Additionally, the requirement to collect contact tracing information (names and phone numbers) will continue. This presents a number of challenges for parish life. Do we set up a booking system for weekend Masses, or just those who arrive first? Do we sing parts of the Mass to enhance the liturgy, or have less singing so that the congregation can more fully engage by speaking these parts? Do we have our parish ministries gather in smaller groups, move online, or postpone till later? Each of these questions will require prayer, thought and discernment in the weeks ahead.

Reconciliation at Carlingford: The present confessional room too small to comply with the Covid requirement of 4sqm per person which we so diligently observe in the rest of the church. For the time being, Fr Jim and Fr Bogdan will instead offer the sacrament of reconciliation in the children's room. You will still have the choice of sitting face to face or kneeling behind a screen.

QR Code scanning: The NSW Govt prefers that people use the Service NSW application to scan a QR code than any other third party application so we will be introducing this. All restaurants and cafes now use the Service NSW app so it is well worth installing this app on your phone.

Our next special feast day: Candlemas



The next feast day we will celebrate in a special way is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas) :

on **Tuesday 2nd February:**

everyone is invited to bring along a candle to be blessed (please note that no candles will be provided – please bring along your own candle so that once blessed it can be part of your home prayer space).

Candlemas, coming 40 days after Christmas, celebrates the child Jesus being presented in the Temple and being recognised by Simeon as 'the light of all peoples'. The blessing of candles before Mass begins and the procession into the church has been part of this feast since medieval times.

Mass (and the blessing of candles) will be celebrated as follows:

a **daytime** Mass on **Tuesday 2nd February** at **12:15pm at Epping**
No Mass at Carlingford.
