Dear sisters and brothers,

Last Wednesday Bishop Anthony wrote to the clergy of the diocese as follows:

"The past seven weeks have been some of the most extraordinary in the experience of the Church in Australia. Since 19 March, we have not been able to gather for Mass through our ordinary Eucharistic assemblies, and since 23 March our churches have been closed. These historic developments have assisted in keeping the people of our country safe, and it has been a remarkable blessing that we have not experienced the devastation of the pandemic seen in other countries.....

On Sunday 10 May, the Premier Ms Gladys Berejiklian announced the NSW Government's response to the Federal Government's announcement on Friday 8 May, regarding a three-step plan to ease social and economic restrictions imposed to address the transmission of the COVID19 virus. In respect to our own context, we can note the following which is now possible. Each of these provisions is contingent on practising social distancing of 4 square metres per person and hand hygiene through the ready use of sanitiser."

• **Churches are now able to be open for private prayer, with a limit of 10 people in the church at any one time. The names of each person at the gathering must be recorded.**

- **Please note that as of this weekend the doors of our two parish churches are open during the day with the above regulation required to be observed by anyone who wishes to visit. A book will be provided for you to place your name and contact details.**

Each person will need to ensure that a distance of at least one seat behind and in front is vacant between each person. It is a legal requirement that the above procedures are followed to the letter.

Other changes are as follows:

- Religious gatherings, either formal or informal, are permissible inside churches for groups not more than 10 people.

For Masses generally: the number is 10 plus the priest. The number 10 includes people such as servers, readers, musicians. It is important that we do not flaunt the regulation of only 10 people inside the church, such that it doubles in number because of all those regarded as 'assistants.'

(Please note that parishioners will begin to be able to celebrate weekday Masses here at Epping and Carlingford from Monday 25th May. Further information as to how this will be managed, given the restriction on numbers, will be available in the parish bulletin of the weekend of the 23/24th May. I will be meeting with the parish team in coming days to consider ways we can do this in a manner which avoids favouring any person/group over another)

ALSO:

For Weddings: the number is 10 plus the priest and the bride and groom.

For Funerals: the number is for indoors, 20 plus the priest and the funeral director attendants; for outdoors, 30 plus the priest and the funeral director attendants.

For Baptisms: the number is 10, including family and guests, plus the priest.

For the recording/live streaming of Masses: the number of those present in the church should remain under 10, plus the priest.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) will be available on request by contacting either Fr Bogdan or myself by email or phone. We will also provide rostered times in next week's bulletin.

Once again I remind everyone that it is important, we record the names of all those who are present at any of these religious gatherings as this is part of the government's strategy of tracking and tracing so that should someone become infected with the COVID19 virus it is possible to locate those with whom they have been in contact, practice social distancing of 4 square metres per person and hand hygiene through the ready use of sanitiser at church entrances.

Finally, as many of you have probably heard by now, **our DA for the development at our parish Epping site which was lodged in August 2018 has finally been APPROVED by the Sydney Central City Planning Panel!** At this stage I simply want to sincerely thank **all** those who have assisted me and the parish in working on this project over the past six or so years. To have received a unanimous decision in our favour is a testimony to the hard work and commitment of so many who have walked this journey with us including our own PPC and PFC, Bishops Peter and Anthony as well as our previous Diocesan Administrator, Fr David Ranson, representatives from the Diocesan Curia **especially Emma McDonald** without whom the project would probably have not made it this far, CSO, our OLHC principals, our legal personnel, and of course our team from Stockland's and Architectus just to name a few.

Most importantly, a huge thank you to all our parishioners including the parents of OLHC school, who have been part of our various parish consultation meetings, have expressed their opinions verbally or via email and have kept all of this in prayer! By no means is the job done, nor is the consultation process concluded as we now move to the detailed planning process in preparation for the construction phase. In coming weeks and months, I will keep you updated as to our next steps and parish gatherings when possible to continue to draw on your thoughts and support as we continue to witness and serve this part of God's vineyard as missionary disciples!

Charitable Works Fund Appeal

This week we look at how the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) is providing Catholic Special Religion Education lessons to public school students.

Learning from Home SRE Lessons

Special religious education (SRE) has been temporarily paused until schools are back to normal so the CCD team has been busy developing *Learning from Home* lessons. The lessons cover all stages of learning from Kinder to Year 12 and can be viewed at Catholic SRE Online by clicking the button below.

Catechists

While catechists are not going into schools during the pandemic, they have been praying for the students and their families during their normal class times. Many catechists are also taking the opportunity to keep their training requirements up to date by undertaking the online training courses which CCD offer. Additionally, the CCD team will be offering Zoom Safeguarding training for all SRE catechists during the month of June.

Liaison with Department of Education

CCD has been working closely with the Department of Education to ensure that online SRE learning is made available through schools. The Department and SRE Providers are also working closely to ensure a smooth return to face-to-face teaching when it safe for volunteers, teachers and students.

Circle of Friends

If you are all self-isolating or staying at home and need some help, we want you to know you are not alone and where possible we would like to help. Whether it's a regular call to check in on how you are going, picking up made up scripts from the chemist, helping with shopping or praying with you, we have parishioners who have already stepped up to offer their time and service for you. The idea is that we use this time especially to create what one of our parishioners referred to as a "Circle of Friends" within the parish.




Parish Bible Reading Group

Faith Formation Done Differently

It seems such a long time ago that I was sitting in the parish hall with a group of parishioners as part of a Lenten program. We managed to take it online, and are still meeting together on the way to Pentecost, in what has become our 'new normal' of seeing friendly faces on computer screens. I discovered that it wasn't that hard, after all, to take the step online. We have access to tools that are so sophisticated now, and are surprisingly easy and intuitive to use.

I'm enjoying immensely everyone's creativity at this time – "virtual foyers" where parishioners can speak via Zoom straight after Mass online; Youth group trivia nights; "lounge room" webinars; and the dedication that has seen parishes take Alpha online in amazing ways. There has been newness and innovation.

I'm also encouraged by people's and organisations' generosity in offering temporary free subscriptions, greater access to materials, or free webinars with amazing Catholic speakers, across the whole Catholic digital world. What a gift this has been! The Pentecost Pilgrimage in particular (see below) is a great resource, offering meaningful and varied reflections to nurture us on the way to Pentecost.

We've suddenly found out how to find a daily Scripture reflection online (catholic-daily-reflections.com) ; and a free commentary on the books of the Bible (mbfallon.com). We found a new daily prayer app (pray-as-you-go.org); a bible reading app (bibleinoneyear.org) and a new podcast (thiscatholiclife.com.au). Many are gathering daily or weekly to pray or read the Scriptures with family, parishioners, or even friends around the world.

What will we take with us on our own personal journey from this time? What new habit might be starting to form that will continue to nourish us, even after covid-19 has settled?

We should not lose the learning of this time. Of course, we are an incarnational Church, and real-life community and engagement is essential to who we are. Church in the digital space can't replace that, and by the time our next eNews comes around at the start of June, we may well be re-gathering in person in some way.

We should not let our creativity and innovation come to an end. We can see this period as a stepping-stone to a richer and more varied way of being Church, of finding new ways to build meaningful relationships in our parishes, as well as reaching out into our wider community, with whatever tools we can, to invite more people into a relationship with Jesus Christ. We have discovered how creative we can be, and how quickly we can mobilise ourselves to adapt to new situations. These are great learnings to encourage us going forward. Of course, we can trust that the Holy Spirit continues to walk with us and guide us each step of the way. Please continue to pray for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit this Pentecost upon our Church and us all.



Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel—Remembering the Truth

It is a human thing to remember the past. We do it in part to understand better who we are now and how we got that way.

That is why remembering is one definition of liturgy. Under God's impetus we remember what it means to be a follower of Christ today. Especially in this Easter season, the Church is recalling its experience in the weeks after Jesus died and rose again.

Do you remember to say yes to Christ's presence within you?

Let us pretend that we are the historical disciples of Jesus, calling to mind what happened. It is as if we sit around a memory campfire, telling stories.

Remember when Philip said to Jesus, 'Just show us the Father and that will be enough for us?' Of course he was at that very moment seeing Jesus and therefore seeing the Father, but did not know it!

Maybe someone moves closer to the fire and says,

Do you remember the words he said just before his passion and death?
That he would send the Spirit of Truth into our hearts! And that we would not be left orphans!

"Go over it one more time," Someone else whispers. Bravely, one of them tries to.

"God the Abba is so much within Jesus that every time we see him we are seeing God."

Philip nods, reluctantly.

"Then Jesus said":

I will be so much within you—yes, you normal people—that when anyone sees you it will be the same thing as seeing me! And of course, since the Father is in me, they will know the Father too!

Philip gulped. "I ... I almost have it ... maybe ... or maybe not. ... Please say it another way."

"Ok. If I boil it down, this is what I understood of what I remember. Jesus said,

I am going back to the Father, back to the one who sent me.
The world will not see me any more. But that doesn't make me absent from you.
I and the Abba will be within you so that your very insides will be at one with my Spirit and the Father's Spirit.

"Then he put it very simply:

Who sees me
sees the Father.

Who sees you
sees me.

Philip somehow caught a glimpse of daylight.

At least, we find him in the First Reading running from place to place doing miracles and preaching about the Messiah! As scripture puts it,

With one accord, the crowds paid attention to what was said by Philip, when they heard it,
and saw the signs he was doing:

Unclean spirits, crying out in a loud voice,
came out of many possessed people,
and many paralyzed or crippled people were cured.

There was great joy in that city.

Do you also see daylight, at least on some days?

Do you remember to say yes to Christ's presence within you? Do you touch and receive communion at Mass and let yourself evolve into Christ, in the world today? Is your life an increasing process of saying "yes," or is there too much "no"? If the latter, read Sunday's readings again.

Simple? Not really.

Well, maybe it is simple. Just receive and love.


