Presentation of Epping Site Redevelopment: **Presentation of Epping Site Redevelopment:** As you know, substantial work has been undertaken over the past few years by our parish, led by Fr Peter Dowd, and our diocese, to design new parish facilities and new school buildings which make the most of Epping's zoning changes. This year, Fr Peter, together with our Diocesan Financial Administrator Emma McDonald finalised the design requirements with our architects and development partner Stockland. The architects have now progressed the design where we can share the beautiful plans and renders with the parish. Unfortunately we cannot gather in person, and so this will be an online forum in which Emma McDonald, Stockland development manager Melody Potter, project manager Reece Hollingsworth, regional manager Calum Ross and I will be with you as our architect Farhad Haidari presents the designs to the parish. We will see an overview of the whole site with a particular focus on our new parish centre which will house the hall, meeting spaces and offices, linked by a glazed walkway across to OLHC church. Coming back soon: Last week we heard the Premier announce that when the population is 70% vaccinated, lockdown will end. Churches, like other venues, will again be open at 1 person per 4 square meters capacity for people who are fully vaccinated. Please don't be in the 30% of the population who are unable to come and join us for Mass! See your doctor if you have any concerns about being vaccinated.

Improvements around the parish: There's been quite a bit of work happening around the parish these past few weeks:

OLHC Church doors have been repainted after some graffiti earlier in the year. We did a quick cover up over the graffiti earlier in the year, but it didn't match and looked out of place. A professional painter has now matched the original door colour so well you mightn't even notice the difference.

In November the parish office will move from OLHC to St Gerard's. In preparation we have been cleaning and sorting

at both offices. New cabling has been done at St Gerard's office to allow up to 8 people to work from the office next year, with Wi-Fi also available in the parish meeting room. St Gerard's office is looking quite bare as we make room to move some of the desks from OLHC over. We've also had new cupboards built in the meeting room to provide neater storage, also freeing up space in the office.



Relocation: Although we had previously advertised some surplus pews (presently under the church and in the meeting room) for sale, we've now decided to keep them. We'll be renting a storage facility for other parish furniture which will be able to accommodate the pews also. This gives us time to review whether we might want to have them restored to match the colour of the pews in the church for future use.

Congratulations to Adrian and Dorileen who were married at OLHC on Sept 11th. This had been their intended date since the beginning of the year, and they were delighted when restrictions eased to allow their wedding to go ahead, with just 11 people in total, including them and Fr Jim.



Hope Out of Horror— Seeking Refuge in Australia

For the past twenty years refugees and those seeking asylum in our country have been subjected to cruel and inhumane treatment by successive Federal Governments.

Despite COVID-19, in this year designated as *The Year of St. Joseph the Refugee* who was forced with his small family to flee the cruelty of Herod *The Sisters of St Joseph* launched **150 Days of Action** for people seeking refuge in our land.

The period of activism will culminate on *Migrant and Refugee Sunday (26 Sept.)* and as a penultimate event of this campaign, **SJAB** (Social Justice Around the Bay).

St Vincent de Paul, Northern Sydney/Central Coast Regional Social Justice Committee and Jesuit Refugee Service Australia (JRS) is holding a Webinar titled:

Hope Out of Horror—Seeking Refuge in Australia Thursday, 23 September 7:00pm—8:00pm

This event assumes a new and greater urgency in the face of the horror currently being faced by those in Afghanistan and by those Afghans marooned here on temporary visas. While our Government's initial response to the resurgence of the Taliban gives some hope it is long term compassion and change of policy that must follow.

This webinar will offer stories of courage and resilience from those who have suffered under a succession of repressive Government policies. It will present facts and statistics on what this country has lost through dehumanisation of fellow beings and it will draw back the curtains to expose how and where families and individuals are trapped in hotel detention and sub-standard living conditions.

As Christian Australians we believe enough is enough and we invite yourself and members of your organisation and networks to join our cry to Canberra to:

1. Offer Permanent Protection to all Refugees
2. Enable access to Family Reunions for Refugees.
3. Offer a Safety Net, including Medical and Financial Assistance to those in need of refuge.


