Dear sisters and brothers,

Firstly, on this "Father's Day", we celebrate and give thanks for the vocation of "fatherhood" as it is lived here in our parish and throughout our community! At all Masses this weekend we will acknowledge the significance of this occasion with the imparting of a special Father's Day blessing as well as giving each of our dads a Father's Day card expressing our deepest thanks not only for what they do but also who they are.

Secondly, in coming weeks you will be hearing about one of the ways we as a parish will continue to implement our parish plan with its goal of enabling us to become "missionary disciples" (people with a personal relationship with Jesus who share that gift with others) through a deeper understanding of the Bible. Until the Second Vatican Council in the 1960s, Catholics were generally warned to be careful when it came to reading the Bible outside of Mass in case they were led into "error".....of course, part of why this came about was due to the thinking of the time which emphasised distancing ourselves from the "Protestants", many of whom insisted on having only the Bible and downplayed the importance of or even the need for the Sacraments. Since then there has been many attempts to assist our Catholic people to read and understand the richness of what is ultimately Gods Word for all people. Encountering the Scriptures through prayer and study is essential if we are to grow in our Christian faith and our relationship with Jesus Christ.

I would like you **all** to consider, seriously, participating in our forthcoming programme, "Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible" which will be offered in homes and in our parish meeting rooms commencing towards the end of September.

The programme will help us "uncover the story woven throughout Scripture so that you get the "big picture" of the Bible and understand what it is all about". It will assist us to make sense of the Bible and how it relates to everyday life as well as see how the Sacraments, the Church, and our entire Catholic Faith are rooted in Scripture. Once again I hope as many as possible will consider participating in this new and exciting programme!

Finally, September marks the beginning of our "Safeguarding month" here in the Diocese as we commit ourselves through prayer and action to protecting the young and vulnerable within our Church and the wider community. With that in mind I encourage as many as possible to join with me on Tuesday night at the Cathedral for our Liturgy of Inclusion and Care commencing at 6.30pm.

Reflection

The 1st reading is **full of wisdom** about what really matters. The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord. Sir 3:18 (RSV) Is life about becoming great and famous? We are encouraged to use our gifts and become great at what we do. You don't see Behaves humbly on job applications. The reading goes on to say the most important person is the Lord, and the most important thing for us is to *find favour with the* Lord. True wisdom tells us how. Behave humbly. Being great and behaving humbly could be a challenge.

even for some of us who are not recognised for being great. There could be some underlying tension in us about where we find favour and whose favour really matters to us.

The 2nd reading is **full of images**: *Not a blazing fire*, no trumpeting thunder, or great voice speaking...

Come to Mount Zion, heavenly Jerusalem, millions of angels, everyone is a "first born", come to Jesus, the mediator, a new covenant, blood of purification... Heb 12: 18-19.

Where would you begin to find out what all these images are referring to? What do they mean?

In the Gospel Jesus advised those at the meal. Next time Invite those poor, crippled, lame and blind people. They were the outcasts in his time. They could not repay the favour. Jesus says to us "At your next dinner party invite a few from the outcasts of today". Do we know any refugees, homeless, ex-prisoners, alienated hard done by, etc.? Invite them. They cannot repay you. When the virtuous rise again you will be repaid! This is a very different wisdom. What did Jesus tell us about outcast people who have nothing?

Where can I find answers and insight?

- 1. You could you have a conversation about being great and whose favour you really want to find.
- You could discover where those images come from in the Bible story.
- You could look through the Gospels. 3.

You could also *join a group* who are *Unlocking the Mystery* of the Bible. and discover who we are as Catholics from understanding the Bible.

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Reflection on Sunday's Gospel


Jesus was sometimes invited to a meal by those who were curious to hear him. They were sometimes unfriendly to him we know from the gospel accounts. But most of his hosts were probably motivated by curiosity to hear what this teacher who was making such a stir had to say. This reconstruction of one such meal by Luke shows the Saviour's skills as a teacher; and the kind of challenge he brought to those who were leaders in the community. Those at table with are 'watching him closely'; he knows that he is expected to entertain them with his table talk.

He uses as his starting point what has been taking place as the guests assembled. To our modern ears, it all seems rather stilted; but the scene described by Jesus was familiar to his listeners, and taken for granted by them, as the customary way to behave in a culture with rules of status and precedence that were very complex - determined by such things as age, learning, public standing and wealth. This situation provides the material of a parable that invites his listeners to see beyond these old conventions. He who is happy to make himself the servant of all and urges his followers to do the same knows how important the openness and generosity of true humility will be in the life of his disciples when his mission has been accomplished in Jerusalem - for 'God opposes the proud but gives his blessings to the humble' (James 4:6). There is a lesson here for every Christian community: the quality of the relationships that make up a community will be the measure of the blessings they receive, and the effectiveness of their missionary outreach.

But Jesus has a deeper lesson to give. He uses the rapport he has established with his audience to speak to them of the revolutionary ways of God, the main burden of his preaching. 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast', he begins not wanting to offend them by making too obvious reference to the behaviour he has observed; but also, probably, pointing to the messianic theme he will take up later, after one of the guests has commented, 'Blessed is anyone who will share the meal in the kingdom of God'. His reference to seeking the 'place of honour' is an echo of his criticism of the Pharisees for liking 'to take the seats of honour at the synagogue' (Lk 11:43). His story of 'invited guests' probably also challenges the presumption of the 'leading Pharisees' that their strict observance marked them out as the 'elect', or chosen ones, of God, certain to take part in the messianic feast. This is backed up by the parable to which we have made reference that follows on from today's reading. It tells of the guests who do not accept their invitation to the banquet, and are replaced by 'the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame'. In today's reading, Jesus has already startled his listeners by saying that God will bless those who invite these very ones to their table. These interpreters of the Law, he knows, forbade entrance to the temple to the lame and the blind.

One thing is certain: Baptism changes us and makes immense demands on us. Not to live out our Baptism in service of God and neighbour is to be like the person in the parable who received a coin and buried it in the ground instead of investing it


