Dear Parishioners,

Fr Jim away: No sooner have I arrived in the parish than I will be away for the week of Feb 5 – 13. I will be assisting with spiritual direction at the annual retreat for the Seminary of the Good Shepherd. It is unfortunate timing, but it is a long-standing engagement and part of my commitment to the formation of priests for our diocese and for all of NSW. I am grateful to Fr Bogdan and others who will be covering my parish duties while I am away. – Fr Jim

Ash Wednesday will be celebrated on Wednesday, February 17th. Mass times at OLHC will be 7am and 9.15am, and at Gerard's will be 9.30am and 7pm. The schools will have separate Masses to maximise the number of parishioners able to come due to the limited numbers at present.

Invitations and presentations at Mass: For the next three weeks we have a number of presentations at Mass. This weekend members of our Antioch youth group will be pitching an invitation to their upcoming retreat day of Sat Feb 13th. Next weekend you'll hear an invitation to join a Lenten prayer and scripture group. And on the weekend of Feb 13th & 14th, we will be commissioning and blessing our catechists as they prepare to go out to teach Special Religious Education in six primary schools and three high schools in our parish. These presentations are a wonderful sign of our parish coming back to life after the Covid-pause of so many of our ministries last year.

Pope Francis on the devil: In this Sunday's gospel we hear of Jesus overpowering an "unclean spirit", and throughout the gospels, we hear of Jesus' encounters with malevolent forces by different names. There are a wide range of views and understandings about bad spirits or demons, ranging from that these are the mythical inven-

tions of pre-scientific peoples, to them being everywhere. Pope Francis has recently weighed in and given a contemporary, nuanced teaching on the existence and action of the devil in the fifth chapter of his Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate* "Rejoice and Be Glad". In these few paragraphs, he brings scripture alive and gives us a tool for combat – spiritual discernment. Our next special feast day: Candlemas

The next feast day we will celebrate in a special way is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas) :

on **Tuesday 2nd February:** **everyone is invited to bring along a candle to be blessed** (please note that no candles will be provided – please bring along your own candle so that once blessed it can be part of your home prayer space).

Candlemas, coming 40 days after Christmas, celebrates the child Jesus being presented in the Temple and being recognised by Simeon as 'the light of all peoples'. The blessing of candles before Mass begins and the procession into the church has been part of this feast since medieval times.

Mass (and the blessing of candles) will be celebrated as follows:

a **daytime** Mass on **Tuesday 2nd February** at **12:15pm** at **Epping**
No Mass at Carlingford.



Join a Lenten Group

Begin your year with the end in view.

We hear the man possessed shout out, *What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us?* Mk 1:22. In fact it was the opposite. So it is today, the Holy Spirit is at work in our world, so **all things are working for good**. Even this pandemic is being used to bring about a better world. Being a better person, begins with us.

Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday on 17 February**. This day is a reality check. Adam was made from the earth and he returned to the earth. We are reminded of that. *Dust to dust, ashes to ashes*. Did you know an incinerator is an ash maker? We could feel at times that life is a bit like that, but we know life is purifying us, not destroying us. We see that in Jesus who was raised from the dead. We believe he will raise us up too, to be like him and to be with him.

Use Lent this year to **put purpose in your life when you see your destiny, the reason for your life**. Every act of goodness and love, of dedication and service, of tenderness and kindness, of compassion and forgiveness, of fulfilling commitments at home or at work gives your life focus and direction. Lent is this spiritual time to reset your focus and redirect your life towards what is everlasting and to Jesus who will raise us up.

These are two ways our parish offers you that help. Other ways will be explained next week.

You can receive the booklet *Comfort* to read and pray in your personal time or pray together as a couple or with your family. This is a daily journey, reading and remembering what happened in the life of Jesus. You will see your life reflected back to you. You will discover who you are in this time of uncertainty and you will draw comfort from the life of Jesus.

Each week **you can go to a Lenten Group or invite others to come** to your home, where you read the Gospel for the following Sunday. The group hears how Jesus was confronted in his life and he made choices. These events bring to mind issues confronting us with choices we must make. How do we make the right decision and choose the most loving choice? We learn from Jesus. We choose to join with others ~ "to see Jesus more clearly, to follow Jesus more nearly and to love Jesus more dearly".

In the group you will see Jesus in the Gospel reading. You are listening to His Word and growing in understanding, so you can follow him. In your group you will realise how loving our God is, *for God so loved the world*, our world and the way it is, that *He gave us his only Son*. God the Father continues to give us Jesus in these Covid disruption, so our faith confirms that God is still loving and bringing healing to our world. **Do not be afraid. I am with you**.

Dichotomy

Growing up, I believed I understood God. When I was confirmed in my junior year of high school, I thought I had a great understanding of my faith. My senior year, I experienced a crisis of faith. I stopped attending mass and I thought all my progress in growing in my relationship with God had been for naught. After coming to St Louis University, I started becoming involved with my faith and with church again. I allowed God back into my life and have a much stronger relationship with him because of the rocky road I experienced in my faith. Without experiencing the lows of my time away from God, I could not fully appreciate the religious highs I now encounter. As a driver I cannot fully appreciate maximum speed on the freeway without encountering rush hour traffic. And I could not appreciate the heat of St. Louis summer without experiencing Milwaukee winter. In my Catholic Christian journey I can more fully understand the warmth of God's friendship and love after having gone a time without feeling it in my daily life. This is the idea I hear in the readings this week. Paul articulated this in his letter to the Corinthians, explaining that only the "despised of the world," not those of "noble birth," would understand communion with God. Through dichotomy, I learn more about both extremes. In times of darkness, especially when it is the darkest, I learn about the light of God.

Ceremony of Burning Palms for Ash Wednesday

It has been an ancient custom of our Church that ashes for Ash Wednesday are prepared by burning remaining palms from the celebration of the previous year's Palm Sunday. There is a powerful symbolism in this: · In the first place it is a symbol of the on-going cycle of the celebrations of our salvation – each Lent and Easter is connected to the one preceding it. · But more importantly the palms represent the hollow welcome and honour that greeted Jesus on that first Palm Sunday. They are a symbol in a way of the futility that often would accompany ambition for worldly glory. The honour that Jesus received on the Palm Sunday rapidly became his rejection on Good Friday.

The burning of the palms to produce the ashes that mark our Lenten commitment therefore can be a symbol of trying to let go of whatever is empty and hollow, lacking in depth and nobility, and recommitting ourselves to what is of depth and of lasting value. A single celebration of the burning of palms will take place on Tuesday 16th February (Shrove Tuesday). The ceremony will take place after the 12:15pm Mass at Epping.

Reflection on this week's Gospel—Fear

"If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts." Words from the Psalm for Sunday.

As a composer, I can understand some of the devices I might use to make a musical setting of this Psalm. But when I hear them I don't really concentrate on any one or the other word. I am taken away by their meaning.

Sunday's Readings give a similar command. We are told to hear with our hearts the word of God, not to get sidetracked.

By what?

God and Jesus
become stern
for our good,
not because
they are
destroyers.

The First Reading offers an answer. Moses quotes God's words:

I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin,
and will put my words into his mouth.

Moses has acted as intermediary between God and the people, and now they are promised another mediator between them and the God they fear.

Fear?

Yes. If you have a bible handy, look at people's reaction to God's gift of the ten commandments (or just click this link: Exodus 19:16). There the Lord descended upon Mount Sinai in great fire and thunder and the blare of trumpets! The people understandably became afraid and trembled and stood far off.

"Don't make us listen to that voice again, or see that great fire again, because we might die from it."

In today's First Reading, Moses reminds them of this reaction. Fear had frightened the people away from God. They did not even hear the word of God because dread had deadened their hearts.

Do we ever find God too large and threatening for our small selves? Do we ever want to ignore such a voice, especially when it is speaking commandments that go against what we find much easier?

Television and so many movies depict the joys of sins that make them part of the landscape and hard to resist! We can be lured. Maybe we take the name of the Lord our God in vain. Or miss Mass on Sunday. Or—you know the rest—dishonor our parents or desire to commit adultery, or steal or lie, or lust after already committed wives or husbands in spite of their relationships—or ours. Isn't such behavior common in today's world?

But God's voice is a lure also, especially as it evokes the psalm setting, as in the Second Reading. We are to be wrapped in the luxury of God's words, to bask in the beauty of a love that only wants our own good. St Paul says "I should like you to be free of anxieties."

So, would we have been afraid of Jesus as well? In the Gospel, we find him teaching "as one having authority." I suppose the answer, then, is yes. He drove a devil out of the man in the synagogue, who, notice, was violently afraid, no joke about it. Jesus gave a command and "the unclean spirit convulsed [the man] and with a loud cry came out of him."

Notice: God and Jesus become stern for our good, not because they are destroyers. Destruction is what they are trying to get us to leave behind.

We sing joyfully to the Lord, the psalm says.

All rebukes from the Lord are for our own good. If today we hear God's voice and listen to it and don't harden our hearts out of fear, maybe we will find this out.
