Dear friends

Since announcing my move from the parish I have been inundated with various reactions and kind words of appreciation. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available after each of the weekday Masses this coming week up until and including the 9.30am Mass at St Gerard's on Thursday morning 24th. **Please note there will be NO 12.15 Mass at Epping on Thursday, Christmas Eve.**

Finally, a reminder the final Healing Mass at Epping for the year will take place this Wednesday at 10am. **Please note there is no 9.15am Mass on that day.** Due to Covid restrictions, there will be no luncheon following the Mass.

May God continue to prepare our hearts to receive this great possibility of God's love into our lives as we prepare for the Christmas Feast!!

BISHOP ANTHONY WRITES IN HIS PASTORAL LETTER....

"In my Decree of 18 March 2020. In response to the crisis of the pandemic, I dispensed the Faithful of the Diocese of Broken Bay from the ordinary obligation to be present at the Sunday Eucharist. Now, with the welcome situation that has developed, with gratitude to God, **I rescind that Decree, and call upon and encourage the Faithful to resume their obligations as part of the living Body of Christ. Under Canon 1247, the Faithful are now once more obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and the Holy Days of Christmas and the Assumption.** Notwithstanding, those who are aged or have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risk of COVID-19 are free to remain at home, honouring the Lord's Day through the best way open to them. Some examples are participating in the live-streamed Mass, private prayer, reading the Scripture, praying the Rosary."

I Believe He Came Down from Heaven God never forces himself on us. He never makes us listen. He leaves us free. He comes to us as one of us. He 'came down from heaven.' Jesus left his glory behind, the glory that he had with his Father, He 'emptied himself' - we call this the kenosis or 'emptying of himself' - to assume the form of a servant, taking on our human condition. Jesus came down from heaven to become one of us. Like any immigrant, he brought with him the culture, language and lifestyle of his home in heaven. And what is at the core of the language and culture of the 'immigrant' Son of God, who comes from the very heart of the mystery of the Trinity? Quite simply, that God is a lover who gives himself to us totally with boundless self-sacrifice. That to be divine is to become a servant of others. As the great Anglican New Testament scholar and bishop, N. T. Wright, has noted: God became flesh not to stop being divine. It was a decision about what it means to be divine

An Advent Reflection . . .

Every year Your Church celebrates the holy season of Advent, my God. Every year we pray those beautiful prayers of longing and waiting, and sing those lovely songs of hope and promise. Every year we roll up all our needs and yearnings and faithful expectation into one word: "Come!" But now a light is slowly beginning to dawn. I'm beginning to understand something that I have known for along time: You are still in the process of Your coming. Your appearance in the form of a slave was only the beginning of Your coming, a beginning in which You chose to redeem us by embracing the very slavery from which You were freeing us. So actually You haven't come - You're still coming. From Your incarnation to the end of this era is only an instant, even though millennia may elapse and, being blessed by You, pass on to become a small part of this instant. It is said that You will come again, and this is true. But the word again is misleading. It won't really be "another" coming, because You have never really gone away. In the human existence which You made Your own for all eternity, You have never left us. But still You will come again, because the fact that You have already come must continue to be revealed ever more clearly. It will become progressively more manifest to the world that the heart of all things is already transformed, because You have taken them all to Your heart. You must continue to come more and more. What has already taken place in the roots of all reality must be made more and more apparent. The false appearance of our world, the shabby pretence that it has not been liberated must be more and more thoroughly rooted out and destroyed. Behold, You come. And Your coming is neither past nor future, but the present, which as only to reach its fulfilment. Now it is still the one single hour of Your Advent, at the end of which we too shall have found out that You have really come. O God who is to come, grant us the grace to live now, in the hour of Your Advent, in such a way that I may merit to live in You forever, in the blissful hour of Your Eternity.

Covid-19 Plan

- We adhere to maximum number of person permitted in the church based on the four square metre rule (160 people at Epping and 290 at Carlingford).
- Coloured cards on the seats indicating seating positions ensure maximum separation.
- All are asked to sanitise their hands on entering & leaving and sign in the book.
- We ask the parishioners to sanitise the pew where were sitting after every Mass
- There is no physical exchange of the sign of peace.
- All are asked to maintain approx. one arm length of spacing when coming forward for Holy Communion (which is given on the hand first and then those receiving on the tongue are asked to come up last).

A thought on Night and Midnight Mass . . . One of the most beautiful things in the treasury of our Church is the tradition of Night and Midnight Mass. 'The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light.' Advent reminds us of something that's true of all life – that we search and look for God sometimes in darkness, sometimes full of our human uncertainties. We discover God in that darkness – we glimpse those moments of light and peace which enable us to continue on the journey. The timing of Night and Midnight Mass is beautiful. Our gift to God is to stay awake on this great feast till those still night hours, that time of deep darkness which symbolises the darkness in which we wait for God to enter our lives. And then the celebration of the light of God's coming is even more symbolic: light and joy break into the stillness and darkness of that midnight hour. It's a beautiful way to keep vigil and to usher in the celebration of

the birth that changes the world. We do it at a time free from all the frantic preparations of Christmas Eve and before the busyness of Christmas Day itself.

Reflection on Sunday's Gospel—Mary's humility

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good Morning!

This Sunday just before Christmas, we listen to the Gospel of the Annunciation (cf. Lk 1:26-38).

In this Gospel passage, we notice a contrast between the promises of the angel and Mary's response. This contrast is manifested in the dimension and content of the expressions of the two protagonists. The angel says to Mary: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever" (vv. 30-33). It is a long revelation which opens unprecedented possibilities. The Child that will be born to this humble girl from Nazareth will be called Son of the Most High. It is not possible to conceive of a higher dignity than this. And after Mary's question in which she asks for an explanation, the angel's revelation becomes even more detailed and surprising.

On the other hand, Mary's reply is a short sentence that does not speak of glory. It does not speak of privilege but only of willingness and service: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (v. 38). The content is also different. Mary does not exalt herself before the prospect of becoming the mother of the Messiah, but rather remains modest and expresses her acceptance of the Lord's plan. Mary does not boast. She is humble and modest. She always remains the same.

This contrast is meaningful. It makes us understand that Mary is truly humble and does not try to be noticed. She recognizes that she is small before God and she is happy to be so. At the same time, she is aware that the fulfilment of God's plan depends on her response, and that therefore she is called to accept it with her whole being.

In this circumstance, Mary's behaviour corresponds perfectly to that of the Son of God when he comes into the world. He wants to become the Servant of the Lord, to put himself at the service of humanity to fulfil the Father's plan. Mary says: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord"; and the Son of God upon entering the world says: "Lo, I have come to do thy will, O God" (Heb 10:7). Mary's attitude fully mirrors this statement by the Son of God who also becomes the son of Mary. Thus Our Lady shows that she is in perfect accord with God's plan. Furthermore she reveals herself as a disciple of his Son, and in the Magnificat, she will be able to proclaim that God has "exalted those of low degree" (Lk 1:52) because with her humble and generous response, she has obtained great joy and also great glory.

As we admire our Mother for this response to God's call to mission, we ask her to help each of us to welcome God's plan into our lives with sincere humility and brave generosity.
