Enrolling your child in a Catholic School next year? Throughout the year people contact the parish seeking a parish priest's reference for enrolment into a Catholic School. In 2021, Fr Jim invites parents seeking a reference to attend a Parent Connect Gathering which will develop the partnership of parish, family and school in the project of sharing Catholic faith to both primary school and high school students.

We will host several gatherings throughout 2020 with the first one being held on Saturday March 6th, 11am – 12pm at the meeting room at St Gerard's (behind the church), 543 North Rocks Rd. We invite one or both parents to come, but without children where possible. Bring your school reference form with you if you have it. Contact jim@eppcarl.org.au for more information.

Welcoming & opening up: Last weekend Fr Jim together with Helen and Laxmi from the Pastoral Council met with the Welcomers at OLHC. We agreed that it would be good to open the main doors of the church again to create a sense of openness to the public, and, where possible to move the welcoming table outside so that we can chat with people as we welcome them to Mass. An open door, and people smiling and engaging on the forecourt is surely a good witness to our neighbours. **Adoration:** You might have noticed that OLHC church is open later in the evenings these days. We want to encourage people to come and pray at any time. We particularly invite you to come on Monday nights between 6pm and 7pm when Hien will be exposing the Blessed Sacrament. There is a particular kind of silence and stillness which we can experience in the presence of the Eucharist in this way. There will also be adoration on Friday nights from 7pm – 8pm.

Reconciliation: This week During Lent Fr Bogdan and Fr Jim will be offering the sacrament of Penance (or Reconciliation, or Confession) at additional times to the usual Saturday morning and afternoon. Fr Jim will offer this from 6pm – 7pm on Monday nights commencing on 22nd Feb.at OLHC, and Fr Bogdan will offer this from 7pm-8pm on Friday nights commencing on 19 Feb. at St Gerard's. Our hope is that this will give people who have not had the opportunity to receive this sacrament for a long time will be able to come, and that we will be able to give them the time they need.

Covid vaccines: Last year there was some media coverage of ethical concerns about possible Covid vaccines produced using cell lines from an aborted foetus from decades ago. Recently Archbishop Peter Comensoli, chair of the Australian Bishops Commission for Life, Family and Public Engagement has stated "For the common good, it is appropriate that our governments work together to roll out a nation-wide process of vaccination for all residents." With regard to moral concerns "You can receive any one of the three vaccines to be made available, without moral complicity in the processes of its development. On balance, it is a good thing to do." He has also expressed his hope that the Australian Government will also assist our poorer neighbouring countries to obtain the vaccines.

JAMILA FROM BANGLADESH—PROJECT COMPASSION

Twenty-two-year-old, Jamila, is a single mother, living in the world's largest refugee camp in in Bangladesh. A Rohingya woman, she fled the armed conflict in Myanmar's Rakhine State to save herself, her elderly mother and eight-month-old baby daughter. Having been abandoned by her husband, she faced life in the camp on her own.

Hundreds of thousands of Rohingya people, have crossed into Bangladesh since August 2017. Over 1.3 million people remain in the densely populated camps, in desperate need of humanitarian assistance.

Thanks to the generosity of Caritas Australia's supporters and through our partnership with Caritas Bangladesh, Jamila had access to emergency food and

shelter. Then, as her stay in the camp stretched on, Jamila joined the Women Friendly Spaces project where she received counselling and emotional support. She learnt about health and hygiene, participated in a parenting program and learnt sewing skills, to help her to earn an income.

Jamila now has a sense of community around her and feels less alone and more supported - and she is able to 'Be More' to her family.

"I want to offer my thankful greetings to those who are kindly thinking of us from overseas", Jamila says. "Thank you, and thanks Caritas Australia."

Message for BBNeighbourhoods 16 February 2021

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, The Season of Lent is upon us once again as tomorrow is Ash Wednesday. Strangely, it is one of my favourite times in our liturgical year because of the potential that is hidden within the Season. There is a simplicity to our prayer and worship during Lent that seems to unclutter life and liberate us from the grind of a fast and furious world. While I love the dimensions of prayer and fasting, I particularly appreciate the call of Jesus who gave his disciples a new commandment of Christ, "even as I have loved you, that you also love one another" (John 13:34). Charity means loving as Jesus loved. In the community of the Church, we seek to be witnesses to caritas Christi the charity of Christ. It is more than simply doing good or registering as benefactors for worthwhile projects. The foundation to our charity, especially during Lent, is the example of Christ, who laid down his life for our salvation and for the salvation of the world. No greater love has any man or woman than this (cf John 15:13). While the mission of the Church is understood to be spiritual in nature, we also embrace all the temporal aspects of human life. This Lent, I ask how might we do this with hearts and minds filled with the charity of Christ? How might we live and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ so that all people, without exception, might know and feel the loving embrace of God? As the community of the Church of Broken Bay, how can we acknowledge, respect, and love the poor, the oppressed, the marginalised, and those who find themselves burdened by adversity, vulnerability, or powerlessness? Inspired by the Word of God and nourished by the sacraments, I invite you to join with me as together we strive to bring to bear the charity of Christ which gives authentic witness to the faith we profess. The practice of charity reveals the "new commandment" which makes known to the world the new life of the children of God. May the power of the Holy Spirit, who reveals the charity of Christ, strengthen us in our resolve to be disciples of Jesus in the world. The charity of Christ urges us!
