Select either *Weekend Mass Times* or *Easter and Holy Week* and scroll down past the weekend Masses to make your booking for each of your selected liturgies. There is no need to book for 10am Saturday Morning Prayer in each church. Please phone the parish office on 9876 2853 between 9 and 4 on weekdays if you need assistance with booking in.

In a normal year, we would invite new membership of the Parish Finance Committee and Parish Pastoral Council. This year Fr Jim has invited all existing members to continue for one more year to provide stability during the transition of parish priest. Most members have accepted this invitation. Thank you to Andrew Stone who has served as a member and chair of our Parish Finance Committee for several years. Andrew is stepping down to focus on family and work commitments. We are grateful for the expertise which Andrew has given to the parish over so many years. Thank you also to Shemile Gamilo who is also stepping down from the Parish Finance Committee at this time. Please consider whether you would be open to serving on either of these important parish groups in coming years.

Letterbox invitations: Easter, like Christmas, is a time when we can invite people who may not attend Mass regularly to come join us. This year, even more so, when many people have not yet returned after Covid. Let's use this opportunity to invite our whole suburb to join us! We've printed 15,000 postcards and invitation flyers which we'd love your help to deliver in the streets near you. The postcards at St Gerard's are for delivery in Carlingford and West Pennant Hills. The flyers at OLHC are for western side of Epping. The eastern side and North Epping are being delivered by the Anglican and Uniting Churches who are sharing this project with us. Please take some cards / flyers from the back of the church, cross off some streets and deliver in the next two weeks. Bring back any leftovers so that

others can deliver them. And better still, why not knock on your neighbour's door and deliver an invitation in person?

Working bee: Come and join us next Saturday, 27th March for an hour or two at a working bee to get our church and grounds looking good and ready for Easter. We need people who can repair, wash, prune, rake and weed – pick your favourite job, and bring the tools and gloves you need with you. There's a list of jobs to be done on the noticeboard at OLHC. Join us from 8am – 10am at OLHC (Mass will be at 9.15am and we'll do outside jobs at this time. Reconciliation will continue but there will be no adoration after Mass this day). Or join us at St Gerard's from 1.00pm-3.00pm also on Saturday, 27th March.

Project Compassion boxes: Please bring back your Project Compassion boxes and envelopes to the church next weekend. If you would like a tax receipt, please count the cash in the box, and write the amount, along with your contact details on the box in the space provided.

Covid updates: The NSW Govt continues to recommend the wearing of masks in places of worship, though this is no longer mandatory. As the recent burst of cold weather heralds the coming of winter and the likely coughs and colds involved it become all the more important that we stay home if we are unwell, and to wear a mask if we have any residual cough. Sitting 1.5m apart from people is also no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended. We have therefore removed some of the ribbons between pews to allow people to sit where they choose, keeping 1.5m distance in their own way. There are blocks of pews in each church which continue to have ribbons between the seats or markers in between each row to ensure that there is at least 1.5m between pews for those who feel uncomfortable being any closer.

Singing continues to be prohibited for congregations unless everyone wears a mask. There is however provision for a choir of up to 30 people to sing, as long as they are 1.5m meters apart and face forward, not towards each other. At some of our weekday Masses and devotions there are less than 30 people, which may allow us to sing at these occasions. We cannot plan ahead for this, however, in case more than 30 people attend.

Catholic moral teaching on sexual violence These past few weeks have brought the issue of sexual violence against women to the forefront of our news coverage. This week's March 4 Justice saw thousands of people rightly call for an end to gendered violence and for a change in the culture which allows this to occur. Questions are raised as to why sexual violence keeps on happening.

As our society seeks to find answers it is helpful for us to revisit the contribution which our Catholic moral teaching can offer, a teaching which is mostly disregarded by contemporary secular society. Our Church continues to affirm that sexuality is a language of love which communicates love and commitment to another, rather than just seeking pleasure for ourselves. In affirming that the right and best place for bodily sexual expression is within marriage we encourage one another to exercise restraint in all other situations. This restraint, to not act on every sexual attraction, is a remedy for the issues of violence and coercion.

Increasingly we are recognising the damage which pornography does in stoking the gratification of all desires, rather than the exercising of restraint. The Church continues to warn against its production and use (CCC 2354). Author Gail Dines in her searing book *Pornland* describes from a secular standpoint how pornography has hijacked the sexual development of young people with increasingly disastrous results. The pornography which has shaped many people's sexual attitudes frequently depicts sexual activities which are non-relational and non-consensual.

These are not issues which can be spoken about readily from the pulpit in front of a mixed audience at Sunday Mass, but they are an area in which Church teaching makes an important contribution which is often under-recognised. I write this to encourage you to have conversations in age-appropriate ways with your friends, children and grandchildren to draw from our church's teaching which is underpinned in the dignity of every human person. I am also ready to discuss this with you or provide resources where they are needed.

Children's Sacramental Journey -First Eucharist 2021

With the Rite of Enrolment taking place last weekend, preparation sessions for First Eucharist commenced this week. Candidates are required to attend a session once a week with their parent over 4 weeks for preparation of this sacrament. With physical gatherings still adhering to the required physical distancing, we have modified the programme slightly in order that we may cover all the sessions adequately to prepare the children for their initiation into the Catholic Church. There will be two sessions conducted online plus two in-person. These sessions are on:

Bread of Life This is My Body God's Word & The Eucharist – The Holy Mass How to Receive Holy Communion

The first session, "Bread of Life", talks about the importance of mealtimes at home. This aims at helping children better understand the nourishment of love from meals with family is very much like the nourishment of love we receive from Jesus when we gather at Church each week. They also learn that mealtimes were important to Jesus; he shared it with all sorts of people and that fellowship begins with a simple meal. We will listen to the story of Jesus feeding five thousand people and discuss what Jesus meant when he said, "I am the Bread of Life".

HALIMA FROM BANGLADESH

Halima is raising two children under seven in a refugee camp in Bangladesh, while caring for her mother who has a disability. Widowed at just 21, Halima fled violence in Myanmar's Rakhine State in 2017, arriving at the camp with nothing.

Caritas Australia, through its partner, Caritas Bangladesh, helped Halima out with a shelter and cooking equipment so that she could feed her family. She participated in hygiene and sanitation training and took on the role of community trainer herself, organising the cleaning of washrooms, wells and toilets.

Halima's training became all the more invaluable as the COVID-19 pandemic struck, when safe hygiene and preventative measures suddenly became lifesaving.

Halima is proud that she is able to earn a small income, while maintaining the

health of her family and the cleanliness of the camp community. Her children are adapting to life in the camp and are now at school.

Halima aspired to "Be More" for her family and for the community around her.

"My hope is that our children will be able to do a job, to live with pleasure, they will find their happiness—that will bring wellbeing for them," Halima says.
