OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS, EPPING DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Dear parishioners and all parents of OLHC school Epping.

Thank you for your ongoing interest in the future development of the Parish site at Our Lady Help of Christians, Epping. We take this opportunity to provide you an update on the development envisaged for OLHC.

As you would recall, earlier in the year we let you know of the one-year delay in the development of the parish site at Epping. Originally, we anticipated the school would be temporarily relocated to Pennant Hills from December of this year (2019). However, due to delays in the planning approvals process, this date was postponed for an additional 12 months. This resulted in the new temporary relocation dates to St Agatha's to be from December 2020 until the end of Term 1 2022.

Throughout much of this year, a great deal of work has continued with Stockland and Architectus in relation to finessing the design plans, along with continued engagement with Council with respect to the development application (**DA**). As a result of those very helpful discussions and Council's feedback, along with three presentations made to the Design Excellence Advisory Panel, a revised DA was submitted in early November. The changes to the design mainly impacted the Seniors Living development, with the original school and parish asset designs largely remaining the same.

You will recall, based on the initial advice of the Design Excellence Advisory Panel, the Seniors Living Component was designed as a more a slimmer, refined building which resulted in a better urban outcome. The original DA was based on 205 independent apartments. The revised design has been refined even further which resulted in the reduction of the number of apartments from 205 to 170 units.

As a result of these changes, Council recently advised us of the Design Excellence Advisory Panel's support of the revised DA. With that support obtained, the DA will now be considered by the Planning Panel in its meeting in February in the coming year.

If you have any questions, or would like more information about the development, please continue to let us know. Otherwise, we will be in touch with you once we know the Planning Panel's determination
