Despite the hectic nature of my first week back from holidays, I can still say that I feel refreshed following my three week break. I would like to equally thank Fr Joey and members of the parish team for managing and looking after the parish so well during my absence. We are indeed blessed to have such faith-filled and capable people to assist in the building up of God's Kingdom here at Epping and Carlingford!

There are a couple of important matters that I need to share with you.

Firstly, this week it was announced Ann Milling, our Principal at St Gerard's will be stepping down as Principal at the end of the year. Ann has been Principal at St Gerard's for eleven years and prior to that was Principal at OLHC Epping, so her association with our parish has extended over many years.

Ann has been an outstanding leader of Catholic education, a faith-filled, caring and compassionate 'missionary disciple' of Jesus and a pleasure to have worked with as a person and as a co-leader in spreading the mission of the Gospel here in the parish. I particularly note Ann's attentiveness and support in ensuring the school and wider parish are working together as harmoniously as possible.

Further details regarding an opportunity to celebrate Ann's leadership and express our gratitude to her will be given at a later date.

Secondly, last Monday the Development Application (DA) for the development of the Epping parish site was successfully lodged with council. It is likely that the DA will go on public exhibition in the coming fortnight. As this is a major milestone, I would like to thank all those involved in assisting us to reach this point including the representatives from Stockland, Peter Hamil and representatives from the Catholic Schools Office,

Emma McDonald and Saskia Driscoll from the Diocese as well as the wonderful encouragement and support of our previous bishop, now Archbishop Peter Comensoli. We continue to keep this project in our prayers as we await Council's decision.

Thirdly, during my absence Fr David Ranson was elected Diocesan Administrator until such time as a new bishop is appointed for our diocese. Fr David is of course, well-known to many of you as he lived and assisted here in the parish prior to his appointment to the Parish of Wahroonga. We are indeed fortunate to have the benefit of Fr David's gifts and leadership to guide us all during this time of transition. Please keep him in your prayers.

Finally, as we move towards the end of the year and as part of our invitation to become more a Church of Missionary Disciples, we are offering along with Alpha, a brief four week course on "Sharing Our Faith."

The purpose of this course is to help us articulate better our response to questions such as "what do I believe?", "Who is Jesus Christ?", "Why did he die on the cross?"...etc. Building confidence in responding to the guestions of others is an important part of our formation as 'disciples (life-long learners) in the way of Jesus. I thank Martin Teulan for facilitating this programme.... and yes! PLEASE sign up to 'Alpha especially if you haven't been involved so far.

We are looking at the formation of so called 'Connect' groups which continue the relationships, prayer and sharing begun in Alpha. More of this in coming weeks.

Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel: Shocking

Jesus has been distressing the disciples by his words, at least in John's Gospel.

For instance, last week he said we have to consume his flesh and blood in order to have eternal life. His followers could not possibly have understood this. They whispered, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?"

This Sunday his words would make it harder still.

Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the Spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. ...

As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him (Gospel).

A sad scene, and puzzling too. Why is Jesus saying such mystifying things to his followers, and, just as a side issue, how are we ourselves supposed to understand them today? Do they make sense?

Here is a key: whenever an event or saying does not seem to make complete sense in the Gospel of John, we have to seek deeper meanings. There is often a delicious significance hidden behind events that John describes in a bewildering way.

Let us become bearers of the Word to the world.

Alright then, what does he mean in the line 5 and 6 of the Gospel reading by what seems like a non sequitur:

What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before?

What?

Well, likely, he was talking about the Ascension. Where was the "before"? We know that he had been in the bosom of the Holy Trinity! God's love had leaned out to us in Christ's life, death and resurrection. At that point Jesus had to "go to the next life." He was still a human being, as well as divine. He was telling them that if eating his body and blood was shocking to you, wait till you see me ascend into heaven!

Then the words a few lines later, "It is the Spirit that gives life, the flesh is to no avail."

We already celebrated the Ascension. There, Jesus said he would not desert us but would be present on earth in a new form. The third person of the Trinity would come to dwell within people who believe. Since the members of the Trinity share everything they are with each other, Christ would be within the Holy Spirit. That Spirit would offer to live deep within each believer, within each human who says yes to its presence.

How then do we acquire the Holy Spirit? Through Baptism, definitely. And of course, as in Jesus' command from last week, by eating and drinking his body and blood. Communion lets us "become what we have eaten," the body of Christ. We are to let Christ have flesh again, in our hearts and in our actions. By communing each week, each day, we are more and more carriers of Christ. When we are part of the "Body of Christ," we therefore have eternal life, as he told his followers in this week's Gospel.

Peter sums it up. "We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

Let us make that statement too. Let us open wide to this Holy One of God as we celebrate Mass this Sunday.

Let us become bearers of the Word to the world.



Why are we involved in a movement for Christian Unity? Come and hear Rev. Professor Gerard Kelly speak at Warnervale Parish, Mary MacKillop Drive off 91 Sparks Road, 7pm Wednesday 29 August 2018.

From its beginning, the Christian Church has had to face the problem of division. There is a sense in which the Church was born ecumenical. Over two thousand years there have been some major divisions within the Churches. Perhaps the Reformation in the 16th century has had the most impact on our society. In the modern era (20th century) the impulse for unity has been strong and the ecumenical movement has seen major breakthroughs in the healing of relationships among divided Churches. To be aware of our history and of the achievements over the last one hundred years is to be well prepared for the challenges that we face. In this way we will not lose courage in heeding the prayer of Jesus that "they may all be one".

Rev. Professor Gerard Kelly is a priest of the Archdiocese of Sydney, and a lecturer in Theology at the Catholic Institute of Sydney. For over twenty years he has been involved in local ecumenical dialogues. He is currently the co-chair of the Australian Lutheran—Roman Catholic Dialogue. He is also the chair of the Faith and Unity Commission of the National Council of Churches in Australia (NCCA) and a member of the NCCA Assembly.
