Letter from the Vicar General – 2020 Australia Day Message

Dear brothers and friends,

As Bishop Anthony is currently on leave, it is my privilege to write to you again – now on the approach of the Australia Day weekend. I thank you for taking to heart my recent letter about how we might best frame our response as a Diocese to the national bushfire crisis, for the way in which our parish communities have prayed for the relief we now experience, and for the manner our neighbourhoods have prepared to contribute financially to the Vinnies Bushfire Appeal being conducted in all our parishes this coming weekend.

This weekend we mark a number of important occasions. We commit by action to respond to those who have been so deeply affected by the crisis that has marked our nation over the last number of months; we commemorate Australia Day and the momentous turn the land in which we live took with the beginnings of European settlement in the late 18th century, mindful of the impact this had for our First Peoples. Throughout our Church, we also celebrate Word of God Sunday recently initiated by Pope Francis to make us more mindful of the power of God's Word, especially as it is proclaimed to us through our rich tradition of Scripture which speaks with ever new and fresh possibility to us.

The Word of God comes to us in the texts of Scripture in a unique and unrepeatable way. Above all, God speaks to us in Jesus, the one Word ever uttered by the Father as the 16th century St John of the Cross taught. However, God speaks to us, through Christ, in other diverse ways. At his funeral, just prior to Christmas, my father asked a saying to be placed in the front cover of the Mass booklet, "Lord, I've read your Gospel not in the Bible alone." I do not know where he discovered it, but it conveys how God is always speaking to us: in the depths of our hearts and consciences; through our relationships; and through the events of our experience. In our discipleship, Mary the Mother of the Word teaches us to live in expectation and openness of this voice of God - to receive this Word with both humility and possibility, and to nurture it with both attention and care.

The circumstances of this summer have been a word to us in Australia we cannot ignore. It is a word that calls for our response. We cannot go further into the new year without attending to the difficult questions about the changes to our climate and their impact on our landscape, wildlife, communities and livelihood. Hearing this word, we cannot avoid the responsibility that belongs to each of us to live and to act in a different way for the sake of our environment. Though we have been blessed these days with some relief from the intensity of the crisis, we must face now its long-term impact. The lives of people and communities have been irrevocably changed. The environmental, emotional and economic implications are simply enormous and will endure well into the future. This, too, must be a word to us that not only stirs our compassion, but which also galvanizes social and political action to effect real change.

Over these months we have witnessed extraordinary service and courage. Our firefighters and all those who have been involved on the frontline of this national crisis deserve our utmost esteem and gratitude. They have taught us best what being Australian means. They, too, are a word to us just as are the many stories of community support that the tragedy has narrated. We can express our gratitude most by learning from them. We best honour our memory of their selflessness by working together to bring about something different for our country so that the future might present with hope rather than anxiety. May this be the commitment of our celebration of Australia Day this year. May our commemoration be one of special reflection, of particular invitation, and bear the opportunity for a new way of living in this land so ancient and for which we have stewardship in concert with our Aboriginal brothers and sisters from whom we must always learn and journey forward together.

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Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel—Struggling With Our Own Inadequacy

It is hard to measure up. In our lucid moments we admit this. Rarely is there a day when we could not echo these words by Anna Blaman:

I realized that it was simply impossible for a human being to be and remain good or pure. If, for instance, I wanted to be attentive in one direction, it could only be at the cost of neglecting another. If I gave my heart to one thing, it left another in the cold. No day and no hour go by without my being guilty of inadequacy. We never do enough, and what we do is never well enough done, except being inadequate, which we are good at because that is the way we are made. This is true of me and of everyone else.

Every day and every hour brings with it its weight of moral guilt, as regards my work and my relations with others. I am constantly catching myself out in my human failings and, in spite of their being implied in my human imperfection, I am conscious of a sort of check. And this means that my human shortcomings are also my human quilt. It sounds strange that we should be guilty where we can do nothing about it. But even where there is no set purpose, no deliberate intention, we have a conviction of our own shortcomings, and of consensual guilt, a guilt which shows itself all too clearly in the consequences of what we have done or left undone.

To be human is to be inadequate, by definition.

Henri Nouwen occasionally expressed similar feelings: There is a nagging sense that there are unfinished tasks, unfulfilled promises, unrealized proposals. There is always something else that we should have remembered, done, or said. There are always people we did not speak to, write to, or visit. Thus, although we are very busy, we also have a lingering feeling of never really fulfilling our obligations. A gnawing sense of being unfulfilled underlies our filled lives.

When we are in touch with ourselves, we can relate to these words, these expressions of inadequacy. At the end of the day, we cannot measure up and cannot fail to disappoint others and ourselves. Generally the fault is not that we are insincere or that we do not put out the effort. The fault is that we are human. We have limited resources, get tired, experience feelings we cannot control, have only 24 hours in our day, have too many demands on us, have wounds and weaknesses that shackle us, and thus know exactly what St. Paul meant when he said: Woe to me, wretch that I am, the good I want to do, I cannot do; and the évil I want to avoid, I end up doing!

That may sound negative, neurotic, and stoic, and it can be those things, but, appropriated properly, it can generate hope and renewed energy in our lives. To be human is to be inadequate, by definition. Only God is adequate and the rest of us can safely say to ourselves: Fear not you are inadequate! But a God who made us this way surely gives us the slack, the forgiveness, and the grace we need to work with this. Personally, I take consolation from the gospel parable of the ten bridesmaids who, while waiting for the bridegroom, all fell asleep, wise and the foolish alike. Even the wise were too human and too weak to stay awake the whole time. Nobody does it perfectly and, accepting this, our congenital inadequacy, can bring us to a healthy humility and perhaps even to a healthy humor about it.

But it should bring us to something more: prayer, especially the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is, among other things, a vigil of waiting. When Jesus instituted the Eucharist he told the disciples to keep celebrating it until he returned again. A biblical scholar, Gerhard Lofink, puts it this way:

The early apostolic communities cannot be understood outside of the matrix of intense expectation. They were communities imminently awaiting Christ's return. They gathered in Eucharist, among other reasons, to foster and sustain this awareness, namely, that they were living in wait, waiting for Christ to return.

I try to celebrate Eucharist every day. I do this because I am a priest and part of the covenant a priest makes with the church at his ordination is to pray the priestly prayer of Jesus, the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours, regularly for the world. But I do it too, more personally, for another reason:

The older I get, the less confident, in some ways, I am becoming. I don't always know whether I'm following Christ properly or even know exactly what it means to follow Christ, and so I stake my faith on an invitation that Jesus left us on the night before he died: To break bread and drink wine in his memory and to trust that this, if all else is uncertain, is what we should be doing while we wait for him to return.

The centurion who asked Jesus to come and cure his daughter said to Jesus, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, say but the word and she will be healed" and we pray "Say but the word and my soul shall be healed".

- o You could ask the guestion "Why and how should I read the Bible?" at **Alpha**.

Australian Catholic Youth Festival testimonies

Our pilgrims (Joshua, Phillip, Antony, Sam and Joanna) want to say a huge thankyou for the Parish's support and prayers to allow us to experience the pilgrimage that happened in December last year. Here are some of our highlights and reflections.

Antony (aged 21)

ACYF was an amazing experience for me. My highlights at the conference were meeting new people and listening to talks that I was interested in. Experiencing adoration on the 2nd night with 5000 other young people was a great moment that I got a lot out of. Another highlight for me was talking to Bishop Gregory Homeming from the Lismore diocese, he shared some great advice that really helped me a lot in my faith. I would highly encourage anything thinking about ACYF to attend the next one because it is an excellent place to grow more in your Catholic faith, to learn new skills to apply in youth ministry and a place to be inspired to lead others.

Phillip (aged 18)

My name is Phillip, and I was fortunate enough to travel to Perth for the Australian Catholic Youth Festival 2019 with some friends from Antioch. It was a really great experience overall, and I was able to experience my faith from a different perspective too. One of the highlights for me was when I went to a series of leadership talks by Karl Brown. He was a very passionate speaker, effectively conveying his points about leading others. I think it's important to learn new skills, and I'm hoping to utilise what I gained from him and others in my own community - Antioch and the broader Church. This was my second ACYF experience (after attending the Sydney one in 2017) and I'd recommend any youth or young adults to consider participating in the next one. Why? Because there really is a lot to gain even in the most seemingly uneventful situations there.
