Dear friends,

Recently Bishop Anthony sent a letter to the clergy of the Diocese acknowledging how the crisis of the COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted the course of Sacramental Preparation Programmes across all parishes especially the celebration of Confirmation.

"I have been unable to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the parishes of the Diocese at all this year," said Bishop Randazzo, who has decided, due to ongoing uncertainty and for the sake of clarity for parents and families, parishes and personnel involved in preparing children for the Sacraments, that he will **not** celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at all in 2020.

As a consequence here at Epping and Carlingford, there will be no celebration of Confirmation of baptised children until the second half of 2021.

Bishop Anthony went on to say, "Feedback I have received about the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation indicates to me that the practice of celebrating it with those who have reached the age of 7 (typically those in Year 2 of school) is too early for a truly meaningful reception of the Sacrament. Therefore, I wish to use the circumstances afforded us negatively by the pandemic to place our practice of Sacramental preparation, positively, on a new footing going forward.

This will result in Confirmation in the future ordinarily being celebrated with those who have reached the age of 8 and who are typically in Year 3. Reconciliation and Eucharist will, therefore, be celebrated with those who are aged 9 and in Year 4.

This will mean for those Parishes who begin the programme of Sacramental Preparation with the Sacrament of Confirmation in the second half of the year (this applies to our parish!):

- 1. Acceptance of candidates into the new programme will be delayed until the second half of 2021;
- 2. The programme of Sacramental Preparation will be in abeyance until that time;
- 3. Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist will occur in 2022.

Consequently, throughout 2021-2022, the foundation of the programme of Sacramental Preparation for children who are 8 and older will have been established across all parishes in the Diocese.

Note also that the Bishop has not changed the order of the Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism will still be followed by Confirmation and Eucharist. First Reconciliation (Confession) will normally be celebrated before First Holy Communion.

"I regard this as the best and most sustainable way forward to address both the suspension of the celebration of Confirmation for the rest of this year and to engage the unique opportunity with which we are now presented to bring Sacramental Preparation Programmes into the future on a different footing for children who are older and more able to appreciate the significance of their Christian initiation."

For those families who celebrated First Reconciliation in March this year, you will have the opportunity to celebrate First Holy Communion in November 2020 or immediately after Easter in April 2021. Preparation will occur over the weeks prior to the commencement of the actual celebration of the Sacrament.

Keep **Touch**

St Ignatius of Loyala

One of the gifts of St Ignatius to the Church is his understanding of the process of discernment. Discernment is more than simply deliberating and making wise decisions. It is about prayerful attentiveness to God's presence in us and in the world and openness to answering God's call to us, both personally and collectively.

The examen prayer, which St Ignatius asked Jesuits to pray twice daily, is a fundamental practice of discernment, it helps us to cultivate awareness of God's action in us and in our world, and to pay attention to our response. It is not

examination of conscience, like our reflection in preparation for the sacrament of reconciliation, but rather an examination of our consciousness, and so it is sometimes known as the consciousness examen.

There are many contemporary versions of the examen. They share five steps or elements that can be summarised

expressing gratitude, seeking insight, reflecting, noticing, and looking forward. Here is one way to pray the examen:

Gratitude: I give thanks to God for.....

Insight: I ask the Holy Spirit for insight into myself and the world...

Reflecting: I review events of the day, my behaviour,

and notice my feelings...

Noticing: I notice what needs healing and ask God for forgiveness.....

Looking forward: I name the action I feel called to now,

and I ask for God's help... Courtesy of Sandie Cornish

There are consequences too, for *the Kingdom of Heaven* is like a dragnet that brings in all kind of things ~ the good ones they collect and those of no use they throw away. . . The 'just' they separate, and they throw the 'wicked' where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Mt 13:44-52

Paul writes about this treasure. God cooperates with those who love him and cooperates with all those he has called . . . to become true images of his Son.
How? God turns everything to their good. He justifies .

and he shares his glory with them. Does that sound like the Kingdom of Heaven where we trust God and God turns everything that happens to us and around us to our **good**? Rm 8:28-30

We hear in Psalm 118 about someone who found a treasure. The treasure of loving God's word, God's will and embracing God's love for us. We can pray with this person ~ Lord I love your commands. I have resolved to obey your word. Your will is wonderful indeed; therefore, I obey it.

In the first reading Solomon prayed; Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil. God replied; I give you a heart wise and shrewd. 1 Kings 3,7-12

As we hear from God about the Kingdom of Heaven, our response to God could be. **If we are not looking** or not expecting much in life ~ Lord, surprise us by stumbling upon the treasure. **If we are looking** for more in life ~ show us this pearl of great value. May we have the courage to sell everything we own to be part of this Kingdom of Heaven. Give us the treasure of trusting you God, that **all** things work for good.

As Jesus advised every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven, to bring out things both old and new, so may every disciple become a scribe, a missionary disciple and write, so all will know what is old and hear what is new in the Kingdom of Heaven.



Things old and new

John Thornhill was a Marist Father with an international reputation as a writer and lecturer in theology. He was a member of the International Theological Commission (1980-1985), appointed by Pope John Paul II. For several years he was a member of the Anglican Roman Catholic International Commission (ARCIC II).

After he retired he lectured to parish audiences throughout Australia and in neighbouring countries. From 2002 to 2009 he worked in collaboration with Patrick Lim, a Diocesan Priest in the Archdiocese of Perth to record and produce his lectures in videos.

He has written 21 Unpacking the Emmaus Series booklets to be used in conjunction with the viewing of the presentations. He has published a number of books and numerous articles. He has recently completed another 3 lectures "Introduction to Catholic Theology (Revelation, Faith & Theology). His last book was on Christopher Dawson's interpretation of history which FeedARead.com published on December 3, 2018 titled 'The Road All Peoples Travel.'

The Australian Catholic University awarded John Thornhill with its highest honour, Doctor of the University (Honoris Caus) at its Sydney ceremony for graduating Education Students on 8 May 2007.

The Australia Catholic Theological Association on 9th of July 2011 at its annual general meeting in Sydney awarded John as a "Fellow of the Australian Catholic Theological Association" in recognition of his achievements "in the foremost ranks of Australian theologians". Fr John's long and distinguished service as a world-ranking theologian began in the 1950s. He stopped writing in early 2018 and moved into nursing not long after. John turned 90 on the 13 May 2019 and died on 28 July 2019.

Reflection on the Sunday's Gospel...

The collection of parables of 'the Kingdom' that we conclude today is the centrepiece of Matthew's gospel. He closes this section with an autobiographical note. As he tells the story of Jesus for a community from a Jewish background, he sees himself as 'a scribe of the Kingdom'. The scribes who are often mentioned in the gospels were the rabbis who interpreted and taught the Law of old Israel. Matthew sees himself as an interpreter of the fulfilment of all the hopes of Israel brought by the Saviour. From the first, the apostles and their companions taught that the life, death and resurrection of Jesus were 'according to the scriptures'. If the essential message of the scriptures was making known the ways of God, these ways were given a dramatic and final expression, they announced, in Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus is the new Moses, bringing the New Law of the Sermon on the Mount; he inaugurates a new Covenant in his blood; he establishes the new Temple that is his own body; he is the new David, the messiah exercising divine rule over God's final Kingdom. As one great writer put it, in the light brought by Christ, the Scriptures 'opened their heart for the rejoicing and astonished apostles'. The old figures and shadows have given way to realities beyond all the imagining of old Israel. Matthew shares in this enthusiasm, and sees himself as a 'scribe of the Kingdom', as he relates the old to the new.

But this fulfilment is mysterious, as the parables we have seen already make clear. A conversion is necessary if one is to recognise and appreciate the coming of the Kingdom announced by Jesus. Each parable presents a challenge – we must leave behind our too human way of seeing things and identify with the ways of God that have constituted the essential message of the scriptures from the beginning.

The parables of the treasure in the field and the pearl of great price emphasise this need for conversion. Identification with the ways of God that shape the Kingdom must be unconditional. In our Australian land, buried treasure is the stuff of fairy tales; but in Palestine, with its long history of kingdoms and empires, the possibility of finding a treasure trove was real. And if this happened, the treasure belonged to the owner of the site. One who had such a stoke of good fortune, Jesus says, would do all that he could to buy the field - and in a similar way, no other allegiance will rule the life of one who has found the joy of letting God's word and God's ways to be the measure of his or her life. The pearl for which the merchant sells everything has the same lesson. For ancient peoples, a pearl was the loveliest of possessions. The merchant of the parable will do whatever is necessary to acquire the pearl he has found that is without compare. This does not mean that he saw no beauty and value in the other pearls that he came across. Our choice of the values of the Kingdom does not mean that we should despise other worthy causes. The parable teaches us, however, that identifying with the Kingdom announced by Jesus means getting our priorities right. The parable of the dragnet has a message similar to that of the wheat and the weeds. It is not for us to make final judgment of the good and the bad - that belongs to the Lord. Meanwhile, the Church - through which the Kingdom is 'present in mystery' - is made up of a 'haul of all kinds'. Following the example of Jesus, who reached out to prostitutes and sinners, the Church will never turn its back on those who are still struggling with the issues of life.
