## Social Justice

### 27 January—International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust

The Holocaust is referred to by Jewish people as 'the Shoah'. It is the name given to the campaign of genocide carried out by the Nazis during their regime in Germany and their occupation of many European countries during World War II. The Nazis, added by collaborators in occupied countries, embarked on a systematic extermination resulting in the murder of six million Jews—about two-thirds of the European Jewish population. Other groups were also targeted, including Poles and other Slavs, Soviet citizens and prisoners of war, Roma people, gay men and 'incurably sick' people.

*Today, in this place, we hear once more the voice of God: 'Adam, where are you?'*

*From the ground there rises up a soft cry: 'Have mercy on us, O Lord!' To you, O Lord our God, Belongs righteousness; but to us confusion of face and shame (cf. Bar 1:15).*

*A great evil has befallen us, such as never happened under the heavens (cf. Bar 2:2). Now, Lord, hear our prayer, hear our plea, save us in your mercy. Save us from this horror.*

*Almighty Lord, a soul in anguish cries out to you. Hear, Lord, and have mercy! We have sinned against you. You reign for ever (cf. Bar 3:1-2). Remember us in your mercy. Grant us the grace to be ashamed of what we men have done, to be ashamed of this massive idolatry, of having despised and destroyed our own flesh which you formed from the earth, to which you gave life with your own breath of life. Never again, Lord, never again!*

*Adam, where are you? Her we are, Lord, shamed by what man, created in your own image and likeness, was capable of doing.*

### From 'Ten Steps to Making a Home for Everyone in Our Land'

1. Reflect on the Parable of the Good Samaritan

Every day in our streets, we like the Samaritan, see wounded people desperately in need of help. They are the homeless and the lost, injured by misfortune, by violence and by poverty. How have so many come to be on the streets of such a rich nation?

There are various ways we can be Good Samaritans: some people help with emergency relief or a bed for the night, while others use their community connections to provide support and create more housing. All kinds of responses are needed.

## Children's Liturgy of the Word-Kidz Word

### We Need Your Help!!

Children's Liturgy of the Word (Kidz Word) is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word offered at the 9:30am Sunday Mass at Carlingford and the 10:15am Mass at Epping during school terms.

During the Mass the celebrant calls forward the authorised adult leaders and children just after the Collect (Opening Prayer). These children are invited to go with the Catechists from the church to the parish meeting room. During this special time, the leaders will lead the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for the children.

During this time the children reflect on the same Scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They are taught a simplified main message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their parents after Mass.

Volunteers are needed to lead the liturgies each week, as well as to assist with the supervision of the children. This is a great opportunity for adults and middle/high school youth to help these eager youngsters celebrate God's word.

A working with Children's Check will be required.

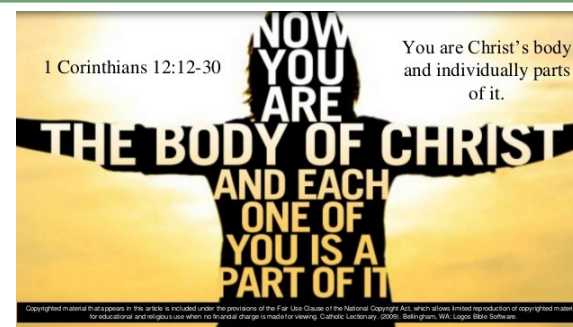

## Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel - New Eras

Two men open scrolls of parchment. Each reads his to his people. In both cases, these proclamations signal a beginning of a vast new era. One man is Ezra the scribe, and the other is Jesus of Nazareth. Four centuries separate their readings.

Let's look.

We find Ezra in the First Reading. He is in Jerusalem after the return of the Jewish exiles from captivity in Babylon. What is the "captivity in Babylon," you ask? Perhaps it will help to have more of the story.

Ancient Israel was captured by the Babylonian empire 586 years before Christ. The Babylonians took Jerusalem itself, and demolished the great temple built by Solomon centuries before. They deported all productive citizens to Babylon, leaving peasants to run the holy city—if they could.

<p>His mission is to rebuild their hearts as well as their city, to return them to God, who is their real home.</p>	<p>After fifty years or so of their captivity, Cyrus the Great, king of Persia (now Iran), came into possession of Babylon and he let the captives go. Many had switched their faith by this time in favor of foreign gods and customs, but the remainder, perhaps 5,000, made ready to return home. A lot of them had never even seen Jerusalem.</p>
	<p>Thus there were great caravans. Ezra—priest, scribe and teacher—led one of them on the four-month desert journey.</p>

They arrived to find Jerusalem a ruined city with widespread moral decay.

Reconstruction of an urban center is immensely difficult, as we know from our own day. Ezra worked long and hard to bring back the civil and churchly fiber of Jerusalem and of the nation.

At last a new temple was finished in 516 BC. The ruined city walls had been rebuilt.

Ezra stood up on a high wooden platform made for the occasion so that he could be heard and seen. He "read plainly" from the scroll that held "the book of the law." He started at daybreak and continuing until midday!

Now the Jews had their city again, and also they had heard the Word of God again. Finally there was once more a temple where they could worship. The new era had begun!

Four centuries later we find Jesus of Nazareth making a similar return. He goes back to Galilee, the region where he grew up (Gospel). He had been baptized and has spent time in the desert. His trip is "in the power of the Spirit," Luke says, and it brings him to his home town of Nazareth. Like Ezra, he takes up a scroll, this one containing the book of Isaiah—much of which, coincidentally, had been written during the previous Jewish exile.

He reads a passage which says that the Spirit of the Lord has sent him to "bring glad tidings to the poor, ... to let the oppressed go free," to proclaim a time of favor from the Lord (Is 61: 1-2). This is what Ezra had proclaimed in the First Reading. But Jesus' mission is much, much more. A great new era had begun.

He sits, at the same level as the people. He says almost casually, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

His mission is to rebuild their hearts as well as their city, to return them to God, who is their real home. Would they accept this startling new epoch?

Will we?

### REFLECTION ON NEXT SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURES

### The Parish Playgroup – Little Engines

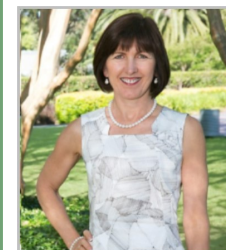
