Dear Parishioners,

Booking in for Mass: Many people have asked why we are moving to a booking system for Mass, especially now that restrictions have eased. Booking in is a temporary system which we will use as long as the NSW Govt requires us to collect contact tracing details, and restricts the number of people who can gather. At present we have enough capacity for everyone who wants to come to Sunday Mass. But we expect that there will be much greater demand at Easter, at first Communion Masses and other special events, and as people regain their confidence and return to Mass. There is also the risk that restrictions can be suddenly re-imposed, as they were the week before Christmas.

So from next weekend we invite you to book online for weekend Mass. This will greatly streamline your entry into the church, as the booking takes the place of either using a QR code or needing to sign in with pen and paper. Our friendly welcomers will simply ask your name and check you in. You will be able to leave your phone turned off, in your car, or at home if you wish. You will be able to book your whole family (up to six people) in one registration. This is the system which the largest parishes in our diocese have been using successfully for six months.

If you don't have internet access, don't worry, you can still use the QR code or sign in the usual way. From March 20/21 onwards you'll be able to phone the parish office and we will book in anybody who can't do it for themselves. Thank you for bearing with us in this necessary change. We will do all we can to support you and make it easy for you.

Mystical Experience: In his homily this week Fr Jim will speak about mystical experiences in prayer which are both more common and less fantastical than people may imagine. The four hallmarks of mystical experiences in prayer are ineffability (unexplainably), transience, passivity, and noetic (intellectual) quality, according to a classic definition by William James. While many great saints had and described mystical experiences, they also urged caution, with St John of the Cross writing that "it is very easy for the soul to be deceived" (*Ascent of Mt Carmel*, 2.xxi.7), and therefore not to pursue such experiences, but to accept them as gifts if and when they come, sifting them as St Ignatius advises in his *Rules for the Discernment of Spirits*.

While the saints tell us not to chase after such experiences, we can dispose ourselves to them by taking quiet, unhurried time in prayer. Our hours of adoration at OLHC on Mondays at 6pm and St Gerard's on Fridays at 7pm are one way to do this. Even better, for those who are able, is to take a day, a weekend or a week on retreat. We are blessed to be within an hour or so of several Catholic retreat centres which offer a range of silent retreat options:

MARGRET FROM SOLOMON ISLANDS—PROJECT COMPASSION

Margret, 39, is a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment.

The school faced water shortages for about half the year. Staff and students would walk for up to half an hour to collect water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables. Then in April 2020, amidst the threat of COVID-19, Tropical Cyclone Harold struck, damaging school buildings and its vegetable garden.

With Caritas Australia's support, Margret's school installed eight large water tanks and provided cyclone-proof materials to repair the damage. It also helped the school to implement COVID-19 prevention measures, providing fabric for students to make face masks.

Margret's school now has enough safe water to supply the school's population of 150 and has the capacity to cater for more students. It plans to boost food security, by increasing its agricultural production. This will improve nutrition and boost the school's income, while building resilience to future disasters.

Margret hopes that the school can aspire to 'Be More'.

"I am proud that our school community works together with Caritas Australia as our partner in ensuring that we live in a healthier environment," Margret says.

Following the service, tea and coffee is available, and there is an opportunity to stay for lunch. Organizers do ask we bring our own sandwich.





Listen, God is speaking

Let God reveal who God is in the readings this second Sunday of Lent.

In Genesis, "God put Abraham to the test. God said *Take your son, your only child Isaac, whom you love, you shall offer him as a burnt offering.* . . . Abraham seized the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him. *Do not raise your hand against the boy. Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.*' Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt-offering in place of his son."

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. (Listen to God's surprise.) **Abraham, you have not refused me your son, your only son.** (The Lord God promises) *I swear by my own self, I will shower blessings on you. . . All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves, as a reward for your obedience.* Gen 22:1-2,9-13,15-18

St Paul tells us; *God is on our side. God will not refuse anything he can give. **God did not spare his own Son** but **gave him up** to benefit us all. **Jesus died for us** – he rose from the dead, and he stands at God's right hand and pleads for us.* Romans 8:31-34

In the Gospel, Mark tells us, *Jesus was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white. Peter and James and John saw it and never forgot it. They were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and a voice came from the cloud, **This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.** God the Father revealed Jesus is the one God loves! He is the Son of the Father, the Son of His Love. **The beloved** reveals who Jesus is.* Mark 9:2-10

There is a time to listen and a time to tell. We are at our best when we are loving. When we are loving one another, this brings out our best self. Love is empowering. The Beloved is among us.

Fr Jim has asked our parish **to offer Alpha**, so others will experience this time of listening and time of telling how love is alive and with us.

The question is **Who will offer Alpha?** We ask the Holy Spirit to call individuals, who will come together and commit to host and to help others to experience Alpha. Our prayer, *May those who have done Alpha listen to God. Who is the Spirit calling to go with our guests on the Alpha journey?*

Would you pause for a moment. Who comes to mind who has done Alpha? Please pray for them. Would you go to them and encourage them to contact me (denis.mcnamara@eppcarl.org.au) to learn more about the coming Alpha.

We trust with St Paul. *With God on our side who can be against us? Since God gave his own Son, to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give.* Romans 8:31

- ☐ We adhere to maximum number of person permitted in the church based on the two square metre rule (160 people at Epping and 290 at Carlingford).
