Dear Parishioners,

It's almost Christmas!

Advent has begun, and so it is time for us to prepare for our Christmas liturgies. After the challenging year we have all had, Christmas will be an especially joyful celebration this year. We look forward to restrictions easing on December 15th, after which we will be able to sing in church, and mask wearing will hopefully become optional.

The density limit of 1 person per 2 square metres will remain, and this poses a challenge for us: we would exceed our limit of 200 people at OLHC and 300 at St Gerard's at many of our Christmas Masses. The Pastoral Council has discerned that the most important thing for us this Christmas is that we not turn anybody away, either through the church being full, or, through people not knowing that they needed to book. We have therefore taken the decision that this year we will hold all of our Christmas Masses outdoors. We have undercover spaces at both OLHC and St Gerard's which will allow us to gather regardless of weather, and with space to expand with the number of people. Outdoor spaces are much healthier in terms of virus transmission and this may encourage people who have been otherwise hesitant to return. It will also protect us from any sudden changes to restrictions, such as last year when density limits changed just a week before Christmas.

We will need to work together to make these Masses work well for the glory of God and as an outreach to as many people as possible. This weekend there are sign up sheets at the back of the church for newcomers, and for set up and pack down teams on Thursday 23rd, Friday 24th and Saturday 25th. We will also have working bees on the weekend of

Dec 19th to get the site ready. Please help out wherever you can as an expression of your sharing your faith with your neighbours.

What to give for Christmas? Most of us in Australia want for so little, yet, at Christmas we feel compelled to give gifts as a convention, and in doing so, add to the overeating, consumerism and wastefulness which we all try to avoid the rest of the year. A great solution to this is to give a *Global Gift* via Caritas Australia whereby we make a donation to Caritas, and receive card to give which tells our loved on that a donation has been made on their behalf to provide food, clean water or education to some of the poorest people in the world. Goats have often been a popular version of this in the past. Parishioners are often so generous to their priests that we end up awash in boxes of chocolates or bottles of wine, but I (Fr Jim) would much rather receive one of these Global Gifts cards. Perhaps there are people in your life who feel the same. Go to www.globalgifts.org.au to buy your cards which can be either printed or electronic.

Advent Reconciliation: Many people choose to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent as part of their preparation for Christmas. Lockdown brought out the best in many of us, but also may have brought out our worst in some ways, so there may well be sin we want to deal with before God to prepare ourselves for Christmas. This year we will not be having a 2nd Rite of Reconciliation (a liturgy of the Word with a number of priests for the sacrament). Instead, Fr Bogdan and Fr Jim will continue to offer 4 sessions of Reconciliation each week: Monday 6pm at OLHC, Friday 7.30pm at St Gerard's, Saturday 9.45am at OLHC and Saturday 5pm at St Gerard's. We'll also make some additional times available closer to Christmas.

Parish Meeting Rooms We look forward to the easing of restrictions on Dec 15th. After this time our meeting rooms will be available for all groups and ministries, and eating, drinking and singing will be permitted. Until that time, masks must still be worn, check in is required, and vaccination is required due the exemption for places of worship only extending to the church building. Many groups are choosing to meet outdoors at present avoid

The Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill (2021) has been introduced into NSW Parliament. Our Bishop Anthony Randazzo has written that "It has long been the understanding in the Catholic Tradition that extraordinary means are not a moral requirement for the preservation of life. Each person must have the right to determine to withdraw from such treatment if the consequences are



not for the benefit of a quality of life. The direct termination of life [euthanasia], however, is a different matter". Bishop Anthony has written to our local members

of parliament, and encourages us to do the same. "Your voice will be critical throughout the parliamentary debate. Let us address the problem of suffering. Let us do so, however, in a way that promotes a culture of life within our society rather than which insinuates a culture of death, sanitised though it may be." Fr Marek recently attended a rally at Parliament House opposing the VAD Bill.

Asylum seekers from Afghanistan: We have watched with horror the violence which has unfolded as the Taliban have reclaimed Afghanistan. Many people, especially women and girls are trying to flee, knowing that their lives and livelihoods are no



longer safe there. Concerned Catholics around Australia have heeded Pope Francis' call to support and advocate for these asylum seekers, and have been meeting with members of federal parliament to ask that 20,000 asylum refugees be welcomed, that families be allowed to reunite, and that Afghan refugees on temporary visas be granted permanent visa. Parishioners Mark Smith, Greg Leigh, Gavin Hays, Christine Howe, Kirk and Louise Koelmeyer, Tony Abood, Fr Jim and local community leaders met with Bennelong MP John Alexander on November 9th to put these requests to him.

We were warmly received by Mr. Alexander, who concurred that given our military involvement in Afghanistan for so long we also owe them support in this time of transition. He pledged to work with other like minded MPs to approach Immigration Ministry Alex Hawke and Prime Minister Scott Morrison.

Farewell to Hien: Hien Vu has been appointed to our parish this year for his pastoral placement, the fifth of his seven years of formation for priesthood at The Seminary of the Good Shepherd. Hien has contributed to every area of parish life including schools, home visitation, sacramental programs, liturgy, youth ministry and welcoming. His gentle yet engaging presence in these and other ministries reveal his pastoral and prayerful heart and bode well for the kind of priest he will one day be (he's likely to be ordained in 2024). His pastoral placement concludes at Christmas, and so we will formally farewell him at the Carols Evening at St Gerard's on Boxing Day night.

You may also like to sign the farewell card for him at the back of the church.

Moving out of Epping: We have now vacated the parish office at Epping, and Fr Jim and Hien will be moving out of the presbytery this coming week. We are striving to waste nothing and send nothing to landfill. Much of the furniture and equipment is being re-purposed at Carlingford. Some furniture will go into storage for the next two years for the new presbytery at Epping. Air conditioning units from the Epping office are being installed in the crying room at St Gerard's. Cupboards from the Epping meeting room have been reinstalled at the back of OLHC Church. We are recycling metal and electronics. This past weekend saw lots of parishioners snap up a bargain at our garage sale on Sunday morning at OLHC, and there be even more these new two weeks.
