As I am sure we all know by now, the County Court of Victoria this week lifted a suppression order on the reporting of the trials of Cardinal George Pell, revealing the Cardinal was found guilty on 11th December 2018 on charges of child sex abuse offences.

This news has and will continue to bring to the surface many different reactions and emotions within each of us, along with the wider Church and community in Australia. Indeed it is important that we are able to share our distress, confusion and hurt in a way which respects the gravity of what has occurred and is able to be placed in such a way that we are reassured and strengthened by our Christian hope that the Risen Christ is Master even of our confusion.

On hearing of the news, one of our parishioners sent me this message in an email and gave me permission to share it with you:

"Obviously, today has been - complicated may be the best way to put it. Friends asked how I was doing. My flatmate offered to skip the first stories on the news. I overheard others in the work kitchen let their feelings be known.

I thought about it for a while. And I've come to this conclusion. Faith is not pure. Any 'pure faith' is not tested, and faith not tested has no depth. Faith is battle scarred. It is tested and stretched and full of doubt and questions. It has been cut, shrunk, regrown and taken new paths. It is a plant that had to grow in ground that was hostile, fighting against others for water and light and food. And sometimes it's not strength that allows it to survive, but moment of sunlight, the drop of water, the bee that came by at the right time. So I pray that this week that hacks at those branches and leaves, that it will hopefully make the roots grow deeper, the branches spread to new areas.

We are great at spotting others with poor sight, because "they have a splinter in their eye."

But we have no insight into our own blindness, because we have a "plank", which is a big piece of tree, in our own eye! (Could that be true? Is Jesus talking about me?).

Being a disciple is being a lifelong learner. We are always on L plates. Being a disciple, this Lent is being a follower, always listening and being guided by the wisest teacher. If we are to learn and grow wiser, these are some ways to do that this Lent.

A disciple has discipline

Where can you be more in control of your life? Our Catholic tradition going back to Jesus tells us that we fast, we give up things that distract us, so we can focus on Jesus. This fast includes food as well as fasting from other things that draw us away from seeing what is really worthwhile.

We fast to find insight.

So this Lent, where will you look to Jesus to learn more and to follow?



Ceremony of Burning Palms for Ash Wednesday

It has been an ancient custom of our Church that ashes for Ash Wednesday are prepared by burning remaining palms from the celebration of the previous year's Palm Sunday. There is a powerful symbolism in this:



In the first place it is a symbol of the ongoing cycle of the celebrations of our salvation

- each Lent and Easter is connected to the one preceding it.

But more importantly the palms represent the hollow welcome and honour that greeted Jesus on that first Palm Sunday. They are a symbol in a way of the futility that often would accompany ambition for worldly glory. The honour that Jesus received on the Palm Sunday rapidly became his rejection on Good Friday. The burning of the palms to produce the ashes that mark our Lenten commitment therefore can be a symbol of trying to let go of whatever is empty and hollow, lacking in depth and nobility, and re-committing ourselves to what is of depth and of lasting value.

A single celebration of the burning of palms for our two communities will take place on Tuesday 5th March. The ceremony will take place after the 12:15pm Mass at Epping .

At the conclusion of Mass we will process outside where the palms will be burnt with a prayer so that they may then be prepared for our Ash Wednesday celebrations the following morning. We would invite anyone from both our communities who would like to take part to bring your palm from last year to be burnt in this celebration of preparation for Lent.

Project Compassion

On Ash Wednesday, Caritas Australia, the international aid and development agency of the Catholic Church, launches its annual Project Compassion appeal—one of Australia's largest humanitarian fundraising and awareness raising campaigns. Project Compassion runs through the six weeks of Lent. It brings together communities across the country in solidarity with the world's poor to eradicate poverty and help build a world of hope. Money raised through Project Compassion goes towards Caritas Australia's humanitarian and long-term development programs in countries across Africa, Asia, the Pacific and Australia's First Peoples. In 2018, more than \$10.8 million was donated to Project Compassion.

Catechist Sunday

The Sunday before Ash Wednesday is traditionally Catechist Sunday in the Diocese and this year will be held on Sunday 3rd March. Catechist Sunday is an annual event in the CCD Calendar. Catechist Sunday originated in 1935 when the Vatican published a document 'On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education,' which acknowledged the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and asked every country to honour those catechists who serve within their Christian communities. 
Our Baptismal Fonts and Lent

Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel—Seeing

I once followed the Jesuit Larry Gillick, a blind person, in the literal dark. Neither of us fell into a pit. So, was Jesus wrong?

Larry lost his sight before his tenth birthday, but as an adult joined the Society of Jesus and became a marvelous spiritual director. On a retreat he and I were helping to direct, we went on a walk. It was after dark, quite so, and I was as good as blind when we got far enough from the retreat house, with no neighborhood around us? So, the blind following the blind.

As we went, he said to me, do you want to go on a trust walk?

Blindly (pun intended) I said, why, of course.

Except ...

None of us will have perfect "vision," but we should seek continually to clarify what we do see.

First he had me do the famous "fall backwards" that some of my readers have done. I was to release control and tumble back into the arms of another person, in this case Larry. The only problem was that he could not see, and it was also too dark for me to make anything out.

I willed to fall back, and he caught me, and we were happy. I marveled at Larry's conquering of his malady. All was good.

... except that there was a "next step." Quietly he announced that he, a person supposedly unable to find his way, would lead the way. With my hand on his shoulder and a scarf around my eyes—to make certain that I would not cheat—we went forth. Could we avoid a pit?

I avoided it and so did he. It was indeed a walk of trust. Even though I suspected that anything whatsoever could happen, it did not. I was relieved. Larry was so used to guiding people spiritually that was possibly not an act of trust on his part. For him, it did not mean walking blindly into the unknown, it meant going ahead with increasing confidence that we are accompanied by God, no matter what might come around the next dark bend in the road.

What was I myself supposed to learn? To trust recklessly with only sightless guidance? Larry Gillick has been my friend over the years and does not require any beatifying. But I do.

Well, maybe the point was that sightlessness is the only way to really see.

Jesus says in our Gospel that we have "wooden beams" in our eyes when we relate to others. Maybe we must close our eyes for a while in order to see around these. We should stop projecting on others our own blockages, and work on the much larger wooden beams in our own psyche instead. This seems to me a quite sound psychological insight.

Notice, this understanding does not imply that we should entirely give up helping with the faults of another person. Jesus is just saying that we need to clarify our own vision in order to help someone else. None of us will have perfect "vision," but we should seek continually to clarify what we do see.

That night I did not have anything like perfect vision. But the steady, blind guidance that Larry Gillick gave me was an act of seeing unlike most others I have known. As you and I begin Lent this coming week, I guess my advice is that we all close our eves for a while and be guided.

Children's Sacramental Journey -First Reconciliation 2019

This week, we move into our second preparation session called Choices. God gives us the power and freedom to make choices. In this session, the concept of sin is introduced by way of loving choices vs poor choices, and the consequences of our actions. It aims to teach the children to view things not just from their perspective but also that of others and that sin leads to hurt; loving choices lead to peace.

We will discuss our Australian Saint, Mary MacKillop, how much love she gave to her community in choosing to use God's gifts by helping the poor and starting schools. This reminds the children they can call upon the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit they received at Confirmation to help them make loving choices to love and give.

In the Gospel of Luke, we read The Lost Sheep (15:3-7) where the children will understand if we are 'lost' due to the unloving choices we have made, Jesus, our Good Shepherd, will always come looking for us because he cares for us.

We also touch on another bible story, Jesus Faces Temptation, to assist the children in understanding even Jesus was tempted but he made a loving choice to love and serve so we should learn from that.

Upon completion of the four sessions, Candidates will celebrate their First Reconciliation in our parish on Saturday, 23rd March. <u>Please remember to pray for them</u> during this important time of preparation!
