Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings to you all!

On behalf of Fr Bogdan and myself, I hope you are managing as best as possible especially as the effects of the new restrictions on physical distancing and gatherings are being felt. As I said last week, the importance of following seriously the instructions surrounding hygiene and confinement arise, especially for those of us who profess to be Christians, as implications of following Jesus' "Great Commandment" of Love of God, oneself and others. To live charity is to understand that even the smallest gestures contribute to the common good. As Bill Gates recently wrote, (the COVID-19 virus) "is reminding us that we are all connected and something that affects one person has an effect on another. It is reminding us that the false borders that we have put up have little value as this virus does not need a passport. It is reminding us, by oppressing us for a short time, of those in this world whose life is spent in oppression." Perhaps as we move into this Holy Week and seek to be one with Jesus in His sufferings we might, as a result of this crisis, have a deeper empathy and compassion for all those experiencing various forms of oppression: the sick, those mourning the loss of loved ones, refugees and all those fleeing tyranny in various guises, the unemployed, etc. ALL these should have a special place in both our prayer and other forms of practical concern even with the current restrictions on physical movement.

Last Wednesday, thanks to the online platform Zoom, we were able to hold our monthly PPC meeting without the need to be all physically in the same room.

There were technical problems (largely caused by me!) and it will take a while before we adapt to the new technology but it was fantastic that we could still continue our principal work of discerning how God is calling us here at Epping and Carlingford to be Church in the **NOW**. Over coming weeks I would like to share some of the thinking and reflections that took place during our meeting but for now, could I invite you to create, as one of our parishioners recently put it, "circles of friends" amongst other parishioners as well as within the wider community. For example, already many of you are part of various parish groups/ministries or have attended various programmes within the parish. How about committing to contacting at least three of those people once a week as a way of keeping connected and offering a tangible sign of the supportive presence of Jesus during these days?

As I have already mentioned on a previous occasion, ensuring that the senior members of our community and others who may be unable to go outside their homes for any reason receive a phone call or a knock at the door to ensure they are safe and cared for is an essential part of our Christian outreach during these months in particular. At the PPC meeting we also discussed setting up a group of parishioners who would take on the ministry of phoning those who are living on their own and housebound to simply say "hi" and let them know they are not forgotten. I am keen to see this ministry commence as soon as possible. If you would like to join such a group or would like to receive an occasional phone call, could you please contact either our secretary Maree or myself directly and we will go from there.

(1COR 13:13)"

Coronavirus and the Eucharist Fr Thomas O'Loughlin writes

This crisis calls on us to care for one another and thank God at home

Object or action?

For far too long—some historians would say since the 7th century—Latin Christians had an attitude of thinking about the Eucharist as an object (something that happens due to the priest's work and they are in attendance) or as a commodity (and we behave like religious consumers).

The language we use is the giveaway. We talk about "getting Mass" and "attending Mass", and of "getting communion" and "taking communion". The image is that the Eucharists is "out there", and then we somehow obtain it or make it our own.

But the word "Eucharist" relates to a verb. It is something we, the whole People of God, do. It is our activity of thanking God the Father as a gathered community. And we offer this praise and thanks through Christ our Lord.

The focus is on thanking the Father. Access to the Father is provided to us in the Spirit through Jesus Christ. The prayers are led by the priest. It is our basic activity as Christians, not some "thing" that the priest does for us or makes for us.
