Gospel Reading John 6:24-35 Jesus teaches the crowds that he is the "bread of life."

Background on the Gospel Reading

This Sunday we continue to read from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, but not continuously. Our Lectionary omits John's report of Jesus' walking on water. This event is reported much less dramatically in John's Gospel than in the Synoptic Gospels. After the feeding of the multitudes, the disciples leave in a boat and Jesus follows them. The disciples are said to be terrified by what they see. Jesus reassures them and rejoins them. In today's Gospel, we learn that the crowd has noticed the departure of Jesus and his disciples and so seeks them out in Capernaum. In the dialoque that follows between Jesus and the crowds, Jesus unfolds for us the gift of himself that that he gives in the Eucharist.

In today's Gospel, there are four exchanges between Jesus and the crowd. In the first, the crowd, having followed Jesus to Capernaum, asks a very matter of fact question: "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus replies by naming their motivation in pursuing him. They have been fed. Jesus acknowledges this, yet challenges them to see beyond the fulfillment of their material needs. The crowds have followed Jesus because they have been fed. They ought to be seeking out Jesus because he can give them eternal life.

As the second dialogue begins, it seems that the crowd might be on their way to accepting Jesus and his mission. They ask: "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus replies that they must have faith in the one sent from God. But in the third dialogue, the crowd reveals their inability to see Jesus' true identity. They ask Jesus for a sign so that they might know that Jesus is from God. How strange this sounds since Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people. What more is expected?

But the crowd cannot see beyond the surface of the sign. They show this in their interpretation of the sign that came from Moses. In their description, they identify Jesus with Moses, as if to say, as Moses gave the people manna in the desert, give us a sign so that we will know that you are from God. They are looking to identify a prophet without realizing that God is standing before them.

Jesus corrects their misinterpretation, saying that the manna received by their ancestors came from God. As God fulfilled their ancestors' needs in the desert, so God has provided them with food for eternal life. In the bread that they have received from Jesus, they have received physical nourishment and also spiritual nourishment. Jesus wants the crowd to see beyond the surface to the One who provides true nourishment.

The conclusion of the dialogue reveals the crowd's blindness. They ask for what Jesus has just told them they have found: "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus answers plainly that he himself is the Bread of Life they seek. Jesus himself is the Bread of Life who will satisfy every hunger and thirst. This is the first of several such statements found in John's Gospel. We understand these better when we remember that God revealed his name to the people of Israel as "I am," as Yahweh. Jesus is now claiming this name for himself. In the weeks ahead, we will see the offense that this gives to the people.

Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel: Endlessly Softly

Doesn't the word "falling" describe our lives? Falling into debt, falling from faith, falling into blazing temperatures, or freezing ones, or happening into fallen youths, saying "what shall we believe in?" And the fall of that one true foundation of society, the family?

The <u>First Reading</u> talks about a time like ours. God had pulled his people out of ancient captivity by sending them on a 40 -year "exodus" ("wandering") from Egypt. But in the difficult journey and fierce heat, things had begun to collapse. The freed people began to scorn and censure Moses and Aaron, their leaders. They actually said that they would rather have been killed in the land of Egypt-which at least had flesh-pots to eat from-than to starve, wandering, through the desert.

And how doe anyone face the "falling apart" of the world?

Maybe these words of Annie Lamott hold a key:

When a lot of things start going wrong all at once, it is to protect something big and lovely that is trying to get itself born ... and this something needs for you to be distracted so that it can be born as perfectly as possible.*

Instead of despairing, let us wait and let us help in the birth.

In that ancient, 40 year "exodus," something very big and lovely was trying to be born. God was holding the people's "falling to pieces" gently. He sent a huge flock of quail for meat, and also "bread from heaven" (manna) from the skies.

The Gospel for Sunday flows straight out of this incident. The crowd that Jesus had fed grumbled to him:

Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written. "[But Moses] gave them bread from heaven to eat." What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you?

A strange question, since only the day before Jesus had multiplied five barley loaves till there was enough to feed this very same huge crowd. Did they forget in one day?

Jesus replied, "It was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven." God sends the manna, God sends Jesus, the true manna. God holds it all in his kindly hands.

There is a poem by the German poet, Reiner Maria Rilke, which may apply here. If you will indulge me, I will quote it. It is called "Autumn."

> The leaves are falling, falling as if from afar, as if from some far garden in the sky. They fall with gestures of denial. And in the nights the heavy earth falls out of all the stars, in the loneliness. We all fall. This hand, here, falls. And look at the rest: it is in everything. And yet, there is one, who holds all this falling endlessly softly in his hands.**

Perhaps the careening earth, the crushing human affairs, everything that falls apart, all of it, every bit of it, perhaps it has behind it something big and lovely trying to get itself born.

There is really no other answer to the continuing state of the world, the failures of our lives, the dropping away of opportunities, the shattering economy, the terrible leadership—no answer at all unless those supporting hands make our falling safe somehow and support it with tenderness.

So, instead of despairing, let us wait and let us help in the birth.

Perhaps something most lovely is being born.
