Dear Parishioners,

Coming back to Mass: We don't yet know when restrictions will be lifted to allow us to return to Mass, but, we wait in hope for these announcements from the NSW Govt later this month. The language the government is using at present suggests vaccination may be a requirement to take part in public gatherings, which would include at places of worship. For this, and for every other reason, I encourage you to seek your vaccination now if you have not already done so. Bishop Anthony also encourages you to be vaccinated, and Pope Francis has said that being vaccinated at this time is "an act of love....for oneself, for our families, and friends and for all people" (Aug 18th). None of us however are qualified to give you specific medical advice (and neither is anybody on the internet), so please, if you have any hesitation or questions about being vaccinated, please see your own doctor now. – Fr Jim



Checking in at Mass:

Checking in to Mass will be more important than ever. Scanning the parish's QR code at the entrance to the church will continue to be the normal way for most people to check in. Previous-

ly we had offered the option of signing in with pen and paper for people who were unable to scan a QR code. However, the speed at which the delta virus spreads makes this less suitable, and so Service NSW now offer a "covid check-in card" which will have a unique QR code for you, which can be scanned at the door of the church (and other venues). This can be obtained at www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/create-covid-19-check-card . If you cannot access this yourself, call the parish office and we can do the application on your behalf and have it posted to you. You might also like to reach out to your neighbours and elderly relatives to assist them with this.

Welcome back to Denis McNamara with whom the parish has again contracted to lead missionary discipleship programs. You'll see an invitation from Denis in this bulletin.

Afghanistan: We have watched tragic events unfold in Afghanistan and felt helpless, not knowing what we can do to assist. While we are distant from the plight of people who are unable to leave Afghanistan, we can be of help to

people who are seeking asylum or who have been granted refuge in Australia. Jesuit Refugee Services <https://aus.jrs.net> offer assistance to refugees and asylum seekers from all backgrounds, and their website also links to a petition to the government to request asylum be given to greater numbers of people fleeing Afghanistan.

The Epping Development: If you've walked past OLHC Church lately you may have seen a "Notice of Proposed Development" placard placed on the front fence by Parramatta Council. While the Development Application for the redevelopment of the site was approved in May last year, this notice is for a "Section 4.55 (1A) modification to approve a number of changes associated with the design development including optimisation of floorplates, minor external façade refinements, revised stormwater design and revised landscaping"

This redevelopment project has now been underway for several years and there have been parish forums and numerous updates over this time. Official updates are posted on our parish website <https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/epping-carlingford/our-parish/epping-development> .

In November this year we will be moving the parish office from OLHC to St Gerard's, and Fr Jim and Hien will move into the presbytery at St Gerard's with Fr Bogdan. The presbytery and parish office buildings will be decommissioned at the end of the year ahead of us providing vacant possession of much of the OLHC site to Stockland, our development partner at the start of 2022.

OLHC Church will continue to be open, and all weekend Masses will continue throughout the development period in 2022-2023.

Children's Sacramental Journey - Confirmation 2021

Our online preparation sessions for Confirmation are now completed. Until such time as we are permitted to gather, the families are keeping connected via intermittent emails and newsletters from me and through our parish online activities. I have been looking into creating interactive worksheets in the form of an online booklet. This would enable the children to keep learning as well as save the parents having to print the sheets out. I hope this works out, so please keep us all in your prayers!

It has been a wonderful 4 weeks for us as we gathered online each week to discuss the sacrament of Confirmation. The intimacy of the parent-child interaction was so clearly visible from where I sat. In the comfort of their own homes, they felt secured and I feel this must play a part in their active participation online as there were no inhibitions to speak up and contribute to our discussions. We were also able to all participate in a candle-lighting ceremony to explain the significance of their baptismal candle, do some Annunciation craftwork to make two statues, one of Our Lady Mary and one of the Archangel Gabriel using toilet rolls and role-played (of course I got to be the Bishop!) as we practised renewing our baptismal promises. Each week, different families would email me the sacred space they had set up at home with holy symbols such as the crucifix, the Bible, etc.

This is a challenging time for us all; we are doing our best to support the children and their families as we journey through this. We can't wait for the time we can gather again! In the meanwhile, here are a few photos of the online sessions sent to me from parents



Due to the current climate the format of the assembly has evolved from a large gathering, to smaller hubs and now to a fully online gathering with one person per device. While not ideal and not what we had hoped, the national team will continue to assist and support the members and delegates so that they may participate as effectively as possible.

While many may question why we are proceeding with the Plenary Council at this time, the desire to fulfil Christ's mission, no matter how difficult the circumstances may be, is part of the thinking in moving ahead. It is precisely the challenges that people are now facing, the isolation and discernment, that we are hoping the Church will be able to address. Please continue to pray for the Plenary Council, the members and delegates as they prepare to fulfil their role in the coming months.


