Dear Parishioners,

Fr Jim is away this week, assisting with spiritual direction at the annual retreat for the Seminary of the Good Shepherd. We are grateful to Fr Andrew Murray SM who will be celebrating Masses this weekend at St Gerard's, to Richard Houwing who will lead Communion Services on Monday and Wednesday at St Gerard's, and to Fr Bogdan who is covering all other bases this week.

QR Codes: We are now using the Service NSW QR code at OLHC church, however, it is taking us a little longer to get a separate QR code for St Gerard's. This will come soon.

Keeping you safe: Our parish takes your health and safety seriously. With hundreds of people moving through two churches every weekend there is always the possibility that there can be risks like trip hazards or exposed dangerous surfaces can be encountered. Have you had or witnessed an accident or a near-miss somewhere on our parish properties? Please let us know, ideally in writing and with photos to parish@eppcarl.org.au

Culture of giving: In years past parishes could rely on the cash given on the collection plate at Sunday Mass to provide for all the needs of the parish. Last year's Covid disruption meant that while parish expenses for maintenance, utilities, and wages continued the parish lost much of its cash income. Many people however generously moved to regular forms of cashless giving, either by electronic funds transfer or by credit card. This generosity was remarkable and allowed the parish to continue to operate with only a modest deficit. As we look forward to the time when our churches can again be full we hope that people will continue to give in these electronic ways and that others will join them. Giving electronically reduces the risk and cost of cash handling, and it gives the parish a reliable income from which we can budget to spend wisely. Arranging your own regular giving allows you to plan for your generosity to the parish as part of your personal budget setting. As a new parishioner myself, I've joined the planned giving program, giving monthly by credit card –

Preparing to book in for Mass:

In recent months many parishes have implemented systems of booking in for Sunday Mass in response to the limited number of available places and the need for recording contact tracing details. Here in our parish we have not done this, with the exception of Christmas and Fr Peter's farewell weekend. We have instead adopted the "first-in, first-served" principle, which has at times resulted in people having to be turned away. It's likely that there are others who have simply avoided coming to Mass because of the uncertainty of whether or not they could get in.

Uncertainty is always awkward, and the changes in restrictions which are ongoing can be unsettling (numbers allowed at Mass have gone from 50 people to 80 at OLHC and 140 at St Gerard's, to 160 and 280, and back again to 80 and 140 then 100 in the past months and likely to change after Feb 12th) so we need to find solutions that are scalable in case restrictions suddenly ramp up, as they did the week before Christmas.

At the Parish Pastoral Council meeting this week we agreed that a booking system is the only way to cope with surges in demand from time to time, and to give people confidence that they have a place at Mass. As confidence improves and more people return to Mass, and especially for special events such as Easter, it will be important to book in, so it is worth us developing this process now.

We will use the Trybooking platform which was used at Christmas. It takes less than one minute to book in online using the link which will be on the parish website and which can be included in the bulletin each week. Greeters at the door of the church can check you contactlessly using an app on their phones. This will be quicker than having people sign in with pen and paper.

We expect that the majority of people with internet access will book for themselves and their families. People without internet access can phone during office hours and be booked in. We will have a phase-in period where, while there is still capacity, people without bookings can still come to Mass and sign in with a QR code or pen and paper.

There is no need to book this weekend. We will have information for you in the coming weeks, and will give you advance notice before any change – Fr Jim McKeon

The Season of Lent

is an opportunity for us to deepen our focus on our prayer life and our Christian virtues. In addition to your own personal acts of penance, prayer and almsgiving, we want to offer you some opportunities to make this Lenten season a valuable time in your life:

- Adoration
- Reconciliation
- Ecumenical Prayer
- Small prayer and discussion groups.

Information about each will be in the bulletin this weekend and next.

Reconciliation: During Lent Fr Bogdan and Fr Jim will be offering the sacrament of Penance (or Reconciliation, or Confession) at additional times to the usual Saturday morning and afternoon. Fr Jim will offer this from 6pm – 7pm on Monday nights at OLHC, and Fr Bogdan will offer this from 7pm-8pm on Friday nights at St Gerard's. Our hope is that this will give people who have not had the opportunity to receive this sacrament for a long time will be able to come, and that we will be able to give them the time they need.

Adoration: We will be making a quiet hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available at the same times as Reconciliation: 6pm – 7pm on Monday nights at OLHC, 7pm-8pm on Friday nights at St Gerard's. There is a wonderful stillness and deeper silence which can be encountered before the Eucharist in this way. It's also a very Covid-safe way to pray for people who still don't yet feel comfortable being in larger crowds. Come for the hour, or just call in for a few minutes to enjoy the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Our Parish has a strong history of ecumenical relationships with our neighbouring Christian churches. In this relationship we don't argue about our differences, rather, we come together over the great many things which we share in common, and in doing so, find that we are part of the larger Body of Christ. Every Tuesday night in Lent there will be a one hour shared prayer service (not Mass) at one of the local churches, including here at OLHC on Tuesday March 16th. It's an opportunity to experience another church's prayer tradition and hear another Christian minister preach the gospel.

Keeping the time of Lent:

- please support the work of Caritas Australia, our Church's aid and development agency, by taking a Project Compassion box and/or set of envelopes. Project Compassion is a wonderful way to turn our Lenten self-denial into Lenten giving.
- as Lent calls us to renewal it also calls us as Churches to overcome the barriers which have divided fellow Christians for so long. Please be part of our shared Ecumenical Lenten Celebrations on the Tuesday evenings of Lent. Ceremony of Burning Palms for Ash Wednesday

It has been an ancient custom of our Church that ashes for Ash Wednesday are prepared by burning remaining palms from the celebration of the previous year's Palm Sunday. There is a powerful symbolism in this: · In the first place it is a symbol of the on-going cycle of the celebrations of our salvation – each Lent and Easter is connected to the one preceding it. · But more importantly the palms represent the hollow welcome and honour that greeted Jesus on that first Palm Sunday. They are a symbol in a way of the futility that often would accompany ambition for worldly glory. The honour that Jesus received on the Palm Sunday rapidly became his rejection on Good Friday. The burning of the palms to produce the ashes that mark our Lenten commitment therefore can be a symbol of trying to let go of whatever is empty and hollow, lacking in depth and nobility, and recommitting ourselves to what is of depth and of lasting value. A single celebration of the burning of palms will take place on Tuesday 13th February (Shrove Tuesday). The ceremony will take place after the 12:15pm Mass on Tuesday 16th February at Epping.

BRING YOUR OLD PALM TO BE BURNT: We invite everyone who would like to take part to bring your palm from last year to be burnt in this celebration of preparation for Lent. Leave it in the basket provided in the foyer of each church

Lent begins next week

Make the most of Lent. You will receive so much. Use this spiritual time to reset your focus and redirect your life. In the Gospel, Mark tells us. *The whole town came crowding round the door. Jesus cured many suffering from diseases. He cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.*

Listen carefully to what you have read. Which part relates to you?

Are you one of those crowding around? Are you asking to be cured of some dis-ease?

The devils related to Jesus for *they knew who he was*. Are you curious to find out who Jesus was and who he is today?

This Lent, we journey with Jesus to Jerusalem to be with him when he dies and recognise him when he rises from death. This is how you can "do Lent".

Receive your copy of the Lenten book called **Comfort** to read and reflect as you go through Lent. Pray as a couple or with your family. Hear how Jesus was confronted in his life and he made choices. Learn from Jesus how you can make better choices. You are also invited, encouraged, even called to connect with others on the journey.

Go to a Lenten Group. Join others as they reflect on what they read in the book, Comfort. You can also see videos of what life is all about and see if God has a plan for you. Watch **The SEARCH** on Zoom and catch up with others after the video. When you join a group, you join a conversation. You are with people who recognise **Jesus is alive** and in their life. You find companions on your journey of faith.

The **list of Lenten groups** is available at the entrance. This list tells you when and where you can join a group. Let us know you are coming. Sign up on the page at the entrance to the church or send an email to maree@epccarl.org.au. You can join us in a parish meeting room or on Zoom. You can also host a Lenten group in your home and invite your friends and neighbours.

As Peter told Jesus in the Gospel **Everybody is looking for you**. Let us make the most of Lent. Look for Jesus. Join him on his journey to Jerusalem and join with other disciples who know who Jesus is and choose to follow Him.

A reflection for renewal as Lent draws near:

A reflection for renewal as Lent draws near: We are all celebrants . . . It's a sobering – and an exciting – thought to realise that the quality of our celebration of Mass depends upon every one of us. We all contribute to the celebration of the liturgy. The priest, of course, plays a unique role in virtue of his ordination and leads the celebration. But it's fairly obvious that the quality of the celebration of Mass depends on a lot more than the priest alone. It depends on each one of us. It's worthwhile then considering how each of us in the church, as a celebrant, can contribute either positively or negatively to the celebration of the liturgy:

- by our responses: Much of the celebration of Mass involves a dialogue of response between the priest and the congregation. We expect the priest to bring his best to the celebration. Do we do so ourselves? Are our responses full of energy, spoken with loud voice, with conviction, and with prayer? or are they mumbled mutterings?
- by responding together: There's a danger that our common responses and prayers can be an experience of the Tower of Babel! Everyone saying the response or the prayer at their own pace with little or no reference to every one around them. It can become a matter of a large group of people all responding individually rather than corporately with a unison of voice and spirit. Do we listen to those around us and try to respond with one voice?
