August 8<sup>th</sup> is the solemnity of St Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop), and August 15<sup>th</sup> is the Feast of the Assumption. Welcome Fr Marek: This weekend we welcome Fr Marek Woldan to our parish, who has recently arrived in Australia from the Archdiocese of Czestochowa, Poland (Fr Bogdan's home diocese). Fr Marek has served for many years in the Diocese of Méndi in Papua New Guinea alongside Fr Bogdan. Bishop Anthony has appointed him as assistant priest to our parish for several months while he settles into our diocese. He will be living at Carlingford with Fr Bogdan. Please make him welcome.

**Cleaning out**. The Relocation Steering Committee have put together a Working Group to manage this project/task to identify what to keep and what to dispose of, and that we will be keeping Parishioners up to date as we proceed with the project. We've been using the time in lockdown to start cleaning out some of the junk which has accumulated in the parish over the years. By junk we mean non-working televisions, computers, fridges and freezers. We're trying to engage as many recycling services rather than just throwing out for landfill. Be assured that nothing which is in the church and used for worship is being discarded. Any printed material with personal contact details is either kept securely or shredded using a secure document service.

Vaccination: Our news feeds are now flooded with conversations about Covid vaccination. Fr David Ranson, our former assistant priest and now Vicar General of our diocese recently wrote: "Some of us, I know, have reservations about being located that was income available to the area more." It teaching is clear: the vaccines available to us are moral. It is also our moral responsibility to ensure that we take every means to keep ourselves well and healthy. Further it is our

moral responsibility to ensure that others are kept safe and well. It is our Catholic social responsibility to be vaccinated to ensure that our entire society can move beyond what is crippling us. To make the decision NOT to be vaccinated is, morally, a very serious one. Unless there was a specific medical reason, it is our moral duty to be vaccinated and as soon as possible. I have been vaccinated ed with the Astra Zeneca vaccine, awaiting my second dose in the next few weeks." I am grateful to now be fully vaccinated myself, recognising as we look at the death and illness around the world what a privilege it is to have vaccines available here, and I echo Fr David's words here, and offer them to you for your consideration – Fr Jim

**Statue of Our Lady:** There is a statue of Our Lady Help of Christians which is presently on the Memorial Wall on the northern side of the church. This statue was originally inside the church but is now quite degraded from years of outside exposure. Fr Peter had anticipated that we would remove this statue and commission a new statue to replace it as part of the redevelopment. **Understanding Euthanasia:** In response to a Bill being introduced in September to the NSW Parliament to permit voluntary assisted euthanasia in NSW, the Diocese of Broken Bay and the Diocese of Parramatta are hosting a series of free talks on euthanasia, dying, and the dignity of the human person. The talks will be held via Zoom on Monday Aug 9<sup>th</sup> and Aug 6<sup>th</sup> . Parish Logo: Last fortnight I described a new logo which had been designed for possible use by the parish. Unfortunately the logo itself wasn't in the bulletin, but it is shown here. It incorporates the Cross and the letters "E" and "C" for Epping and Carlingford. The rays from the centre remind us of a monstrance, making the Eucha-



rist visible to us for worship. Together, this logo presents us as a parish community together, from two locations, gathered around the Cross of Christ and around the Eucharist. Feedback on Facebook and from the Parish Council has been fairly positive, and so this logo has been sent to graphic designers for use alongside the diocesan crest for signage on the new parish centre buildings. - Fr Jim

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## Sacramental & Children's Ministries Information



#### **Children's Sacramental Journey - Confirmation 2021**

Preparation sessions for Confirmation will commence this weekend. Candidates are required to attend a session once a week with their parent over 4 weeks for the preparation of this sacrament. With physical gatherings restricted at this time, we have modified the programme in order that we may cover all the sessions adequately to prepare the children. There will be four sessions conducted online plus one in-person for practice when we are able to gather. These sessions are on:

- 1. Remember Baptism
- 2. Called by Name
- 3. Life in the Spirit
- 4. Confirmation The Rite

This week, we discuss why each child's baptism story is so important, that it marked the beginning of his/her life as a follower of Jesus and as a member of the church. We show the children the symbols used at their baptism to help them further understand how significant that day was and how it ties in with Confirmation. In the Gospel of Mark, we read The Baptism of Jesus and teach the children the value of silence as prayer.

Next week, we move into Session 2 – Called by Name. We will discuss God's Love for us and what that has to do with our names. The children learn God loves them, that they are unique and precious in the eyes of God. We look at some well-known biblical names that had been called to do God's work, and so teach the children that God also calls us all by name, in the hope that we too will fulfil important works of service for God. In the Gospel of Luke, we read The Call of Mary – The Annunciation, the perfect example for us all to ponder: What is God calling me to do?

The group sessions are family-centred and encourage parent-child interaction with activities to help children explore the key concepts of the sacrament in an age-appropriate and fun way. It has been a challenging 6 weeks for many families juggling family life, work, school, physical and emotional stress taking on a whole new level! We are doing our best to support the children and their families as we journey through this. Please keep us all in your prayers!



# **Spiritual Reflection**

#### Love in the Time of COVID 19

**Passion**- any kind of feeling or emotion, as hope, fear, joy, grief, anger, love, desire, etc.' especially one of compelling force.... A strong or extravagant fondness, enthusiasm, or desire for anything...violent anger.....suffering....an experience of love.

In 1985, Nobel Prize-winning author, Gabriel Garcia Marquez, published a novel entitled, *Love in the Time of Cholera*. It tells a colourful story of how life can still be generative, despite an epidemic.

Well, what's besetting our world right now is not cholera but the *coronavirus*, *Covid 19*. Nothing in my lifetime has ever affected the whole world as radically as this virus. Whole countries have shut down, virtually all schools and colleges have sent their students home and are offering classes online, we're discouraged from going out of our houses and from inviting others into them, and we've been asked not to touch each other and to practice "social distancing". Ordinary, normal, time has stopped. We're in a season that no generation, perhaps since the flu of 1918, has had to undergo Furthermore, we don't foresee an end soon to this situation. No one, neither our government leaders nor our doctors, has an exit strategy. No one knows when this will end or how. Hence, like the inhabitants on *Noah's Ark*, we're locked in and don't know when the floodwaters will recede and let us return to our normal lives.

How should we live in this extraordinary time? Well, I had a private tutorial on this some nine years ago. In the summer of 2011, I was diagnosed with colon cancer, underwent surgery for a resection, and then was subjected to twenty-four weeks of chemotherapy. Facing the uncertainty of what the chemotherapy would be doing to my body I was understandably scared. Moreover, twenty-four weeks is basically half a year and contemplating the length of time that I would be undergoing this "abnormal" season in my life, I was also impatient. I wanted this over with, quickly. So, I faced it like I face most setbacks in my life, stoically, with the attitude: "I'll get through this! I'll endure it!"

I keep what might euphemistically be termed a journal, though it's really more a *Daybook* that simply chronicles what I do each day and who and what enters my life on a given day. Well, when I stoically began my first chemotherapy session, I began checking off days in my journal: *Day one*, followed the next day by *Day two*. I had done the math and knew that it would take 168 days to get through the twelve chemo sessions, spaced two weeks apart. It went on like this for the first seventy days or so, with me checking off a number each day, holding my life and my breath, everything on hold until I could finally write, *Day 168*.

Then one day, about halfway through the twenty-four weeks, I had an awakening. I don't know what specifically triggered it, a grace from above, a gesture of friendship from someone, the feel of the sun on my body, the wonderful feel of a cold drink, perhaps all of these things, but I woke up, I woke up to the fact that I was putting my life on hold, that I wasn't really living but only enduring each day in order check it off and eventually reach that magical  $168^{th}$  day when I could start living again. I realized that I was wasting a season of my life. Moreover, I realized that what I was living through was sometimes rich precisely because of the impact of chemotherapy in my life. That realization remains one of the special graces in my life. My spirits lifted radically even as the chemotherapy continued to do the same brutal things to my body.

I began to welcome each day for its freshness, its richness, for what it brought into my life. I look back on that now and see those three last months (before day 168) as one of the richest seasons of my life. I made some lifelong friends, I learned some lessons in patience that I still try to cling to, and, not least, I learned some long-overdue lessons in gratitude and appreciation, in not taking life, health, friendship, and work for granted. It was a special joy to return to a normal life after those 168 days of conscripted "sabbatical"; but those "sabbatical" days were special too, albeit in a very different way.

The coronavirus has put us all, in effect, on a conscripted sabbatical and it's subjecting those who have contracted it to their own type of chemotherapy. And the danger is that we will put our lives on hold as we go through this extraordinary time and will just endure rather than let ourselves be graced by what lies within this uninvited season.

Yes, there will be frustration and pain in living this through, but that's not incompatible with happiness. Paul Tournier, after he'd lost his wife, did some deep grieving but then integrated that grief into a new life in a way that allowed him to write: "I can truly say that I have a great grief and that I am a happy man." Words to ponder as we struggle with this coronavirus.
