SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear sisters and brothers,

At various stages of the emergence of the novum coronavirus, COVID-19, Bishop Anthony has offered instructions for our Diocese on preventative measures appropriate to any situation of concern about public health. He maintains vigilance on the current situation and is continuously receiving what might be appropriate for the gatherings of the Faithful in the Diocese of Broken Bay.

Now with confirmed cases of human to human transmissions in the greater Sydney area, Bishop Anthony has reviewed the instructions that he provided previously and now provides additional instruction proportionate to the current understanding of the coronavirus and the risks outlined by health authorities. In summarising the previous instruction that parishes continue not to distribute Holy Communion from the Chalice remains in place. All Ministers of Communion should take particular care to wash their hands before and after distributing Communion. Holy Water is to be temporarily removed from the stoups at the doors of churches to reduce the possibility of transmission of the virus. We have removed the Holy Water as is our custom during Lent in preparation for the blessing of the Easter Water at the Easter Vigil.

Perhaps the main change to the instruction that during the Sign of Peace individuals should avoid shaking hands but say "Peace be with "and offer a smile, wave, nod or bow. Finally, the faithful who are too unwell to attend Sunday Mass whether due to the coronavirus or some other condition - or are at particular risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus can honour their Sunday obligation by participating in a time of prayer within the home, reading the Scriptures or watching Mass on television.

Should the situation change, Bishop Anthony will further review these instructions.

Finally, I would like to invite you all to consider participating in the next step of 'listening and discerning' as we prepare for the Plenary Council.

Unlike the previous sessions, this next step is meant to focus on a prayerful reflective process focused on a deep listening to what God is calling us to at this particular time in the history of our church. It is not about simply saying what I think or believe but entering into a structured way of listening through reason, Scriptures, faith, prayerful reflection and interaction with other parishioners, to give up our "answers" to become sincere seekers of God's wisdom.

Promoting Alpha week 2 Why did Jesus die?

Is Christianity in decline in Australia?

The research shows there is real interest in Christianity, but there are few opportunities to have spiritual conversations. 7 out of 10 Australians pray. But they don't talk about it. There is interest in spirituality. We are obsessed with mental health and physical health, so it is ok then to ask about spiritual health. Do you have questions about God, life and faith? Alpha is an opportunity to have those conversations.

Alpha is about community. You are invited to have dinner and connect with people with different views to yours, but we have good dinner party conversations. Alpha is a bit like a communal table at a café, except were actually talking to each other. You're surrounded by people and you're connecting around mutual discussion topics. The videos give a basis for that conversation. While some people have blockages to organised religion, they are interested in knowing spiritual things. Alpha is a place to talk about these things.

Alpha works primarily on invitation.

People invite their friends and after coming along one week, they might say, Who is Jesus? I haven't had time to talk about that.

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Reflection on Sunday's Gospel—Brilliant Suffering

Last week we saw Jesus being tempted just like the rest of us. We recognized our humanity. This week we see him transformed into dazzling light. Not so human. What is going on? Is he trying to teach us something?

To try for an answer, I want to describe a possible prayer experience.*

The Transfiguration was one way for Jesus to reassure us and them that agony would not negate his divinity

Please imagine yourself sad and discouraged, wishing God would help you. You want the faith that used to be yours ... but you do not find it. You go along in your normal patterns. But suppose that all at once you find yourself moved and attracted to God in a way you cannot doubt, a way that is "beyond you but within you." Afterwards you cannot really doubt that it was from God, even though you don't really understand it.

This would be an important moment, wouldn't it, a brief transformation of your experience of God, a reshaping of it. Call it a "transfiguration."

Now apply such an understanding of "transfiguration" to Jesus in Sunday's Gospel. The apostles suddenly behold Jesus with his divinity shining forth (like a "glorified body"). It goes through their usual filters. Their experience of Jesus is being, precisely, transfigured. For a moment they see Jesus in the complete union with God that he is.

Notice, we are talking about the complete union with God "that he is," not that he "has." In Jesus, divinity and humanity are at one with each other. Daily onlookers see only the human, but in this case Jesus is showing the apostles his whole self: divinity in its complete oneness with humanity.

Why would Jesus make such a revelation to them?

Again, the answer might be found in the Ignatian prayer we are imagining. In such a prayer God can give us a brief vision of how things really are at their root. Sometimes it would be to keep us from getting discouraged, or to avoid letting our attention drift away. Couldn't this be the case with the transfiguration as well?

Couldn't Jesus have seen one of his jobs as training the apostles—throughout the entire Gospel and in particular in this scene—as just one stage of the instruction?

Let us assume this to be the case.

Jesus would have taught them about himself, gradually, all through Matthew's Gospel. He was a superb teacher. Just before Sunday's passage in Matthew, he had finally told them what a real Messiah is. He said that the "Son of the living God must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised" (Mt 16:13-23).

A major revelation, one he had thought they were at last prepared for. If you remember, however, Peter had objected vehemently, when he took Jesus aside "and began to rebuke him, 'God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you.'" Jesus went so far as to call Peter "Satan" for resisting the new revelation. Suffering and death are not foreign to Jesus, the Messiah. They are of the essence. Such a hard lesson this is for each of us. Suffering, death and resurrection are at the heart of love!

I suppose the Transfiguration was one way for Jesus to reassure us and them that agony would not negate his divinity, it would fulfill it. It would be God's love shining forth.

... an occasion when God our Lord moves and attracts the will in such a way that a devout person, without doubting or being able to doubt, carries out what was proposed. This is what St. Paul and St. Matthew did when they followed Christ our Lord.

Children's Sacramental Journey First Reconciliation 2020

This weekend, the children who are preparing for their First Reconciliation will receive a copy of the Act of Contrition during all Masses. The Act of Contrition which we explain to the children as a "Sorry" prayer, comes with it a recogni tion of not just their poor choices, but also the huge effort required to choose to want to try their best to love others and the need to seek help in doing so.

Our third session on Forgiveness offers the children some simple steps they can take to make peace with their family and friends. Firstly, by being honest and owning up to the unloving words and actions that were said and done (Confession), then the importance of recognising the need to seek forgiveness (Act of Contrition) and lastly to do something to show that person and God they want to make peace (Penance).

We lightly touch on helping them understand pride can sometimes be the reason people are unable to say sorry and also forgiveness can sometimes take time. We then link this to the stories we have read on The Loving Father, The Lost Sheep and also to this week's Gospel reading on Zacchaeus, the Tax Collector. All these readings are reminders to the children of God's everlasting love for us, always forgiving and through prayer we learn to love others so as to return God's love, for He created us all and loves us all equally.

Plenary Council Discernment Session next weekend

Fr Noel Connolly a Columban and a member of the Plenary Council 2020 Facilitation Team wrote:

The real question at the heart of our Plenary Council planning process is not "What will we do?" but "What is the Holy Spirit leading us to do?" Unless the Plenary Council processes are Spirit-inspired, they will not be attractive, life-giving or lasting in the end. Pope Francis has reminded us that the church does not grow by proselytising or by argument but by attractiveness. [EG #14] Ultimately, it is only the beauty of God that attracts.

If you read "Listen to what the Spirit is saying", the final report on the Listening and Dialogue stage, you will notice that there are many, varied opinions expressed. We will need patient discernment to grasp the voice of the Holy Spirit among the enthusiastic, strongly held but, sometimes contradictory, voices of the People of God. We will also need humility and generous openness to all. In a debating process, it is easy for us to decide who has the *sensus fidei*, (*sense of the faith*) and who should be listened to. It is the ones we agree with!

Group discernment requires a different process; a commitment to listen attentively and to trust the intentions of others, together with a willingness to share our own experience and insights and let go of our assumptions or biases. We come to God in and with our brothers and sisters, sharing and listening, not debating and correct-

Becoming a Missionary Disciple

Fr Peter outlined in the Bulletin, how we grow with God and with others in our parish community to become Missionary Disciples: We worship, we connect, we serve, we give, and we grow as a disciple.

The readings at Mass reveal who God is to us

Know our story. The first reading reminds us – God called Abram. (God changes his name to Abraham, later in his life.) That invitation was a challenge: **Leave** country, family, father's house. **Go** to a land I will show you. The consequence – I will bless you: make your name so famous. . . That was the covenant or the agreement between Abram and God. All the tribes of the earth shall bless themselves by you. So, **Abram went** as the Lord told him. That man had great trust!

Pray with trust. Could this psalm show us how to pray, how to praise God and increase our trust in God? Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

Life is different for a missionary disciple. Paul tells us we live life with power and purpose and face death with hope of eternal life. Bear the hardships. Rely on the power of God who saved us . . . for his own purpose. This grace has been revealed by Jesus ~ **He abolished death**and **proclaimed life and immortality** through the Good News.

Believe who Jesus really is. Jesus was transfigured. Three apostles saw Jesus for who he was. They heard the voice, *This is my son, the Beloved, he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.*

During this Lent, let us be attentive to where the power of God is guiding us for his own purpose.

When we worship, we hear God speak to us and praise God who comes to us.

Where **we connect** with others in our Antioch Group or Sacramental program we belong as friends of Jesus. When we serve others in all ministries as a Catechist, or carer or parent or active support for your children in our schools, and our ministries at work that go beyond our job description to the heart of compassion, justice and charity. When we give and share our treasure to support our parish activities and maintain our parish facilities, or when we give our talent or our time to the parish community, we store up treasure in heaven.

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
