Word of God Sunday: Sunday January 23rd is Word of God Sunday, a day in which we focus particularly on the Word of God in scripture, just as we focus particularly on the Body of Christ on Corpus Christi Sunday. This weekend we have free individual gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John) for you to take from the back of the church.

Farewell Fr Bogdan: After two years of dedicated service to our parish through the challenging years of lockdowns, Fr Bogdan Skupien will now be leaving us to take up his new appointment as Administrator (Parish Priest) of Holy Cross Parish Kincumber. We will miss his enthusiasm, energy and dedication. We will farewell him at the 10.15am Mass at OLHC on Sunday 23rd and the 9.30am Mass at St Gerard's on Sunday 30th. Please come along, and also please sign the card for him at the back of the church. Please pray for Fr Bogdan in his new ministry.

Online Liturgy of the Word: For many months during last year's lockdown we gathered on Sunday afternoons for an interactive Liturgy of the Word where we would pray, read scripture, share our faith and reflect on our lives. Upon reflection we realized that even when we can come to Mass, it's not always easy, especially for families with young children, so we decided to continue this gathering once a month as a way for people to put a toe in the water as they return to involvement in the church. Now, with many people isolating due to illness, exposure to covid, or out of caution, it is timely that we relaunch this gathering. **Our next special feast day:
Candlemas**

The next feast day we will celebrate in a special way is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas) : on **Wednesday 2nd February** **everyone is invited to bring along a candle to be blessed** (please note that no candles will be provided – please bring along your own candle so that once blessed it can be part of your home prayer space).



Candlemas, coming 40 days after Christmas, celebrates the child Jesus being presented in the Temple and being recognised by Simeon as ‘the light of all peoples’. The blessing of candles before Mass begins and the procession into the church has been part of this feast since medieval times.

Mass (and the blessing of candles) will be celebrated as follows:

- 6:00pm at Our Lady Help of Christians’, Epping**

Antioch Weekend

Antioch is our parish's flagship youth ministry, a group run by young people for young people (aged 16-23). For almost 40 years in our parish Antioch has held a weekend retreat as an entry point for new members, especially focused for those in Years 10-12. The annual weekend is a jam-packed opportunity for new members to come and experience the best of Antioch; bonding with others and connecting with their faith. The Weekend consists of a series of talks presented as personal reflections by the youth. Topics of talks focus on hearing God's call in our everyday life, understanding what it's like to live as a Christian, and how we as young people are advocates for Christ. After hearing each talk, the talk is discussed in share groups, and implications on daily life are reflected on. However, it's not all talk and no action! The weekend is filled with many activities such as competitions and games. Also, let's not forget the copious amounts of delicious food kindly donated by our parishioners! Ultimately, The Antioch Weekend provides an invaluable experience to take time out of the craziness of everyday life and reconnect to your faith. The theme of this year's weekend is 'The Climb' which symbolises our walk with God and each other as we journey the ups and downs of life. So, if you're in Year 10 to aged 23, come along for one of the most exciting and memorable weekends ever!!

The Weekend will be held in February on Saturday 12th (10am to 10pm) and Sunday 13th (10am to 9pm) at St. Gerard's, Carlingford. Considering the covid outbreak there are several safety implementations which will be undertaken. These briefly include participants completing RATs before participation on the weekend, having easy access to disposable masks and hand sanitiser, frequent sanitising of equipment (e.g., chairs, tables etc.) many of the activities previously held indoors we will outside instead and social distancing.

The Church's Economic-Social Teachings

Most of us have been raised to believe that we have right to possess whatever comes to us honestly, either through our own work or through legitimate inheritance. No matter how large that wealth might be, it's ours as long as we didn't cheat anyone along the way. By and large, this belief has been enshrined in the laws of democratic countries and we generally believe that it is morally sanctioned by the Christianity.

Partly this is all true, but it needs a lot of qualification. From scripture, through Jesus, through the social teachings of the churches, through papal encyclicals from Leo XIII through John Paul II, the right to private ownership and private wealth is mitigated by a number of moral principles. Let me list a number of those principles (which are taught with the weight of Ordinary Magisterium within Roman Catholicism and the ecclesial equivalent of that in most Protestant churches). For Roman Catholics, I will list the major references to church documents:

- God intended the earth and everything in it for the sake of all human beings. Thus, in justice, created goods should flow fairly to all. All other rights are subordinated to this principle. (Gaudium et Spes 69; Popularum Progressio 22) We do have a right to private ownership and no one may ever deny us of this right (Rerum Novarum 3-5, 14, Quadregesima Anno 44-56, Mater et Magistra 109) but that right is subordinated to the common good, to the fact that goods are intended for everyone. (Laborem Exercens 14) Wealth and possessions must be understood as ours to steward rather than to possess absolutely. (Rerum Novarum 18-19)
- No person (or nation) may have a surplus if others do not have the basic necessities. (Rerum Novarum 19; Quadregesimo Anno 50-51, Mater et Magistra 119-121 & 157-165; Popularum Progressio 230) Thus, no one may appropriate surplus goods solely for his own private use when others lack the bare necessities for life. (Popularum Progressio 23) People are obliged to come to the relief of the poor and if a person is in extreme necessity he has the right to take from the riches of others what he needs. (Gaudium et Spes 69)
- The present economic situation in the world must be redressed. (Popularum Progressio 6,26,32; Gaudium et Spes 66; Octogesima Adveniens 43; Sollicitudo Rei Socialis 43) Thus the law of supply and demand, free enterprise, competition, the profit motive, and the private ownership of the means of production may not be given complete free reign. They are not absolute rights and are only good within certain limits. (Popularum Progressio 26; Quadregesimo Anno 88, 110)
- In regards to the private ownership of industry and the means of production, two extremes are to be avoided: Unbridled capitalism on the one hand, and complete socialism on the other. (Quadregesimo Anno 46, 55, 111-126)
- Governments must respect the principle of subsidiarity and intervene only when necessary. (Rerum Novarum 28-29; Quadregesimo Anno 79-80; Mater et Magistra 117-152) However when the common good demands it they not only may step in, they are obliged to do so. (Popularum Progressio 24, 33; Mater et Magistra 53; Gaudium et Spes 71) As well certain forms of property should be reserved for the state since they carry with them an opportunity of domination too great to be left to private individuals. (Quadregesimo Anno 114; Mater et Magistra 116)
- Governments may never sacrifice the individual to the collectivity because the individual is prior to civil society and society must be directed towards him or her. (Mater et Magistra 109; Quadregesimo Anno, 26)
- Employers must pay wages which allow the worker to live in a "reasonable and frugal comfort" (Rerum Novarum 34) and wages may not simply be a question of what contract a worker will accept. Conversely, workers may not claim that the produce and profits which are not required to repair and replace invested capital belong by right to them (Quadregesimo Anno 55, 114) and they must negotiate their wages with the common good in mind. (Quadregesimo Anno 119; Mater et Magistra 112) As is the case with the employer, it is not just a question of what kind of contract can be extracted.
- Both the workers and the employers have an equal duty to be concerned for the common good. (Laborem Exercens 20)
- And, the condemnation of injustice is part of the ministry of evangelization and is an integral aspect of the Church's prophetic role. (Sollicitudo Rei Socialis 42)

The church has history on its side in teaching these principles. The failure of Marxism in Eastern Europe highlights precisely that an attempt to create justice for everyone without sufficiently factoring in the place of private profit and private wealth (not to mention God or love) doesn't lead to prosperity and justice, just as our present economic crisis highlights that an unregulated profit motive doesn't lead to prosperity and justice either. There is a middle road, and the Church's social teachings are that road-map.

Supporting the Parish Financially

The First Collection: Money collected from the first collection supports the needs of priests of the parish.

- The priests' monthly salary.
- Upkeep of the presbytery, e.g. food, utilities, cleaner, etc.
- A small percentage to cover the expenses of the Bishop in caring for elderly priests.

Income from other sources includes Easter and Christmas offerings (via envelope contributions made at these times), Wedding and baptism donations are also added into the first collection.

The Second Collection (Parish): Money from the second collection supports the maintenance of the parish buildings and pastoral programs. The parish must work within its own budget and is unable to draw funds for expenses from any source other than its own parish income. Loans for church works are permitted as long as they can be serviced.

Some of the expenses are:

- Parish running costs, e.g. administration, insurance, utilities, general maintenance and upkeep of the church, presbytery and parish property.
- Parish staff salaries including superannuation.
- Priests' car expenses.
- Charitable Works Fund shortfall.

The collection combines income from planned giving envelopes and cash on plates.
