COVIDSafety: As we are starting to see a rise in the number of cases, this is just a gentle reminder we can take steps to protect ourselves and others:

How to plan your funeral: Queen Elizabeth II planned her own funeral to ensure that her funeral would express her faith in the way she wanted. We can also prepare many elements of our own funerals in advance, to take the burden off your family when the time comes. Many of us will also be called upon to plan a funeral for someone we love, sometimes unexpectedly. Join Fr Jim and Ben from Albert & Meyer funerals for an information session on **Monday November 14th at 10am at St Gerard's Church** on how to prepare your funeral. *Note this is now the only session, with no evening session as previously advertised.*

Remembrance Mass for Children who have died:

There is a particular grief which accompanies this loss and deserves tending, even many years afterward.

Violence against Women and Children

This year the Parish Social Justice Team has identified a number of initiatives that we can support and today I would like to share some information about our focus for this last quarter of the year. This focus is on the persecution and suffering which can happen to some women and children within their families.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Social Justice Statement this year, simply titled "Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse" has recognised the need for each of us to not only be aware of this serious issue but to do all we can to support those who experience it. Our existing parish charitable work already supports women who are victims of domestic violence through the work of the St Vincent de Paul Society and the Prison Fellowship and there will be several more opportunities in December for you to support their work again.

This year we are also supporting the Parramatta Women's Shelter and have already made a donation to them to enable the women and children at the shelter to share in a Christmas meal together - to provide some joy and hope in their troubled lives. The Parramatta Women's Shelter is a not-for-profit organisation that opened its doors on Christmas Eve in 2019. It is a community led shelter that has, so far, assisted over 250 women and children who are escaping domestic and family violence and homelessness and seeking new beginnings. OUR PARISH SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS



There are three recent articles in the JRS newsletter which relate to the topics highlighted by the Parish Social Justice Team this year. They are:

1. The concern expressed by Jesuit Social Services together with JRS in relation to the high level of Federal funding for the continued offshore detention and processing of refugees.
2. Concern that the Federal Government is pressuring refugees to accept relocation to a third country in lieu of giving them permanent residence in Australia.
3. The release of a Federal Govt. national policy framework which will guide actions to end violence against women and children.

CATECHIST INSPIRATION - BY EVELINE ISSA

Around this time last year, after attending mass and learning about the genuine need for catechists to spread the word to school students, I considered actually becoming a catechist and helping out. I have to say part of me was secretly hoping that I will be told there were too many volunteers and that I didn't need to join anymore. I mean, I am a pharmacist by profession, not a teacher. We studied science not religion. However, as a pharmacist, I see first hand the importance of preventative treatment.

For example, if one gets diagnosed with high blood pressure, the first step is to lower the salt and try exercise and relaxation techniques before starting out any medications. Same for cholesterol, a change in the diet is usually tried before medication. We now know the importance of starting habits early, for example brushing teeth, applying sunscreen, limiting blue light emissions etc, all steps taught at school to prevent health problems later.

Well, what about our kids' "soul's health"? Their drive and reason to live?

Already every day more adults and children are being diagnosed with depression and anxiety. This number has been steadily increasing. While there are numerous underlying causes for this, prayer and a strong faith have been shown to greatly help improve mental health. Thus, if we miss teaching our kids early about God, love, faith and hope, how do we know that they will actually one day decide to investigate and join a faith? What if by the time they are 18 they have already decided not to believe because no one had actually spoken to them about religion?

As a mum myself, I know I want my children to know there is light at the end of the tunnel, that we are but travellers here and that in itself makes us stronger because with God by our side who should we fear?

Our faith teaches us to be resilient, hopeful, loving, kind and forgiving (all easier said than done); it encourages us to persevere, to give, to be better people- all attributes that lead to better health and personal satisfaction. By introducing our students to our faith we are giving them the choice to believe and to lead more fulfilling lives. As the saying goes, one hand doesn't clap by itself. We need to all join together and help our kids to get acquainted with our faith.

The diocese provides guidance every step of the way, the classes are organised, the students are keen to listen, I would encourage any parishioner with flexible working hours to consider becoming a catechist. It could just be the preventative "Hope" medicine our kids need!
