

Perhaps you have been attending the Mass for a few thousand times or even just a handful of times, do you really understand the meaning behind all that we are doing?





#### **OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS UPDATE**

Revamping the Lighting at OLHC Church: Upon recognizing the recurring issues with the halogen light globes failing individually throughout the Church, coupled with the considerable expense involved in using a scissor lift to replace these globes, we seized the opportunity to transition to more energy-efficient LED lights. The graph (next page) illustrates a payback period slightly exceeding 2 years, attributed to the reduced energy consumption, and extended 10-year lifespan of LEDs. This transition aligns with our commitment to environmental stewardship and resonates with the principles of our Catholic Social teachings, while also delivering substantial cost savings for the Parish. Recognizing the pivotal role of adequate lighting, we introduced a trial light and assessed its luminance using a light meter to ensure an elevated level of brightness. We express our gratitude for your understanding and patience throughout this transformative process.



**OLHC Development:** Many people are expressing interest in the 29 story retirement living tower which is now being built behind OLHC Church. This will not be owned or managed by the parish, but but by the developer, Levande (formerly Stockland) The Tower has been formally named as "The Cambridge by Levande". Women in Ministry: The only person listed as a deacon in the bible is a woman, St Phoebe (Romans 16:1). The historical facts of women deacons are well known. They ministered in different ways in different places during differing eras.

In 2016, the International Union of Superiors General asked Pope Francis why, given that so many women were already performing diaconal ministry, women could not be ordained as deacons today. Since then, two commissions presented private reports to the pope. The Instrumentum Laboris for the Synod on Synodality reports: "Most of the Continental Assemblies and the syntheses of several Episcopal Conferences call for the question of women's inclusion in the diaconate to be considered. Is it possible to envisage this, and in what way?" What are the arguments for and against women ordained as deacons? What will happen in October?"

Communion from the Chalice: The limiting of the communion chalice to the people in the time of the COVID pandemic was for pastoral reasons. Although most of us live as though the pandemic is over, it continues to cause sickness and death for significant numbers of people. The Bishops of NSW have prayed about and discussed this situation, and we have taken the decision to delay the common use of the communion chalice, for pastoral reasons.

In the meantime, as a community of believers, we can take heart in the joy of knowing and believing that to receive communion is to receive Christ himself who has offered himself for us. And as the Catechism reminds us "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace." It is important for us to remember that while the communion chalice is currently limited, the fullness of communion in Christ's Body and Blood is enjoyed in the consecrated species of bread alone.


The bishops of NSW are keeping vigilant on this most important issue, so please be assured that when possible. the common communion chalice will be restored.




