

Stations of the Cross at St Gerard's: In the early Christian centuries devout Catholics would make their way to Jerusalem to retrace the steps which Jesus took on the way to his crucifixion. This became known as The Way of the Cross. When in the Middle Ages this became too difficult and too dangerous, the custom arose of


having representation of the various steps or stations which Jesus took depicted in or around churches, popularised by St Francis, and these became known as the Stations of the Cross. By the 18th century all churches were encouraged to have stations erected.

Most churches, including OLHC have the stations evenly spaced around the walls of the church so that people can make a procession around the church to pray with Jesus in his passion. At St Gerard's, however, the stations are grouped together in two small locations either side of the sanctuary which precludes them being used in the traditional way.

At a recent parish forum on April 10th and again at the May 4th pastoral council meeting there was agreement that it would be good move the stations around the body of the church so that they become an effective aid to prayer. To do this would require the removal of the large painted mural sections which are presently around the church. These murals were originally commissioned in 1975 and were painted by Brigidine sister Sr M. Joy Reynolds. They were a form of the stations of the cross, though quite different to either the traditional stations or the more recent Pope John Paul II scriptural stations, and were a mix of pictures and scripture quotes. They were centred around a large central mural of the Last Supper which was on the sanctuary but which has since been removed.

There seems to be a fairly widespread opinion that these paintings, though popular in their time in the 1970s have lost their aesthetic appeal and are not an aid to prayer, and could now be removed. If so, they would be carefully photographed and some smaller representation of them would be kept in the church as part of its history. However, as this would be a significant change to the interior of the church, *I invite* any comments for or against this proposal in the coming month up until June 15th. Such a change would also require the permission of the bishop.

Another item for consideration is the addition of an image of Divine Mercy to each church. Two images have been offered by parishioners and are displayed temporarily for comment. Would it be good to have an image displayed, if so, this image or another version, and, where in each church would it best fit? **Fr Jim**

PASTORAL WORKS FUND COLLECTION - MESSAGE FROM FR JIM MCKEON

I'd like to invite you to take a moment to support our **May appeal for Pastoral Works Broken Bay**, which is the pastoral charity of the Catholic community of Broken Bay. The Pastoral Works collection supports Catholic chaplains in public hospitals (including Fr Peter Dowd), and the resourcing of our catechists for their ministry of evangelisation and catechesis in state schools.



The diocese levies each parish to ensure that these important ministries can continue, and in 2021-22 our parish levy is \$56,000. We have so far raised \$11,000, which leaves us with **\$45,000 to raise** by the end of this financial year. We usually spread this appeal over three collections each year, but our shortfall is due to lockdown and church restrictions last year.

This \$45,000 averaged out across our 900 or so active parishioners is **\$50 per person**, and while some people can't afford to give, we know that many people are generous and have the means to give more to cover others.

The good news is that donations are fully tax deductible and a receipt can be offered before the end of the financial year. We'll take up this collection on **Sunday May 15th**, but you can also donate now at www.bbcatholic.org.au/pastoralworks or scan the QR code above.

From Lynn's Desk



Parents of the candidates gathered online last week on Tuesday and Thursday evening. Fr Jim and Fr Vincent were present to pray with the families. Fr Jim led us in a reflection so sublime that I was unable to draw my thoughts away from for days.

He asked us to imagine that we had only 24 hours left to live, not that the world was ending but that we would be leaving behind everything in 24 hours when our lives ended: what would we do in that final 24 hours that we had left? Parents typed in their responses in the chat, some very detailed such as "wine and dine with my loved ones, definitely laughter accompanied by lots of Thai and Chinese food", or

watching the sunset with my family", or "squeeze in Confession somewhere, then spend the day with my family", etc. Fr Jim noted that in all the years he had asked people this question, everyone's answers no matter how different, would invariably be ultimately to spend time with family and loved ones.

The next question was: how did Jesus spend his last 24 hours? So many thoughts raced through my head and in a short few seconds I was lost in my own emotions. It took me days to unpack my thoughts. The evening being a First Eucharist parent gathering, the focus was naturally on Jesus' sacrifice for us and his institution of the sacrament of the Eucharist, the source and summit of the Christian life. It did not start or end there for me though. Being a convert to the Catholic faith, I have had a number of St Thomas' "my Lord and my God" moments and the reflection on Jesus' last 24 hours was another one of those moments for me. We all want to spend our last 24 hours with our families...... oh my Lord and my God, how much more do you love us, that I haven't yet felt and realised? Who did Jesus spend his last 24 hours with? Whether they were his beloved friends and disciples or his enemies, they were all his family; he gave away everything he had, even his mum whom we now call our Mother Mary, he gave it all for his "family"..... us. Not that we didn't already know that, but to feel it with a clenched heart and tears in my eyes, is a different story. It isn't everyday that you get to experience something like this, as though you were there. Because of Jesus, we will never really be alone in our last 24 hours. We are all his family.

As this weekend of the 15th May is the Rite of Enrolment for the children embarking on their First Eucharist journey, may I ask you, dear parishioners, who are also these children's "family", to please pray for them? I have left some plain paper and pen on the First Eucharist board in the church. Please take a moment if you wish, to write a prayer for the children and stick it on or around the board with the blu tac provided.

Children's Liturgy AKA Kidz Word on Mother's Day gave all Mothers a lovely surprise! A huge thank-you to Belinda and Toby who came up with such a creative way to talk about Jesus Our Shepherd and our mothers, followed by a beautiful quick craft of "flowers in a pot", using origami, paddle pop sticks, sticky tape, a paper cup and some soft tissue! Mothers were pleasantly surprised to be presented with their unexpected "pot of flowers" by their children when they returned to church in time for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.




