Easter is the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus, which is the central event of human history. Join us for the three liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter at both churches:

 Holy Thursday March 28th **7.30pm** (no morning Mass)

10am Good Friday Stations Good Friday Passion 3pm

 Easter Vigil 7pm

These are long and solemn services which are important for adults, but not so suitable for very young children. The more family-friendly service will be the Good Friday Stations at 10am at St Gerard's which will again be an outdoor procession, starting at the hall and making our way up to the church.

We also celebrate the Office of Readings, a short, stark service of psalms and reflection on Holy Saturday 10am at St Gerard's. Please note there is no 8am morning Mass at OLHC on Holy Saturday.

Easter Sunday follows the usual Sunday times, except, there will be no 5pm Sunday night Mass at St Gerard's on March 31st:

Palms for Palm Sunday: Once again we are relying on your generosity to provide palms for the parish to use on Palm Sunday March 24th. Palm Sunday Procession: Every year we have a procession with palms and singing with our ecumenical covenant churches. We'll walk together to OLHC in time for 10.15am Mass, or you can continue down Oxford St to conclude at Epping Uniting Church.



The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 7.30pm on Tuesday, 26 March at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara. The priests of our Diocese gather for this celebration with Bishop Anthony Randazzo to renew their priestly commitment. During Mass, the oils of Catechumens and the Sick are blessed, and the Chrism is consecrated and then taken back to each parish for use in various Sacramental liturgies throughout the year. All parishioners are warmly invited to attend this sacred occasion in the life of our Diocese.

SAINTS AMONGST US

PRIVILEGE AND GENEROSITY:

Is visiting the housebound and bringing them Communion a chore? According to our current parish team, it is NOT! At our coffee gathering this week, I lost count of how many times each of them used the word PRIVILEGE to describe their ministry. The word I would use is generosity... taking time out of their busy lives to drop in for a chat, a prayer, a cup of tea (sometimes in the fancy fine bone china), perhaps the Gospel reading of the day.

Most of the team "fell into" this ministry when a friend or acquaintance

requested communion but all have stuck with it. Why? They cite the extraordinary relationship that evolves (sometimes over decades) because Jesus is the initial reason for their meeting and because there is more than just a social connection, there is a spiritual one. "I tell you things that I don't tell anybody else, not even my family". Listening to others' deepest regrets or heaviest grief may seem confronting to me but to our team, that too is a privilege.

Our ministers come home bearing the Holy Spirit's gifts of love, peace, joy but sometimes physical gifts (some more unusual than others 😊): delicate napery embroidered with heart, lemons from the backyard and a showering of gratitude and blessings. Without even thinking of it as generous, our ministers also give: a Christmas card that gets stuck in the letterbox, a precious olive wood cross from Bethlehem that gives comfort at the time of death, help with ironing and sorting of paper messes...

Is this really a privilege? They are adamant: "We see others' faith at the end of their lives. It builds our own faith".



Saint John Paul II's Church of Proclamation:

All the baptised were called to the task of evangelisation, which required every baptised Catholic to develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord and Savoir and to commit themselves to being instruments by which others came to know Christ. Evangelisation belongs to the entire Church, not just to religious professionals in the clergy and consecrated life.

The scope of evangelisation is global: it involved deepening the faith where the Church was strong, the re-evangelisation of those parts of an older Christendom that had become lax in their belief, piety and witness; the first evangelisation of places where the Gospel had never been successfully planted, and Christian witness in the worlds of economics, culture, politics, and the mass media.




