- Do we need to update your contact details?






GROW

SERVE

Social Justice Team: Social Justice is an intrinsic part of being a disciple of Jesus. Jesus himself challenged his first followers to live differently (those with two coats must share with the person who has none), and every Pope in the last century has written extensively on the need to create a more just society. Here in our parish we want to create opportunities for our community to learn about, pray about, and do something about specific issues of social justice. Our new Parish Social Justice Team has discerned three areas on which we will focus this year:

- 1. support of refugees and advocacy for asylum seekers,
- 2. care for the environment, and
- 3. support of women and children at risk of violence.

We're looking for people with a passion for these areas to join us in developing practical and prayerful responses in which the whole parish can take part.

Helping refugees: All the world is watching the tragic events in Ukraine which have already led to more than 3 million people fleeing their homes. We might feel powerless to help them on the other side of the world. But there are already refugees from many nations already among us here in Australia, and many more who are seeking asylum. We can help these people here and now.

Our Parish Social Justice Team has identified support of refugees and asylum seekers as our priority for the next three months. We invite you to join us at a Community Conversation at which we'll hear the human story of a refugee and discern our response to the issues he raises. Part of our response will be to see what practical measures of support we can engage with, including food donations through Jesuit Refugee Services who support newly arrived people who are struggling to settle into Australia.


Scripture in our State Schools: If your child attends one of the 9 state schools in our parish, then they have the opportunity to receive weekly Special Religious Education (SRE lessons) from our volunteer catechists who go to the schools to teach an authorised Catholic religion curriculum to students. It is an opt-in system, so parents need to notify the school of this request. Ask your child if they are presently being taught SRE which is often just called "Scripture" in the schools.

We are grateful to our many volunteer catechists who do this important ministry, and we are always in need of new members to the team. Pope Francis recently wrote "Worthy of praise too is that army of catechists, both men and women, to whom missionary work among the nations is so indebted, who imbued with an apostolic spirit make an outstanding and absolutely necessary contribution to the spread of the faith and the Church by their great work. In our days, when there are so few clerics to evangelize such great multitudes and to carry out the pastoral ministry, the role of catechists is of the highest importance".

We are much in need of experienced and new catechists in both primary and secondary schools to join the ministry to continue with the mission of taking the Gospel to the children.


