The Season of Creation: In this week's gospel Jesus makes the challenging statement that "You cannot be the slave of both God and money" (Luke 16:13). We might easily dismiss the idea that we are slaves to money. But in Laudato Si' Pope Francis points out how we have all become subtly immersed in a model of economic growth in which



we always demand that wages, profits, GDP and standards of living will always go up, to the detriment of ourselves and the created world.

Pope Francis writes "This has made it easy to accept the idea of infinite or unlimited growth, which proves so attractive to economists, financiers and experts in technology. It is based on the lie that there is an infinite supply of the earth's goods, and this leads to the planet being squeezed dry beyond every limit." (LS 106)

and "The technocratic paradigm also tends to dominate economic and political life. The economy accepts every advance in technology with a view to profit, without concern for its potentially negative impact on human beings. Finance overwhelms the real economy. The lessons of the global financial crisis have not been assimilated, and we are learning all too slowly the lessons of environmental deterioration. Some circles maintain that current economics and technology will solve all environmental problems, and argue, in popular and non-technical terms, that the problems of global hunger and poverty will be resolved simply by market growth..... We fail to see the deepest roots of our present failures, which have to do with the direction, goals, meaning and social implications of technological and economic growth." (LS 109).


Covid safety: With spring arriving with warmer weather we now have the opportunity to open the doors and windows of our churches during Mass. We know that improving ventilation is a good mitigation measure against the spread of any virus. If a window is open and you find it too cold, please don't close it, but move to another seat, perhaps closer to the centre of the church where it is likely to be less breezy. From the beginning of the pandemic until now we have maintained the practice of having the priests and Communion ministers wear a mask when giving Communion. We think that with the winter peak of both flu and covid passing we can now discontinue this practice, knowing that individuals who wish to will continue to wear their own mask at Mass and whilst receiving Communion. Priests and Communion ministers will continue to use hand sanitiser before distributing Communion.

ST GERARD'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

long-time parishioner, Gordon Floyd writes.....

Margaret and I were married on 5th February 1955 at Saint Thomas' Lewishman. We set up our first home in a flat at Ashfield where we resided for four years. We purchased our first house in Dent Street Epping in March 1959. This house was located in the parish of OLHC Epping. The Parish Priest was Fr Heffernan, who within a week of us moving into our new dwelling, visited us and arranged for a parish member, John Dwyer, to visit and introduce us to the Parish.

At the time of our introduction to the area there were other housing developments proceeding in the area and there were many young families settling in the area. Parish boundaries were developed more clearly and in anticipation of further development in the area. The Parish of Dundas had an officially defined boundary with the Carlingford and North Rocks area and were considered logical inclusions in that parish. By this time Fr Robert Nolan was the Parish Priest of the Dundas Parish and included a portion of the old radio transmission facilities at Carlingford.



It was at this stage that Fr Nolan could see the need for development of a church facility to serve the developing needs of the growing community. The current site, which included the old radio transmission facilities, was purchased in 1961. At this time the area was being rapidly developed for housing and the associated increase in population and the need for a school and church facilities was quickly recognised by Fr Nolan. He could see the potential to use the buildings on the site, subject to a little work, as a Mass centre. It was a lot of work! As the finances of the Parish were limited, costs would have to be limited. A review of the project was made by a group of parishioners with appropriate experience, who agreed that the project was practical. The group was: Norm Brampton - plumber, John O'Rielly - plumber, Bill Byrnes - builder, and Gordon Floyd - engineer.

Subsequently a meeting was arranged at our home to put the proposal to members of the Parish from the area. Following a very positive response the men of the Parish worked in "working bees" on the weekends for about six months to make the place presentable as a Mass Centre. The ladies of the Parish soon joined the men to expedite the project.

At this point in time there were some new parish churches being built, with some church fittings and furniture becoming redundant we were only too glad to use it. The windows came from The Entrance and seats from Manly, Rockdale, Pymble and The Entrance. By May 1962 the building was sufficiently transformed ready for use as a Mass Centre with the first Mass held on 13th May 1962 by Fr Nolan. It was surprising how well the voluntary labour took to the various work undertaken under guidance of those with trade skills. I was in charge of 'divine guidance'. Working bees continued through 1962 to complete the work.

Fr Nolan saw the need for a new Parish Centre in the Carlingford area and by March 1963 the new parish was decreed. A new parish necessitated the need for facilities in the way of a school and presbytery for a start. These were built during the 1960s with mainly voluntary labour.

Plans for the current church were drawn up in 1970 and put on display in January 1971. Work commenced on 2nd August 1971 with hopes of completion by December that year. As money was tight the church is a simple low cost design maximising capacity, excellent natural light and cross ventilation, excellent sight lines and having the wonderful courtyard that provides the opportunity to mingle after Mass. There were a few complications building the church including concreters' strike and Fr Nolan suffered a severe stroke. The church was completed early 1972 and blessed and opened on 9th April 1972. A bit quicker than construction nowadays!

After blessing and opening the church, Archbishop Freeman in his speech said "The deep significance of the Church is not the elegant architecture, nor a place for Catholics to meet once in a way, but the religious heart of the community, a focal point of unity and inspiration. All people in the Parish are to consider themselves akin to the rest of the Church and should be united in their willingness to help each other. The spirit of practice begins with the people themselves - a friendly greeting, a wish to stay and talk after mass, the taking of an interest in parish activities. Many people have a natural diffidence but this can be overcome in a spirit of humility and with humility grows a spirit of charity". Very appropriate still today.

One of the features of the Parish in the early days was the willingness of everyone to work together and the sense of cooperation in building the Parish which continues to this today. We can all be proud of this and long may it continue. ~ Gordon Floyd

RCIA - JESUS' BIG ASK (CONTINUED) . . . BY DENNIS PORTEOUS

In this second article we will consider how we can further live out our baptismal commitment with a renewed invitation to become more actively involved in the life of our parish community.

In the final article will consider how we can be actively involved as the initiating community we are called to be.

Living as disciples of Jesus, we are called to live as a community – the whole nature of Christian living assumes community: St Paul spoke of the Christian community being "the body of Christ". A Christian cannot live in isolation.

The first and primary aspect of this is the community at prayer – coming together in worship and praise of God as one – the body of believers. As Catholics, this is seen in the celebration of Mass – for Catholics, "the source and summit of the Christian life". We are called to "fully participate" in the celebration of this liturgical act of worship. We do this through our presence, our responses, our singing and our relationship with one another in the celebration.

Within the Mass there are several ministries that help to ensure the spirit, atmosphere and prayerfulness of the time of worship, carried out by members of the parish community – ministries to which all are invited: musicians and singers (cantors and choirs), projectionists, readers (lectors), adult and junior servers, Kidz Word, greeters/welcomers and morning tea organisers are among these ministries. Behind the scenes there are also ministries involved with liturgical celebrations: the Altar Society (who decorate the sanctuary area) and the sacristans (who prepare the missals and materials required for the celebrations).

The final proclamation made at the end of the Mass takes the form of a mission statement – and may take the form: "Go forth, the Mass is ended.", "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." All these have essentially the same purpose – to proclaim Christ by the way we live our lives, as that old song goes: "They'll know we are Christians by our love".

How can we do this?

Firstly, simply by the way that we live – people seeing Christians, should see something different – we should stand out by the way we care for one another and others in need.

Secondly, within the parish there are ministries service of various kind: those that offer support to those in need (the St Vincent de Paul Society), religious education to State School children (Catechists/SRE teachers), visitation to the sick and elderly (and taking Holy Communion to them) and others.

Thirdly, there are opportunities that the parish provides to assist parishioners grow in their faith. Among these are: Rosary Groups, Bible Study Groups, Men of St Joseph and Youth Groups (CANA (for 12-15 years old), ANTIOCH (for 16-23 years old) and EMMAUS (for 23-30 years old) and Dad's Club.

Fourthly, the provision of adult education opportunities at various times throughout the year. Some past examples are ALPHA, "Unlocking the Mysteries of the Bible", "Wild Goose".

Fifthly, often there are opportunities to become active in the various initiatives through the parish fortnightly bulletin – examples are JRS (Refugee support), Social Justice and responding to environmental issues. It is always a good practice to read the parish bulletin to see what is happening in the parish and opportunities to be involved.

Do you want to respond to Jesus' big ask and become more involved in the life of the parish?

I have mentioned several ministries that are active in the parish – we have a sheet at the back of our churches that identify these (and other) opportunities of involvement. If you are interested, complete the details and return it to the Parish Office.
