**Ash Wednesday** is *February 22nd*. Come and mark the beginning of this season if you can, with Masses at the following:

- · 7am and 5pm at OLHC, and
- 9.30am and 6pm at St Gerard's.
- The schools will also have their own liturgies.



**Doing Lent:** The season of Lent offers us an invitation. In response to our society's over-indulgence there are various movements which now encourage some form of abstinence such as Dry July, Meat Free Monday and International Buy Nothing Day. These are all good for our health and for the environment, but Lent asks us to do something more: To fast with a spiritual intention, that restraining our desire for external enjoyment might focus us inwardly towards our own soul, and to meet Jesus, who fasted in the desert, there. Or some voluntary self-denial might help us to stand in solidarity with those who suffer involuntarily throughout the world. Choose a form of fasting that is right for you.

**Fasting** is only one part of Lenten practice. The other two disciplines of Lent are **prayer** and **almsgiving**, and we'd like to offer you some ways to do these:

- Spend time in quiet adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at OLHC on Wednesdays 5.30-pm 6.30pm (following 5pm Mass)
- Join with our local Christian Churches each Tuesday night of March at 7.45pm for our ecumenical liturgies (details below) or for the World Day of Prayer on March 1st
- Join a small group to listen to, discuss and pray with the scriptures (details below)

**Almsgiving:** As always, we will be supporting Caritas Australia's Project Compassion, with this year's theme being For All Future Generations. You can pick up a money box or a set of donation envelopes from the church on Sunday Feb 19th or Ash Wednesday. You can also go direct to **lent.caritas.org.au**





#### SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME & CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES



FIRST RECONCILIATION 2023

Preparation sessions for First Reconciliation will begin this weekend. Candidates are required to attend a session once a week with their parent over 4 weeks for preparation of this sacrament. The four sessions are on:

- 1. God's Love
- 2. Choices
- 3. Forgiveness
- 4. My First Reconciliation

This week, the groups discuss what God's love is. Where do we experience God's love? How do we return that love? This session teaches the children that God is always there, ever loving, ever gentle and unchanging, even when we have turned away. Even so, the children also learn that effort is required on their part; God forgives a contrite heart that leans on Him for strength to do better next time.

In the Gospel of Luke, we read The Loving Father (also known as The Prodigal Son) where the father in the story represents God's unconditional love: what a beautiful gift and source of strength this is in our lives!

We also touch on the Ten Commandments with an exciting account from the bible on how it came about, why we still need them today and that the Commandments represent something very great: how to love God and others.

#### Kidz Word Science Experiment!

Kidz Word kickstarted the year with an engaging session led by **Sabitha and Nilu**. Matthew 5:13 was discussed:

"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot."

Sabitha explained this through a video and how important we were to the world. Like the salt. She showed this by 2 scientific experiments:

- 2 glasses of water. When an egg was put in to the 1st glass the egg sank. Then we added salt to the next glass and dropped the egg in again. It was floating. So water with salt had the "super power" to carry the egg.
- Next, the kids were asked, "Can you balance one egg on top of the other?" A couple of kids tried and failed. But when you add salt to the top of one egg, you can magically balance the other egg on it!

Through these experiments the kids saw how salt was powerful and the leaders related that to us having the same powers as salt, to make a difference in the world.

# Australia Celebrates Pathways to Permanency for Refugees with Temporary Protection; Urges Action on Family Reunion

"JRS Australia welcomes the long-foreshadowed announcement, in line with the Government's 2022 election commitment, creating pathways to permanent residence for refugees who hold or are eligible to hold Temporary Protection Visas (TPVs) and Safe Haven Enterprise Visas (SHEVs).

Under the new arrangements around 19,000 people will be eligible to apply for Resolution of Status Visas, which will provide them with the same entitlements as other permanent residents, including social security payments, higher education loans, access to the NDIS, and the ability to apply for family reunification, and, in the future, for Australian citizenship. JRS Australia lauds these long-overdue measures towards ending a policy which has wrought terrible harm upon refugees for over a decade. We also note the strength and fortitude of these refugees, their ability to overcome daunting odds, and their tireless advocacy that has led to this moment."
