Holy Week & Easter Preparations

Palm Sunday procession: As with previous years, we will be joining our ecumenical covenant churches for a procession on Palm Sunday. Come and join us either after the 8.30am Mass, or before the 10.15am Mass. Gather at St Albans' Anglican Church Pembroke St at 9.45am, then process to OLHC in time for 10.15am Mass, or optionally up to Epping Uniting Church.





The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 7.30pm on Tuesday, 4 April at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara. The priests of our Diocese gather for this celebration with Bishop Anthony Randazzo to renew their priestly commitment. During Mass, the oils of Catechumens and the Sick are

blessed, and the Chrism is consecrated and then taken back to each parish for use in various Sacramental liturgies throughout the year.

While everyone is welcome to every liturgy, it is worth noting that the Lord's Passion at 3pm on Good Friday is a longer and very solemn service, less suitable for young children. Likewise the Easter Vigil is a longer service.

Stations of the Cross at St Gerard's will be an outdoor procession again this year, which we think might be more engaging especially for children who find it hard to sit still. This will go ahead regardless of weather. The church will be open for people with limited mobility who could not stand for 45 minutes or walk 200 meters to pray the Stations privately.

The Easter 8.30am and 9.30am Masses will include children's involvement as usual, and the Sunday evening Masses at both churches will be tailored to teenagers and young adults and their families.

OLHC UPDATES

OLHC Redevelopment: The majority of piling and capping beam works are now complete and Richard Crookes Constructions commenced bulk excavation and installation of ground anchors in mid-February. Bulk excavation will continue throughout March. New temporary toilets have been installed on the southern side of the church. We had requested the builder to assist with installation of air conditioning in OLHC Church this year. They have advised us that this cannot take place as it may trigger undesired building code upgrades to the Church which at present are not part of the scope of works which require ongoing approvals and construction certificates. We will be able to do this installation separately after practical completion of the parish and school buildings next year. OHLC Organ: Many people will have noticed recently that the organ at OLHC is failing due to age, with loud electrical static sounds often occurring after an hour or so of use. We have tried upgrading the electricity supply to the organ with a power conditioner, but this did not solve the problem. The replacement component that we have now identified needed for this type of organ (Ahlborn Galanti) is no longer available. We are exploring what options are available to us.

FIRST RECONCILIATION 2023

We move into our concluding session this week where we examine how sometimes our poor choices of words and actions hurt others, how we are all connected and why hurting others and ourselves also hurts God. We remind the children throughout their preparation that we are created in God's Image and therefore we must always try our best to be as good as Jesus.



PARISH SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS

Social Justice: This month Fr Jim, Mark Smith and Phillip Vassallo from the Parish Social Justice Team, along with members of our parish and our St Vincent de Paul conference joined with 1000 people at an election forum led by the Sydney Alliance and hosted by Bishop Vincent Long.

The forum was attended by Catholics, other Christians, people of other faiths and civil society groups to speak with one voice to NSW Treasurer Matt Kean and Shadow Treasurer Daniel Mookhey about shared issues of justice including affordable housing, rental rights, clean energy and energy costs. Both were asked to commit to a number of issues including ending



"no grounds" evictions which cause instability and distress particularly for low income families.

The treasurer said he couldn't commit to this, but just three days later the NSW Government announced they would commit to replacing 'no grounds' evictions with a set of 'reasonable grounds' for terminating periodic tenancy agreements based on community consultation.



We ask and pray that the gift of the holy spirit be bestowed upon these families as they embark on their journey with God.


