We've had a great couple of weeks in our parish! Children are preparing for their First Reconciliation, the Antioch youth group had their annual retreat, our catechists are returning to teaching in 9 local state high schools, and we are seeing our Sunday Masses return to life as people return from summer holidays and become more confident to gather with people again.

This weekend we launch our new Sunday night Mass at 5pm at St Gerard's. This will be our youth-led Mass, where any one of any age is welcome, but we are inviting our teenagers and young adults to be the leaders in the ministries each week. We'll also have a BBQ afterwards.

Thank you to Maree: We're about to say a big thank you to an extraordinary person in our parish, Maree Balzulat, who is retiring from 18 years as volunteer assistant parish secretary. Maree has quietly and gently done so much of the behind the scenes work of the parish office and sacristy over these years. Come join us in saying thank you to Maree at the 5pm vigil mass at OLHC on Feb 26th, or the 9.30am Mass on Monday Feb 28th at St Gerard's, which will be Maree's last day. Please also sign the card at the back of the church.

Eased restrictions: The NSW Government has announced the easing of some restrictions which are relevant to how we live in the parish. From Friday Feb 18th, singing is permitted in all venues, including churches. QR code check-in is no longer required, however, one QR code will remain up at each church for people who still wish to use this as an aid to where they have been, should contact tracing be necessary. From Feb 25th masks will no longer be mandated, but will still be encouraged. The wearing of masks will be at each person's discretion. The clergy and people giving Communion will continue to wear a mask whilst giving Communion for the time being.

Parish Leadership Day: On Feb 26th the members of our Parish Pastoral Council, our Parish Finance Committee, parish staff and Fr Jim and Fr Vincent will gather for the annual leadership day. This is an opportunity to grow together in a shared vision based on the 5 pillars of discipleship: Connect, Worship, Serve, Give and Grow. Together we will pray to discern what kind of church God is asking us to be in 2022 and beyond, and to develop strategy and implementation around this. Please pray for us. We'll be sharing the fruit of our discernment with the parish in the coming weeks.

Holy old palm leaves: If you have any holy palm leaves you wish to return so we can burn them for Ash Wednesday, please bring them in to either of our churches. Baskets or boxes will be prepared for you to drop them off.

Ash Wednesday: We now begin to look forward to the season of Lent, starting with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. Come and mark the beginning of this season if you can, with Masses at 7am and 6pm at OLHC, and 9.30am and 7pm at St Gerard's. The schools will also have their own liturgies.

The World Day of Prayer is an annual ecumenical gathering which takes place in churches around the world on the first Friday of March. It is an international ecumenical Christian initiative. This year's hosts are Epping Baptist Church, Cnr Carlingford Rd and Ray Rd. Please join us on Friday March 4th at 10am. You are invited to bring a plate to share for morning tea if you can. Hello everyone! As you may be aware we now have a Facilities and Operations Coordinator: yours truly! I am delighted to be of service.

We'd like to encourage you to be our eyes and ears and bring to our attention anything in or around the Church, meeting rooms or precincts that may need repair or be unsafe. Also, we'd like to invite you to let us know any thoughts and ideas you may have for physical improvements.

Security alarm in OLHC Epping: Previously our alarm system at OLHC was incorporated with the school. Due to the redevelopment we have installed a new independent alarm system. We will be contacting the various ministries who may need access to the Sacristy and Sanctuary. If we have not contacted you by 21 February, please email me or call the office on 9876 2853.

Getting to Mass at OLHC: We're really glad that people are finding ways to get to Mass at OLHC despite the lack of onsite parking. People are giving each other lifts, finding street parking, or getting some exercise in and walking to Mass. If you need a lift to Mass however, please contact the parish office on 9876 2853.

The forecourt at OLHC Epping is now somewhat bare, as more of the church surrounds are fenced off, and the new toilets are installed. Some thought is being given to how we might make best use of our limited space, including opportunities for morning tea, seating, and some plants to soften the appearance of the demountable toilets. The beautiful mature tree, although fenced off, will not be removed, so that it will be ready to gather under again when the new buildings are complete.

A significant milestone of OLHC Epping: We have undertaken a lot of activity over the last 6 months to relocate, retain, recycle, reuse and repurpose, and relinquish our Parish assets from our OLHC site -

- We relocated our Parish Office, and at the same time took stock of all the assets in the Old Parish School Building, enabling us to either relocate items to the Parish Office, now at Carlingford, place those excess items for use following the development into storage, or rehome excess items.
- We have relocated the Presbytery Building, with our Pastors living at the Carlingford Presbytery during the development period, and have placed a number of items in storage until the new Presbytery is completed, as well as rehoming those items excess to our need.
- We took the opportunity to take stock and undertake a clean out of the storerooms and under the Church Building, again rehoming and recycling those items that could be.
- In rehoming those items excess to our ongoing need, the Parish Garage Sale during November and December raised just over \$2,000. We were also able to donate a lot of items for use through SVdP, both the Vinnies Shops, as well as our SVdP Conference works.
- We were able to recycle a good amount of the excess electrical goods (cords, old componentry, etc) and metal items through local recycling organisations.
- Once we had achieved emptying the buildings, we were even able to have a number of items removed from the buildings and site and repurposed. This included the rehoming of plants from the site; all the room dividers from the buildings that will be used by the North Epping Men's Shed in the soon to be constructed venue; some doors and door locks, and even; pavers, excess bricks and retaining wall blocks from the site.
- And finally, in the days prior to the hand over of possession, we were able to recycle most of the lighting globes from the buildings, as well as the excess metal grates.

A big thankyou to everyone for the support and assistance as we achieved this Parish milestone, and as we aimed to undertake the task in a way to both recycle as much as was possible as well to reduce our waste.



Online Liturgy of the Word: While many people are now coming back to Mass, we know that for some people, getting to Mass is still difficult, whether that's because of illness, exposure to covid, or out of caution, or because of travelling or

having very young children to care for. We're gathering online on Sunday afternoons once a month for an interactive Liturgy of the Word where we pray, read scripture, share our faith and reflect on our lives. It's also a way for people who don't usually come to Mass to put a toe in the water as they return to involvement in the church. Catechist Commissioning Blessing: The Sunday before Ash Wednesday is traditionally Catechist Sunday in the Diocese and this year will be held on Sunday 27 February 2022. Catechist Sunday is an annual event in the Confraternity Christian Doctrine (CCD) Calendar. Catechist Sunday originated in 1935 when the Vatican published a document 'On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education', which acknowledged the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and asked every country to honour those catechists who serve within their Christian communities.

Our catechists are reaching out to hundreds of students in 9 Public State Schools in our Parish with the commencement of the Special Religious Education (SRE) classes. As they begin another year of ministry, parishioners are invited to stop and think about the dedicated work of these volunteers. There will be a Catechist Commissioning Blessing at Masses on February 26 & 27 at both churches.

Doing Lent: You'll see in both churches the official invitation to <u>Lenten Penance from Bishop Anthony Randazzo</u>. Lent offers us an invitation. In response to our society's over-indulgence there are various movements which now encourage some form of abstinence such as Dry July, Meat Free Monday and International Buy Nothing Day. These are all good for our health and for the environment. But Lent asks us to do something more: To fast with a spiritual intention, that restraining our desire for external enjoyment might focus us inwardly towards our own soul, and to meet Jesus, who fasted in the desert, there. Choose a form of fasting that is right for you.

Fasting is only one part of Lenten practice. The other two disciplines of Lent are prayer and almsgiving, and we'd like to offer you some ways to do these.

- Spend time in quiet adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at OLHC on Mondays 6-7pm, or St Gerard's at the new time of Fridays from 6-7pm. Reconciliation is available during these times.
- Pray the Stations of the Cross, either on your own, or together with us at OLHC on Friday nights at 7pm
- Join with our local Christian Churches each Tuesday night at 7.45pm for our ecumenical liturgies. The first will be at St Alban's Anglican on Tuesday March 8th.
- Join a small group to listen to, discuss and pray with the scriptures. Some of these groups are already booked out Mondays at 10am, Mondays online, Thursdays 7.30pm. THIS FORTNIGHT'S PERSON: FR. VINCENT TRUNG NGUYEN OUR NEW ASSISTANT PRIEST



Last week, Fr Vincent joined me online to meet, greet and pray with parents whose children are enrolled to prepare for their First Reconciliation. When the online gathering concluded, Fr Vincent stayed back to chat about the sacramental programme (or so we both thought!) and we ended up having a great conversation about his background, the challenges he faced coming to Australia and in his ministries. He also seized the opportunity to question me about who I was. Although he said he initially found language a barrier, he continued to plough through and I think he is doing great! Here is what he wrote:

(P/S: I also asked him to answer some silly questions for a laugh!)

Dear brothers and sisters of Epping & Carlingford parish.

I'm Fr Vincent Trung Nguyen. Bishop Anthony has appointed me as the assistant priest to this parish, effective from 1st February 2022. It has been so lovely to see you always welcoming, friendly and very active since I've come here. Therefore, my first word I'd like to say to you all is 'thank you'.

I'm from the South of Vietnam. I discerned my vocation since I was studying in high school, encouraged and supported by my family and people around. After achieving the B.A in IT and working at some stage, I studied philosophy and theology at St Joseph Major Seminary of Xuan Loc Diocese since 2006. After my graduation in 2012, I was sent to the Diocese of Broken Bay according to the Covenant of Ecclesial Communion between the two Dioceses, Broken Bay and Xuan Loc. The first parish was Our Lady of Dolours – Chatswood, where I was a seminarian, ordained as Diaconate on 4th Sep 2013 and appointed as assistant priest to the parish after my Ordination at Hornsby Cathedral over a month later, on 26th Oct 2013, by Bishop David Walker. I, then, was transferred to Hornsby Cathedral by then Bishop Peter Comensoli and had ministered there for 4 years. In April 2020, Bishop Anthony appointed me as the Chaplain to the Royal North Shore Hospital since the first Covid lockdown started, then the assistant to the bishop at the beginning of last year, before sending me to the Central Coast, Kincumber in July. And from there, I was transferred to Epping Carlingford.

I'd like to thank you Fr Jim, Fr Bogdan, who is now Administrator of Kincumber parish, our staff, groups and to you all who are always kind, supportive and actively practising in the community. This absolutely gives me much joy of ministering and being with you over here.

I believe that it's such a blessing of God for our parish, a lovely community with a strong faith. Hope to catch up with you around at our parish pastoral ministries to share and to be shared about our faith of our merciful God, so that we, together 'rejoice in our Lord always' (Phil 4:4).


