Book of Remembrance: The book of remembrance will be placed on or near the altar for each Mass during November. It is at the back of the church for you to add the names of people you love who have died.



Thank you for office volunteers: With Marcella Letteri having now taken up the reigns as secretary it is timely to thank the many volunteers who have assisted in the parish when we have been short staffed over the past year. Thank you to Betty Hillier, Bebette Frez, Juanita Chua, Anne Kilby, Helen Barry, Sandra Di Nardi, Kate Norman and Kate Falzon.

Pastoral Works Fund: On Nov 5th we'll take up our bi-annual Pastoral Works Fund appeal which supports the resourcing of our catechists, the purchase of student workbooks for our children in scripture classes in state schools, and Catholic hospital chaplaincy. All donations are 100% tax deductible. Our levy this year is \$54,000 which works out to be around \$54 for each of our 1000 people at Mass this weekend, though some can't give this much and some of the 1000 people are children. If you're able to give, please do. There will be envelopes at the back of the church next weekend if you'd like to take one following home and bring back the week, to https://brokenbay.goodgiving.com.au/home/brokenbay and make sure to nominate our parish when you donate.

Generosity: We raised a total of \$11,832.95 in the recent Catholic Care Homelessness appeal which is \$3,000 more than we gave last year. This will allow Catholic Care to continue supporting some of the most vulnerable people in our Diocese. Catholic Care has now processed your donations and have issued receipts where requested. Thank you for giving!

PRAY FOR PEACE

Vigil for Peace: As the world watches with sadness at the events unfolding in Israel and Gaza, we remember that there is still unrest and suffering in so many places in our world, including Ukraine, Myanmar, Sudan and Afghanistan.

Last Sunday night we invited our neighbours from our ecumenical covenant churches Epping Uniting and St Alban's Anglican to join us on the forecourt of OLHC to pray for peace. Let us continue to pray for and stand in solidarity with all who suffer.





"May weapons fall silent": Pope Francis has called for *Friday Oct 27th* to be a day of fasting, penance and prayer for peace in the world, especially in Israel and Gaza. "Silence the weapons. Listen to the cry of the poor, the people, the children, for peace," the Pope said.

Both of our churches are open all day, and the 9.30am Mass at St Gerard's will be offered as part of this day. Please find some time on Friday to join with people from around the world in praying for peace. Fasting, even from just one meal is an act of intentionality in prayer, and of solidarity with all those who are going hungry.




DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO IS INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

Ignite Conference Testimonies

Erene: I don't know where to start but to say how wonderful, incredible and privileged I was to attend Ignite with some amazing friends. I have never attended a Catholic event so powerful and so filled with the Holy Spirit. It was God who made me know that there is a purpose why I am here today.

One part that touched me was Adoration. I have never felt closer to God. I looked at the Blessed Sacrament and pictured God in my head as I closed my eyes and felt his presence. During Adoration I heard him talking to me about how I am a wonderful young lady loved by him and I cried with tears of joy.

I also loved singing and praising God with the band Emmanuel Worship. The talks that were given by the speakers were amazing, and one of the talks was how to be a Christian swifty. I really wanted tickets to go to Taylor Swift's concert next year and I managed to get them! In this talk I learned I need to have the same desire of **desperately wanting God** because he is always there to support us through rough and difficult times.

The best part about Ignite were the night rallies as there was a lot of music, dancing, praising God and fun. It felt like a mini version of World Youth Day, with so much joy of making new friends and praising God together in one voice. Before we left Ignite we were told to not go back to our old ways as we now have come closer to God. It's hard to control ourselves from the temptations around us as our fleshly nature wants to listen to the voice of the evil one who is constantly whispering in our ears and feeding us with thoughts against God. Ignite has taught me to have patience, self control and a deeper love for God. As I continue my journey in faith I want to seek the good in this world and I hope and pray that one day I will be united with my Jesus in heaven. Amen!

Sophia: Ignite was a phenomenal and truly transformative experience that inspired myself and my peers! I personally had never attended before but had many friends who told me how life changing it was for them. At Ignite, I got to reunite with many of my friends, some I haven't seen for years.

Honestly I thought it might be a little disappointing after the magnificent experiences from World Youth Day, but I was happily very mistaken! I felt so free after participating in Reconciliation.

I also learnt a lot about my faith. An important takeaway for me is: "God is not just a feeling, faith is a belief". At Ignite, I was extremely excited for Adoration. When I usually go to Adoration, I cry from joy and the closeness of being with God. However, I didn't cry but felt numb during Adoration. I thought maybe it's a lack of faith. The very next day I learnt from one of the priests that he hasn't felt God in the last 10 years but still has faith and works to carry out God's mission and this gave me hope. I also mentioned to someone that I was disappointed not to feel emotional during Adoration and they mentioned the example of Mother Teresa who said "Jesus has a very special love for you. [But] as for me-The silence and the emptiness is so great-that I look and do not see,-Listen and do not hear." Yet she still dedicated her entire life to helping those around her because of her faith saying: "It is not enough to say, 'I love God, but I do not love my neighbor."

The next night after that was the Holy Spirit centred night. There I truly experienced God's presence. I felt free and any despair and doubt washed away for me at that moment. I know that God is real and I truly have to follow God with all my strength and willpower.






