

ST GERARD'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS - 16TH OCTOBER 2022

We aim to reflect and celebrate with past and present parishioners the 50 years life of our parish at St Gerard's, to thank God for blessing and graces on all the families past and present, and to ask God to continue to bless and grow our parish through the intercession of St Gerard. To kickstart this celebration, each fortnight we will feature a parishioner's story and history with our church. This fortnight, long-time parishioner (since 1967!), **Peter Sharp**, writes for us and is pictured below with his family and some fellow parishioners:



It was the parish mothers who proposed the name for St Gerard Majella Church and Carlingford was the first parish dedicated to the Redemptorist Brother Saint, Patron of mothers and family life.

The Church building as it stands today took 22 years to materialise, a journey from Epping parish in 1950, through Rydalmere parish until 1962, then the machinery radio transmission hall and finally opening and Dedication on 9 April,1972. Throughout that long and arduous process, we today need to stop and admire and respect the commitment of our clergy and previous parishioners who worked so diligently to achieve both our Church and School.

Frs Nolan, Spillane and Murphy worked tirelessly to complete the construction until Father Murphy accomplished conclusion of the project. The parish debt on completion of all this was around \$157,000. Interestingly \$90,000 added to the parish bank funded by parishioners during the year 1971 towards the cost. The value of the volunteer effort was enormous.

My wife and I joined St Gerard Majella parish on August 15,1967 when the school was in the third year of operation and Mass was in the transformed hall. Numbers steadily increased during the 1960's and it was obvious the hall was on borrowed time. The new Church plans were publicly displayed in January 1971 and building commenced in August 1971. Our new Church was coming.

The Church and school became a significant part of our family and Catholic life. Our children attended the school from 1972 and our last Grandchild completed schooling at St Gerard's in 2021. Sacramental programs were completed over the years for our children and grandchildren in the Church, marriages proclaimed, all in our local Catholic community dating back so many years. Friendships (both children and parents) initiated in those early days, as with many other parishioners, continue today and are an enduring foundation of support and comfort through the years.

Much effort was invested in establishing this Carlingford community socially with annual dinner dances at Lane Cove Town Hall, picnics at Lane Cove National Park and parishioners running school sports days. The football and netball clubs ran annual dinner dances for many years for the parish and school until the winding up of the football club. There were many volunteer Church groups established, some of which continue today in a different format but with the same underlying objectives accompanied by new additional groups to satisfy changing Church needs and society demands of 2022. All these assets help to establish and continue to grow the St Gerard Catholic community.

The Church has seen many parishioners pass through the doors since 9 April 1972 and it is certain that in the future 50 years, many more will continue to benefit from the efforts of clergy and parishioners, past, present and future, in the Church of St Gerard Majella in the parish of Epping and Carlingford-closing the loop back to 1950.



PARISH SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES & ASYLUM SEEKERS

What does the Bible say about refugees and asylum seekers?

Early in the Old Testament, the respect and care owing to the stranger is established. In the book of Leviticus we find the following exhortation:

When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt. I am the Lord your God.

Leviticus 19:33–34

The law called on citizens to show compassion and solidarity towards the stranger, because they too had been oppressed and exiled. In the New Testament, the subject of this law is found in the person of Christ. In the infancy narrative of Matthew's Gospel the first days of the child's life are characterised by the wise men's adoration of his majesty and, immediately afterwards, the Holy Family's escape from Herod's slaughter.

Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod.

Matthew 2:13-15

This narrative of the flight into Egypt is also a story of the children of Bethlehem who did not escape Herod's wrath. The Gospel account of Matthew refers to how Rachel wept for her children and 'refused to be consoled, because they are no more' (Matt. 3:18).

What does Catholic Social Teaching Say about Refugees and Asylum Seekers? Human dignity

All human beings are precious. Each of us possesses an inestimable value that we refer to as our human dignity. We are sacred and deserve respect because we are human and loved by God, not because we are useful, law-abiding, belong to a particular race and religion, or contribute economically.

We can see this in the Gospel story of Jesus blessing children:



Then little children were being brought to him in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who brought them; but Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs.'

Matthew 9:13-14



Jesus' disciples see the children as obstacles, someone to be kept out of the way. But Jesus sees the children as persons, each loved by God and each with something to teach us. So he welcomes them and blesses each of them. He looks into their faces and sees their innate holiness.

The dignity of each person means that it is never right to use human beings as if they are things means to an end. Jesus' attitude shows that. How can we justify (any) policy that dishonours the human dignity of people who seek protection and denies the truth of their humanity?

Australian Catholic Bishops 2015-16 Social Justice Statement

Let's learn more about Idrissa, a young man who addressed us at our Community Conversation in May:

Idrissa is an advocate, community organiser, former teacher, journalist and is a passionate activist for the rights of women. He moved to Australia in 2018 having fled persecution from his home country, Sierra Leone. He is currently doing a degree in social work after completely his certificate 4 in disability services in 2019. For Refugee Week 2022 Idrissa shares a reflection on what healing means to him:

"Healing for me is a process that makes me happy and gives me a sound sense of belonging. Storytelling is the game changer for my healing power. Sharing my stories to the wider community and to see the way that the average Australian resonates with me makes me feel more welcome. That welcoming spirit heals me a lot and keeps me going strong. The community should support refugees in all aspects: morally, emotionally and spiritually. With support backed with prayers can make things happen."


