



Connect, worship, grow, give and serve: These five actions are the pillars on which our parish plan is built, and are hallmarks of Christian discipleship. This week we are focusing on service, and inviting you to find your way to serve in our parish. Our hope is that every person would be involved in one ministry each as an expression of belonging to the parish community and serving God. On the seat next to you (or attached here as a document) is a volunteer form with a list of all the ministries which have vacancies at present. Simply fill in your details and tick the ministry you'd like to be part of and place the form in the donation boxes in the church, and then a leader from that ministry will reach out to you to invite you to get involved. We have opportunities in practical outreach through St Vincent de Paul and Jesuit Refugee Services. We have opportunities in hospitality through greeting at Mass, serving morning tea or cooking a BBQ. We have opportunities in liturgical ministries of the Word, altar, liturgical environment, audio visuals and music. We have opportunities in teaching children through special religious education at state schools, or children's liturgy during Mass. And there are opportunities behind the scenes in maintenance and administration. Where can you best serve?







Redevelopment at OLHC: This week I wrote to parishioners to give an update on the redevelopment, with the significant milestone of the appointment of Richard Crookes Constructions as builder. Copies of this letter are available in OLHC church and were sent by email on June 21st.

We have been advised by the builder that heavy machinery will now be moving onsite to commence demolition on Monday June 27th. Demolition will take place between 7am and 5pm, Monday to Friday, and this will make the celebration of Mass at this time impractical. Regrettably, from June 27th the 12.15pm Mass on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays will be suspended until further notice.

The suspension of Masses is temporary. While the construction period is for the next 22 months, the demolition period is only for the next three months. Excavation will follow, but after this it may well be that we can again resume weekday Masses once we have a clearer indication of the construction program and the likely levels of noise.

Adoration at 6pm on Monday nights and Mass at 6pm on Wednesday nights will continue as these fall outside of the construction and demolition times, as do weekend Masses. There has been suggestion that we could replace the daytime Masses with evening Masses, however at present the low numbers at Wednesday night Mass suggest there isn't yet demand for this. If the number of people at Wednesday Mass increases significantly we can explore other night time options.

Reconciliation at St Gerard's: During Fr Vincent's leave we won't be able to have reconciliation, adoration and benediction on Friday nights. Starting Friday June 25th we'll have adoration and reconciliation available after Friday morning Mass from 10am – 10.30am, and extended reconciliation time on Saturday evenings from 5.15pm – 5.45pm. Upon Fr Vincent's return he can evaluate with parishioners whether it is preferable to return to Friday nights or to continue with Friday mornings and Saturday evenings.






