Advent has come! In Latin, Advent means "coming", which means we prepare and wait in anticipation for Jesus' coming. To celebrate the beginning of the liturgical year, we have printed some Christmas ornamental cards for the children to collect. Just like the "Faith@Home" prayer cards, we will be inviting the children to come forward during Mass to pick them up from a basket at the

front, over the next 4 Sundays of Advent. Feel free to decorate as you wish, loop a string through the hole and it's ready to hang on your tree or anywhere you like.

SUPPORTING WOMEN AND CHILDREN

Support for Women and Children: Last fortnight we launched our parish's social justice project to support women and children at risk, including from domestic violence. We drew from the teaching of the Australian Catholic Bishops this year <https://socialjustice.catholic.org.au/resources/social-justice-statements/>. This week we want to offer you a resource prepared by our diocese which delves further into Catholic teaching and gives a more detailed reflection on the cycles of violence and the cycle of reconciliation <https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/our-faith/social-justice/domestic-violence>. These invite our practical response in a number of ways:

Envelopes will be available on the seats and at the entrance to the Church then. Escaping domestic violence is a leading cause of homelessness and poverty. 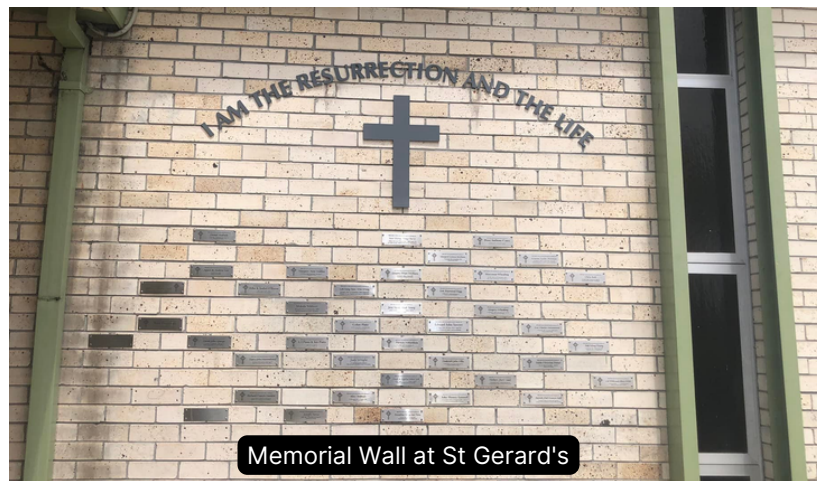
PASTORAL WORKS Broken Bay

Prison Fellowship invites you to **help make a child's Christmas a little brighter**. The children we are supporting have a parent/s serving a goal term, but the children are often the forgotten victims of their parents' crime.

Your commitment will involve purchasing a gift up to \$30 according to their age and whether for a boy or a girl. The gift is from an incarcerated parent who cannot personally buy or deliver the gift to their child.

If you are willing, please collect an "Angel Card" from the Tree which will be in Our Lady Help of Christians Church near the organ next weekend.

Please bring your gift **the following weekend or latest by the 11th December** and lay it under the tree. Do not wrap it. Just bring the angel card and stick it onto the gift.

There will also be a card on the tree asking for a donation if you prefer to do this. This gift will go towards purchasing wrapping paper and gift bag for each family's gifts, a Christmas card for each child, chocolates for the carer.

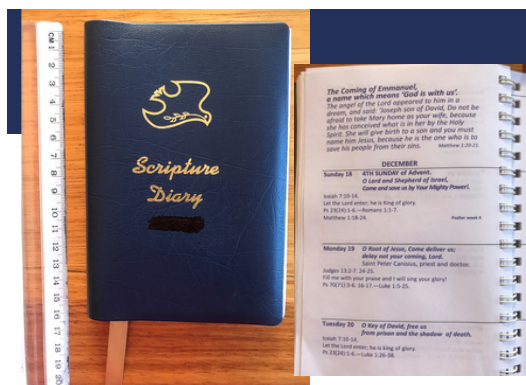

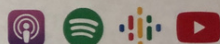

CATECHIST INSPIRATION – BY CHRISTINE JAP

Hi! I'm Christine. For 7 years now, I have had the greatest pleasure of being a catechist/Catholic SRE teacher/scripture teacher. Being an SRE teacher is an extremely rewarding ministry that brings immense joy, and I invite you to consider joining us.

Why should you join our team of catechists?

- **Opportunity to serve God and share God's love.** Each week we look forward to teaching the enthusiastic children who are eager to learn from us about our infinitely loving and merciful God, and about how to walk with Jesus as we go about our day.
- **Opportunity to enrich your faith.** You learn more about our Catholic faith from the teachers' manual and from connecting with the students. Your faith will also be strengthened as you witness the Holy Spirit working through you and your students.
- **Opportunity to make new friends and receive plenty of support from our team.** Collaborate with our friendly and supportive team of catechists from our parish. We have regular meetings to discuss issues and ask for advice. If you are going to be away for a lesson, there's always another catechist to cover for you.
- **Opportunity to have lots of fun.** The students will delightfully surprise you with their questions, comments, and ideas. It is such a joy to nurture the faith of the beautifully unique personalities of God's children in the classroom.
- **We have a big shortage of catechists,** and we can't let these students miss out on their scripture lessons. For many of them, the short half-hour scripture lessons are the only time they are exposed to our Catholic faith. We need YOU to join us in telling them that they are infinitely loved by God.



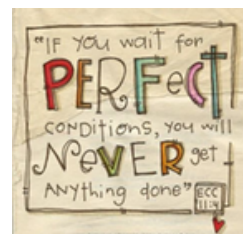
"I am a catechist."

What it involves: For primary schools, the lessons are just half an hour each school week. High school scripture lessons have various times depending on the school e.g. 1 hour each fortnight. You will begin as an assistant helping another SRE teacher, and only if you want, you can transition to being the main SRE teacher. You won't even need to design your own lessons or know everything about our faith because you will receive a teacher's manual containing very detailed lesson plans and background information that corresponds with the student workbooks. You receive plenty of support, and we have plenty of visual resources you can borrow, like posters, big books, and puppets.

As catechists, we are instruments of God, **planting seeds of faith** in the young students. We are praying for them and inspiring them to grow in their personal relationship with God and as disciples of Jesus. Indeed, I am so grateful for the SRE teachers who taught me when I was in school and inspired me to likewise share God's love in the classroom.

If you're thinking "I'm too scared" or "I'm not ready", or "I'm not sure", sign up anyway and give it a go. Ecclesiastes 11:4 **"If you wait for perfect conditions, you will never get anything done."** So come and join our team of catechists for this beautiful opportunity to share God's love and plant seeds of faith in the students.

Christmas Carols in Boronia Park Dec 11th 5pm – 9pm: This is a project of the combined local Christian churches which we are supporting. This is an event for the whole community which gives the churches an opportunity to speak (and sing) the good news of Jesus' birth.

For a Synodal Church: communion, participation, mission, Pope Francis has set our Church on a journey towards Synodality: a way of being Church where we seek to walk together under the guidance of The Spirit, where we make decisions through a process of discernment.

In the 1st phase of the Synod, Pope Francis has sought the *sensus fidelium* of the People of God – the sense of the faithful. Their output has been consolidated into the recently published document called *Enlarge the space of your tent*. A document that we are invited to read, to pray and reflect upon, to respond to. It addresses the many tensions that beset our Church, with a clear sense of inclusion, joy and hope.

Using the Reflection Guidelines provided, we are invited to come together in small groups for 90 minutes. Following prayer and reflection, participants are invited to share their reflections, listen respectfully to the thoughts of others, then record what is said. There are no right or wrong views, no debates, no voting; all contributions are welcome and equally valid. Our responses will consolidate with the rest of Oceania and forwarded to Rome in preparation of *Instrumentum Laboris* – the working document for the synodal meetings over 2023-24. Time is short; our reflections are due by December 9th. For our parish, reflection gatherings will be held between Friday 25th November and Wednesday, 7th December 2022.
