Diaconate is an ancient ministry in the church, going back, like priesthood to the first century, but was only restored in the latter half of the twentieth century. Deacons have a ministry to the margins of the Church, to make Christ present in places where the Church may not yet have reached. Then, as the deacon proclaims the gospel, preaches, and stands at the altar with the bishop or priest he brings the needs of the margins to the heart the Church in the Eucharist, and is a witness to all Catholics to reach out in the name of Jesus.

Way back in 1998 on a Sunday, I was attending the 10am Mass as usual at Our Lady Help of Christians' Church. After Holy Communion, a catechist talked to us about the ministry of catechism and that the diocese needed more catechists to teach in the public schools in the Epping/Carlingford area.

I am a Catechist!

I was listening intently and suddenly a thought came to me that I should become a catechist and spread the word of God to children in our area to both Catholic and non-Catholic children who attended scripture classes in public schools. After mass, I intended to approach the lady for a chat and perhaps have some of my questions answered. However I resisted because I thought it was going to be hard and boring, courses I had to do, the children would misbehave, etc.



The following Sunday the same lady was sitting in front of me again at the 10am Mass. I approached her after Mass and told her I was now ready to be a catechist as I had resolved my excuses. We made an appointment to meet at her home the following day so I could discuss my questions and learn firsthand.

Courses were prepared and I attended all of them, gathering in the St Gerard's meeting room with other likeminded people. The best way to learn is to teach, if your own faith education ended years ago, the resources and materials you are exposed to as a catechist will refresh and expand your own knowledge.

Your own faith will come alive, as a catechist, you will discover that prayer, liturgy and your own relationship with God will become more vibrant and meaningful.

You will become an active part of the most active part of your parish! When you join the catechists in your parish, you enter into a community that will support you on your faith journey, pray for and with you and encourage you in your Catholic way of life.

Being a catechist is a way of being a good steward by giving a bit of your most precious resource -- your time. You show your own family that you value religious education. Taking time out of your life to teach the faith shows your own children, grandchildren, siblings and family members that you put a high priority on religious education.

Being a catechist is fun, children remind adults to live and laugh in the moment and get enthused about things like holy days and stories of saints. At the end of his earthly ministry, Jesus said: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations."

In my opinion, we in Broken Bay are lucky to have a great coordinator in Katherine Tam who would bend over backwards to ensure all things run smoothly for the catechists - thank you Katherine. Katherine will gladly talk to you about this opportunity to volunteer your time and talent, make a difference in children's lives and ultimately yours. Spiritual benefits guaranteed, no experience needed; training will be provided.



Having red to my short tale, should anyone be interested in joining our catechist ministry, I can certainly recommend it to you, I have enjoyed being a catechist for the past 25 years. If you hear the Lord calling you to teach our children in the faith and want to know more, please hesitate no longer!

Last week in their Religious Education lessons, Kindergarten celebrated Pentecost through Scripture storytelling.
