## The First St Gerard's Playgroup

In 1974, there were many young families at St Gerard's. Robyn Bacon and her boys attended a playgroup with her sister at St Agatha's and realised that a playgroup would be ideal at St Gerard's.

Robyn approached Fr Nolan who was very supportive and mentioned that another parishioner, Elizabeth Single, had also broached the idea. Robyn and Elizabeth then got together and placed a notice in the church bulletin asking for expressions of interest. One of the first to contact was Maureen Berkley.

In March 1974 on a Thursday from 10am-12 noon, playgroup started. The first day saw approximately 36 adults attend plus many children. A fee of 40c per family helped with the costs of cordial and biscuits for the children's morning tea and also the supply of playdough and paints. For this first day, Robyn's husband built a slippery slide, see saw and paint easels. Father Nolan offered cupboard space for the storage of playgroup equipment in the hall.

Over time, word spread and the playgroup grew. It was a great social outlet for young mums as well as an introduction for children starting school at St Gerard's to have a familiar face on their first day.

Many lifelong friendships have been formed through playgroup. Over the years, playgroup was involved in many parish activities including Fetes where they ran a very successful stall.

## Our Time in the Parish - by Marie Black

For 50 years St Gerard's has offers offered many opportunities for parishioners to get involved and serve this vibrant parish community while making friends. As a family we have taken up some of these opportunities.

John and I moved into our Beecroft home in April, 1983 a week before the birth of our son, Douglass. We began attending Mass at St Gerard Majella Church and our son was baptised soon after. Our family grew over the years with the addition of our daughters Eileen and Sarah.

Since 1983 the early 1980's our parish has offered a wonderful opportunity to older teenagers and young adults to join Antioch with a "Weekend" early each year followed by weekly Sunday night meetings. Our whole family have been involved with our children joining Antioch and John and I being blessed to be Parent Couple when our younger daughter joined this energetic, fun and spiritual group of young people. Throughout our time with the Antioch community, we were witness to the deep spiritual prayer life, the uplifting, as well as, meditative music and the thoughtful talks presented by the youth to the youth of the parish. You know you are in the presence of God at an Antioch meeting, there is such a spiritual atmosphere in the room. Of course, they are teenagers and young adults full of fun and laughter, working out their place in the world while being able to practise their faith. (I still want to do the actions every time I hear an Antioch song.) Our children were part of the Antioch music and reading ministries that the Antioch community were involved in twice a month at the 6pm Vigil Mass. Our daughter Sarah was youth minister during some of her university years.

In our retirement years John and I joined Howard Carey at the Friday morning group who read, reflect and meditate on the Sunday readings together with Carole Wilson. When Howard became ill, we took over the facilitator role and these meetings continue each Friday morning at 10.10am with an amazing group of people.

We have had the opportunity to attend various talks and retreats and have been involved in leadership roles with ALPHA, the Lenten programs and Wild Goose, as well as attending the recent presentations by Bishop David Walker.

Today St Gerard's parishioners have so many opportunities to be supported and to serve others thanks to the foresight of the founding parishioners who worked so hard to establish this church community.

## RCIA - JESUS' BIG ASK ... BY DENNIS PORTEOUS

In this article, the first of three, let's consider Christian initiation and the commitment made at our baptism to be a disciple of Jesus, and the responsibility we have as a Christian Community to support one another in faith.

In the second article we will consider how we can further live out our baptismal commitment with a renewed invitation to become more actively involved in the life of our parish community.

In the final article will consider how we can be actively involved as the initiating community we are called to be.

Meanwhile the eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time."

#### Matthew 28:16-20

This passage is often referred to as the "great commission" because Jesus directs his disciples to go out, proclaim the Good News, and make disciples. This is the essence of our commitment, our 'yes' at the time we were baptised: Jesus calls us to go out and make disciples, by living the Christian life. The Church, the community of all the faithful, exists to continue this mission of proclaiming the Gospel message – that salvation comes through the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, the Paschal Mystery.

As the early Church grew, adults who accepted the message and made their declaration of faith in Jesus, often faced the prospect of persecution and potentially death, but their faith prevailed. In time, Christianity became accepted and so today the story is much different, the threat of persecution is often far from most of us. So how does this "great commission" involve us today – how are we to respond to Jesus' challenge to make disciples?

Among the renewals of Vatican II, the ancient process of Christian Initiation was reestablished, where adult initiation is the norm, making their own profession of faith. While this is the case, what we experience is the more often celebration of infant baptism. The place of infant baptism, where a child is unable to make the baptismal promises, adaptions to the adult baptismal ceremony were required. At this time only the sacrament of Baptism is celebrated. The Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist are deferred at this time until the child is able to be prepared for these Sacraments.

Two major additions are present, in which the parents (and godparents) make their commitment.

The first occurs during the 'Welcome', where the priest first speaks to the parents:

"You have asked to have your child baptised. In doing so you are accepting the responsibility of training him/her in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him/her up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbour. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?"

The priest then speaks to the godparents:

"Are you ready to help the parents of this child in their duty as Christian parents?"

The second addition occurs at the 'Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith' where the priest speaks to the parents and godparents: "... On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him/her up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life which God gives him/her is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow always stronger in his/her heart.

If your faith makes you ready to accept this responsibility, renew now the vows of your own baptism. Reject sin; profess your faith in Christ Jesus. This is the faith of the Church. This is the faith in which this child is about to be baptised."

The parish community too has its place in the process of assisting parents in the faith development of children. The Catholic Schools assist parents in the faith development of their children. The parish, through Special Religious Education Teachers (Catechists) have a similar role within the State School System. As children reach the age to celebrate the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, they are further assisted through the Diocesan Sacramental Programmes at the appropriate times by the parish.

This is our call, to respond to Jesus' big ask ... "Will you be my disciple?" How will you respond? The next article will focus on some ideas.

#### **Parish Development Update**

On February 4th this year we handed over the keys to the OLHC site (excluding the church), to Stockland as part of our obligation to provide vacant possession to them on this date. Despite the delays to the start of construction, the Parish receiveda Call Option Fee (effectively a deposit) of \$3.8m. There will be more payments to the parish when the development is completed in 2024, at which time we also have new parish facilities, underground parking, and a new school. Of the \$3.8m which the parish has received, \$1.4m has already been accounted for in development costs in the past few years or is allocated for the projected costs of the next 30 months.

This means that \$2.4m is now available for the use of the parish, and this is an opportunity for us that we have not had before. We need to plan and be cautious how we use this money. The Pastoral Council, Finance Committee and I have been putting a lot of thought and prayer into this in recent months and will continue to do so.

Our intention is that we hold onto \$400k as cash which we can use for some major parish projects over the next two years. These projects will be discerned with the parish in the months ahead, with a particular focus on improving OLHC to make it more comfortable while the development proceeds. The remaining \$2m will be invested with a newly created Diocesan Investment Fund which adopts an investment strategy guided by Catholic Social Teaching (CST) and the ethical principles of the Catholic Church to produce an income stream which can supplement your parish donations to fund ongoing mission of our parish. Our intention is that we do not spend this principal amount, but keep reinvesting it to produce income for the parish.

Both OLHC and St. Gerard's churches were built on the faith and hard-earned money of its settlers between 50 to over 100 years ago, so that their future generation had a place to worship and call home. We want our churches to continue to be here for another 100 years to support our children and their children so that no matter what challenges the world experiences they will always be welcomed in God's house. This is why your continued financial support through planned giving is essential to our parish.

Your giving to the parish, for which some of you have been giving faithfully for decades, is because you belong and you believe in the good work the parish can do. With the money we have now received from this development, we can amplify your ongoing giving to do even greater work in the future for our Epping-Carlingford Parish and to the benefit of the growing Epping and Carlingford communities
