Α defibrillator is a device that sends an electric shock to the heart to restore a normal heartbeat. An instructional video is available here https://youtu.be/DHkyq20bbMg?t=342 While this video shows everything about our defibrillator, this link will start at the training section at 5 min 42 secs. Our defibrillator uses voice prompts to guide

you should you need to use it. Please note that there may be several reasons someone may have collapsed and is unresponsive. There is a priority of things to do immediately, like calling 000, checking airways and CPR. An easy-to-use checklist will be available in the defibrillator cabinet. 



Charisms of the Holy Spirit

This weekend, 6-7th May, we are running our first charisms course in our parish and our speaker is coming from Canberra.

For those who might not be able to attend the course, what are charisms?

Charisms are supernatural graces given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit. They are received through baptism and like gifts, they need to be opened to be used for the building of God's kingdom.

What are some examples?

There's no exhaustive number of charisms. They are primarily listed in Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12 and Ephesians 4. The Catholic Spiritual Gifts Inventory covers 24 of the most common charisms. They are administration, celibacy, craftmanship, discernment of spirits, encouragement, evangelisation, faith, giving, healing, helper, hospitality, intercessory prayer, leadership, mercy, missionary, music, pastoring, prophecy, service, teaching, voluntary poverty, knowledge, wisdom and writing.

Hello everyone, I am Michelle and I am a catechist at Cheltenham Girls High for Year 8 students.

My journey as a catechist started 5 years ago when two lovely OLHC (Epping) School mums, who were catechists in our parish, referred me to Mary O'Byrne. At first, I was hesitant as I am not a native speaker and didn't feel I had enough biblical knowledge. Seeking and praying for His guidance helped, and I was soon told that I could start as an assistant and received training provided by Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD). Structured lesson plans with teacher notes, Power point slides and student notes are also provided to support us.

This prepared me for handling my own class. It helped me overcome my language barrier. I prepared each lesson and practised my lines beforehand. As a result, not only did I enrich my biblical knowledge, but also my English skills.

Approximately a year after being a catechist, I joined the RCIA programme and my mentor, Cho-Wai, became my sponsor. I spent my primary school life in a Catholic school and in secondary school I attended a Lutheran school. However, I never felt like that I wanted to be baptised until my early 40s. My baptism experience enhanced my determination to be a catechist. The seed of my faith was sown when I was little and sprouted decades later.

Primary school children and teenagers nowadays are influenced and tempted by social media. Developing a good faith will give them stability in life and help them in their darkest times... especially if they have no one to depend on, they can always turn to God. I am glad that my daughter, who studied in OLHC Epping School, had teachers with strong faith in God and taught her so well. I hope students in the state schools also get the opportunity to know God and have fruitful lives. Everyone's path to God is different. What I need to do is sow the seeds in the students' hearts and trust Him.

As stated in 2 Timothy 4:2, "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching."

We stand by the students together facing this challenging world.


