

Caring for Our Common Home: In May our parish had a forum to hear the stories of refugees and asylum seekers and then to look at practical ways in which we can respond. Several strategies emerged which we will now work on, including collecting specific items for Jesuit Refugee Services, details of which are below as well as within the bulletin pages.

This forum was an effective way of engaging in listening to real life stories, and so we're going to use the same format for our next social justice focus on the environment. "Care for our common home" (planet earth) is the language Pope Francis uses in his landmark encyclical Laudato 'Si to draw Catholics and all people of good will to join together in a common mission of caring for the earth, not just because it is our home, but also because it is created by God and in caring for creation we honour God as Creator.

We invite you to join us for a forum on Caring for Our Common Home on *Sunday August 7th, 11am – 1pm at St Gerard's meeting room*. This will be an opportunity for us to share our stories of what is important to us, and to hear from some people with expertise in environmental issues. We'll then look to find practical responses for ourselves as a parish and a wider community.

ST GERARD'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS – 16TH OCTOBER 2022

We aim to reflect and celebrate with past and present parishioners the 50 years life of our parish at St Gerard's, to thank God for blessing and graces on all the families past and present, and to ask God to continue to bless and grow our parish through the intercession of St Gerard. To kickstart this celebration, each fortnight we will feature a parishioner's story and history with our church. This fortnight, our dear **Marie Saul**, sacristan of St Gerard's Church writes for us and is pictured below with her family and some fellow parishioners:



The name of the Parish, Epping and Carlingford is very appropriate for me because Bert, Chris and I moved to Ray Road, Epping in June 1960. At that time Epping was our parish. Chris attended school there until December 1964, and in 1965 the children within the boundaries of the new Carlingford Parish were transferred from Epping to Carlingford.

On the 13th of May 1962 after receiving 10 inches of rain the night before, we had our first Mass at St Gerard Majella Church Carlingford which was the parish hall in those days. Fr Nolan named the church St Gerard Majella after a suggestion from a parishioner who was expecting her 8th child. St Gerard Majella is the patron saint of mothers and babies.

We all had to walk down the driveway because it was a quagmire, but that didn't deter us, and Fr Nolan arrived in his galoshes feeling very proud and happy. On the 3rd of March 1963 Carlingford became a parish of its own with Fr Nolan as parish priest.

As my family grew so did the parish. The Alter Society was formed by Bernice Hensby. The ladies would clean and dust around the sanctuary and arrange the flowers. The flowers were, and still are, donated by Frank (RIP) and Maria Martelli and family since 1972. Our church choir was formed by Kit Smith in the early days and was very strong.

Antioch was introduced by Fr Casey in 1983, my daughter being in the first group. Antioch is still very strong in our parish today.

In 1989 after retiring Bert became more involved doing maintenance and looking after the gardens, he made large crosses for both churches and the bulletin boxes as well, to name a few projects. Bert retired six months before he died in 2006.

Since the death of Bert, I have become more involved in the church which is such a comfort to me. I had a reason to get up in the morning. I help in the sacristy, taking Communion to the sick, serving on the alter and St Vincent de Paul.

I have made some very close friends at the church and thank God and the priests, past and present. I am very proud to be part of the Parish Family here at Epping and Carlingford.





We also have coffee meet ups organised by some proactive catechists for their fellow catechists in the same school as not everyone sees everyone due to classes running at different times.

While half of the year has passed and all of our schools have Scripture classes running almost uninterrupted, 2022 so far has not been uneventful. Quite a number of our catechists were Covid positive, fortunately no major health concerns.

We have happy news of births of mostly grandchildren, weddings, new jobs for which we sincerely send our congratulations. We also have a few health issues for which we pray for their speedy recovery. Due to Covid restrictions for almost 2 years, a few of us are rightly eager to visit overseas families. We have a number of planned long absences and quite a few unexpected ones.

We would like to thank our catechists keep watching out for each other and put in extra effort in standing-in for those who are absent for good reasons. It has been hard work for all of us.

We are currently stretched on resources and we pray to our kind and loving God to send us additional help so that we can have another 6 months of uninterrupted scripture classes for our ~800 students in the public schools.
