BEWARE: PHISHING EMAILS - WHAT ARE THEY?

Some of you may have received an email seemingly from Fr Jim, asking you to contact him. Other past scam emails have purported to be from him asking for money. It is important that you report this to the parish office and delete the email if you receive one, without responding to the sender. If you hover over the name of the sender of an email you'll see an unofficial sending address. Fr Jim will only ever email you from the official parish/diocesan email account, never from any other email address. A recent example of what a scam email can look like is on the right:
