Anzac Day is Tuesday April 25th. Although we don't usually have Mass on Tuesdays, we will have a special Mass on 9.30am at St Gerard's.

Adult Confirmation: There are many adults who have missed out on receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. Every year Bishop Anthony offers this sacrament to adults on the feast of Pentecost, which is *Sunday May 28th* this year. If you would like to take up this opportunity Fr Jim will offer two *preparation sessions on Monday May 8th and 15th at 7.30pm*. Contact Fr Jim by May 1st to take part. In preparation please have your certificate of baptism ready.

Faith at Home: In Acts 2:42-47 we read that the early disciples met together in the temple for worship, and also met to pray in their homes. We want to encourage families to pray at home, and so for the next three weeks we'll be offering our collectable Faith@Home cards to children at each Mass. These cards are fridge magnets with prayers for different occasions like grace before meals or bedtimes.

Getting involved: Last year 37% of parishioners said they performed some ministry in the parish (in the National Church Life Survey). That's substantially up from 26% in 2016. Let's see if we can get to 100%. For when everyone does something, nobody has to do too much, and we can all find joy in our ministry. If you're wondering how you can best contribute to the ministry of the Church, you might like to join us for the **Called and Gifted course** which we're offering on **May 6th & 7th**. This a great short intensive to unpack the charisms of the Holy Spirit. The charisms are supernatural graces given to each of us at Baptism from God to bear results for the kingdom of God beyond our normal human abilities. All of us have received a unique combination of charisms to equip us for our mission in life. This course is excellent for anyone who haven't heard of the charisms before, or for people who want to learn more about the Holy Spirit and what gifts God has graced you. We will be inviting a speaker from Canberra to teach us this amazing content.

GROW IN FAITH

1. St Teresa of Avila is one of the Church's greatest mystics, yet her teaching on prayer is down to earth and accessible to all. Bishop David Walker will lead us through the works and teachings of St Teresa of Avila on 6 *Wednesdays 10.15am – 11.30am from May 10th, St Gerard's Meeting Room*.

2. The First Spiritual Exercises: Many people find that they can recite prayers, but don't know what else to say when they pray. Others find that prayer is a one-sided conversation but don't know how to hear God's response. The First Spiritual Exercises is a five week introduction to Ignatian (Jesuit) prayer which scaffolds a way of personal prayer and a deep listening. We gather in small groups for 90 minutes each week at which we are led through an exercise of prayer. We then spend 20-30 minutes in prayer

each day during the following week, then come together to share the fruit of our prayer and to experience the next prayer exercise. Groups will meet starting the week of May 22nd -

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Volunteer with Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS): JRS is an international Catholic organisation with a mission to accompany, serve and advocate for the rights of refugees, people seeking asylum, and other forcibly displaced people.

In Australia, JRS works to support people who are in the process of seeking asylum and temporary migrants in vulnerable situations, through a range of programs, including casework support, emergency relief, accompaniment, foodbank, educational/social support programs, employment support, legal clinics, schools engagement, advocacy and a specialist program focusing on support for women who are at-risk or who have experienced Domestic Family Violence.

JRS works where the need is the greatest, where people are most marginalised and where we can do the greatest good. Much of work is supported by volunteers, with more than 75 volunteers per week serving in a number of face-to-face and remote roles across the different services provided. In 2022, JRS served over 3000 people across various programs.

To start as a volunteer with JRS, we need to complete our volunteer paperwork.

- Volunteer Details Form
- JRS Code of Conduct
- Working With Children Check: All of our volunteers are required to have a current Working With Children Check. If you don't already have one, you can apply for one through Service NSW which is free for volunteers here: https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/apply-working-children-check.
- Police Checks: We will then provide your details to Verify Now, a digital employment screening platform that conducts police checks on our behalf. They will contact you and send you a pack requesting various documents and information necessary to complete the police check.
- Vaccination Status: JRS requires all onsite staff and volunteers to be fully vaccinated.

Hi all, I am Miranda and this is my fifth year as a catechist. I teach kindergarten scripture classes at Epping West Public School.

5 years ago, I read a message from the parish bulletin that they were looking for more scripture teachers for the public schools in the local community. I then contacted the catechist coordinator. After a brief meeting and completing necessary procedures as I had no prior experience, I started as an assistant.

Before signing up to the Ministry, I browsed the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) website of the Diocese to learn more about the work of the catechists. I realised only then that it was such a

big undertaking of the Diocese. It involves training programs (most of them can be done online), providing well-designed teaching materials for use in classes, all prepared by experienced personnel in the Diocese and with that, our 30 minutes teaching each week is well & fully supported. As I work part-time, doing a 30-minute class per ... continued overleaf

week is perfectly fine for me.

Teaching kindy students is somewhat challenging. Due to their young age, I often wonder if they really understand the messages delivered to them. It is also hard to gain their full attention for a full lesson. However, I learnt not to underestimate these little kids; whilst in the one moment they may be playing with their friends, but in the next minute, they could ask you questions about what you have just told them!

In the past 5 years, there were many happy moments for me as a catechist:

Once when I walked through the school playground, a girl who was once in my kindy class came up to me and said "Hi, how are you, do you remember me?" She remembered me even after 2 years since I last taught her. Another time after the 3 months lockdown, on the first day when I went back to the school, a boy came up to me and said, "Hi, you are back!" See, they do remember something (at least their teacher) from their scripture classes!

At the end of each class, I ask the students to say a little prayer to thank God for his teaching. **Deep in my heart, I also** give thanks to the Holy Spirit who inspire and work through me in delivering the stories of Jesus Christ and the Word of God to the children so that they can receive God's Good News. I hope that the small seeds that we have planted in the little minds will, one day, flourish into trees of faith.

As Pope John Paul II said, "Don't be afraid. Dear sisters & brothers, come forward and answer the call to become a catechist, and experience the joy of working with the Holy Spirit".

"Nametag Sunday" kicks off at all Masses at OLHC on the lst Sunday in May,

this being the 6/7th May 2023.

Building a strong sense of community within this parish is shown to be our Parish #1 priority from the Church Life Parish Profile survey that we completed in both 2022 and also in 2016. Your PPC have been discussing and praying using Fr James Mallon's "Devine Renovation" book, and we have a plan.



How do we build a strong sense of community?

We believe it's through "*Fellowship*". Fellowship is defined as a friendly feeling that exists between people who have a shared interest or are doing something as a group.

What are 3 benefits of fellowship ? (Rev J Patrick Street)

- 1.*Fellowship builds friendships*. For example, the early church close relationships in Acts 2 was because of their commitment to Jesus and to each other. Jesus said, "I no longer call you servants, I have called you friends" (John15:15).
- 2.*Fellowship builds unity*, and the church is called to be united, having everything in common and being of the same mind. Paul says "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Eph 4:3).
- 3.*Fellowship builds Gods' kingdom.* "And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47). Our fellowship is the relationship we have with one another and with Jesus; this is our witness to the world. Jesus said, "By this shall all know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another" (John 13;35).

How can we build fellowship?

- 1. Nametag Sunday: will be on the 1st Sunday of each month at every Mass at OLHC we ask you to bring your own nametag if you have one. We will have tables set up in front of the church for those of you who do not have a nametag, so you can write your own name down on the Paper Nametag provided before entering the church. Jesús says "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matt 25:35).
- 2. Hospitality: at each "Nametag Sunday Mass", we invite you to stay for a little while after Mass and have a Cuppa and a Chat. This gives each of us an opportunity for fellowship with each other and to build a strong sense of Community within the Parish. My dad always said, "The best thing you can give anyone is your time." Jesus said, "Give and it will be given to you... For the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38).
