5 JUNE 2022 PENTECOST SUNDAY

Pentecost is the great feast of the Holy Spirit. It is the climax of the Easter Season. It is the birth of the Church. It is *a time of renewal and reinvigoration* as we experience, as the apostles did, that the Spirit comes to us, fills us, and sends us out on mission. Our Wild Goose program has been exploring this these past few weeks. We will be marking Pentecost with two special events:

- an afternoon of prayer at St Gerard's on Pentecost Sunday, June 5th, and
- an ecumenical liturgy at Epping Uniting Church on June 7th. The full details for both of these events are in this bulletin.

It's also a time to think about what gifts the Spirit has given you, and how you are using them for building up the Kingdom of God in our church and beyond. In the coming weeks we'll be inviting you to volunteer for new ministries, with the goal that everyone in the parish is contributing to one ministry each.

New Parishioners: We have received some of the preliminary results of the National Church Life Survey in which we took part in February. The results are very positive, showing growth in a number of areas of parish life compared to the last survey in 2016. One important piece of data is that 27% of people reported being new to the parish in the past five years. This includes 22% who have come from another parish, and 5% who were not attending a church at all five years ago. Nurturing and engaging new parishioners the way in which a parish grows.

As part of our pastoral plan and with the Pastoral Council we have discerned the opportunity to create a role called a "**New Parishioner Engagement Coordinator**" who will work with all new parishioners, with a focus on families for baptism and new families at OLHC and St Gerard's Schools. I am pleased to announce that after a competitive interview process in which we received several excellent applications I have appointed **Serena Kozanic** and **Belinda Shi** to this role. Serena and Belinda are parishioners with school and pre school aged children who are well positioned to create welcoming pathways for new families in our parish. They'll introduce themselves in the next parish bulletin.

Fr Jim, Fr Vincent and Richard Houwing will be away on these days. Weekday Masses will be replaced with Communion Services. Staff and volunteers will be rostered to ensure the Office remains open.




FROM THE DIOCESE

Sacramental Programme & Children's Ministries - From Lynn's Messy Desk



Preparation sessions for First Eucharist has commenced. Candidates are required to attend a session once a week with their parent over 4 weeks for preparation of this sacrament. There are three sessions conducted online plus one in-person for practice. These sessions are on:

1. Bread of Life
2. This is My Body
3. God's Word & The Eucharist – The Holy Mass
4. How to Receive Holy Communion



On the weekend of **June 5th (including the Saturday 6pm Vigil)**, the Candidates will once again be presented at select Masses and when they are called forth, they will each receive a reflection booklet on the Lord's Prayer.

As we enter into our second session: **This is My Body**, we explore the connections between the Jewish Passover meal, the Last Supper and the celebration of the Eucharist at the Mass using these known stories in the Bible to teach the children our Christian history. The children also learn about "transubstantiation", that which takes place when the bread and wine on the altar becomes the Body and Blood of Christ, although the appearances remain as bread and wine. The parents are guided to explain to their children that as we are fed by Jesus in the Eucharist, the Holy Spirit helps us to grow as a community of love; we become the body of Christ.

One of the best things about going online is the opportunity to share videos with the families. In this session, we will watch the first 9 minutes of Presence - Episode 1 on <https://watch.formed.org/videos/god-is-with-us> This is a remarkable beginning of a captivating series that explains the kind of meal God wants to share with us, the sort where we bask in each other's presence and grow in love for one another. For most of us, this doesn't happen at a typical meal but this is the kind of meal He has prepared for us and invites us to participate in through the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Please continue to keep these children and their families in your prayers in the coming weeks as they prepare for a significant milestone in their sacramental journey.

Children's Liturgy AKA Kidz Word at St Gerard's 9:30am Mass: Last Sunday our adult leaders, Sabitha and Nilu came up with an ingenious way to explain the wonders of the Holy Spirit to the young children. One child was navigating another child whose eyes were closed, to walk through the group seated on the floor. Just like how the Holy Spirit guides us and we must learn to trust the spirit of God! The children had so much fun and they wanted to take turns to be involved. Some snapshots are on the right to share with you.



Those preparing for Pentecost will be praying with you Come Holy Spirit, so the Spirit comes into their lives, your life and the lives of those you love. Heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask. *Luke 11:13*.

This is our hope that this Pentecost will be our Holy Spirit experience.

Wild Goose at Our Lady Help of Christians Church: Many came to our gathering last Friday evening to prepare for Pentecost. They met over finger food then moved to the front to watch the first video from The Wild Goose series on the Holy Spirit. 
