Dear sisters and brothers,

Last Wednesday marked the beginning of ordinations to the transitionary diaconate of three seminarians from our diocese on their way to priesthood. **Roger Delmonte**, who began his time in the Broken Bay diocese in our parish, was ordained at Hornsby Cathedral by Bishop Anthony, and next Wednesday **Aldrin Valdehueza** who also spent some time here on two occasions at Epping and Carlingford, will be ordained at Our Lady of Dolours Chatswood. Unfortunately due to Covid restrictions this is an invitation only celebration. The final diaconate ordination will occur on Wednesday week when **Sam French** will be ordained at Pennant Hills. We give thanks to God for these signs of hope for our diocese and pray that their ministries of service will be fruitful for those they serve and provide an important period of preparation as they journey towards the Order of Presbyter (priesthood).

During the month of November, a number of our young families will have the opportunity to celebrate First Holy Communion with their children. Due to Covid restrictions, these celebrations were postponed in June and will now be spread over a number of weeks during our parish Masses. On occasions, we will require all parishioners to register for certain Masses. Please keep an eye on the bulletin through November and a listening ear as to when registering will be required.

I also draw your attention to our next offering of "Unlocking The Mystery of the Bible" which commences next Tuesday evening at Epping. Last year we held this programme as a next step on from Alpha as part of equipping us all as missionary disciples in our love and knowledge of the scriptures. "Unlocking" offers an overview of the Bible which can provide us with a "helicopter view" in contextualising the various books/ writings of the sacred authors and generally deepen our appreciation of God's Word for our lives. It also is a wonderful opportunity to meet new parishioners and become reacquainted with others. Please consult the bulletin for more information and give serious thought to being part of this exciting journey. Physical numbers are restricted so please register!

Finally, this coming weekend we have our annual **Parish Leadership meeting**, consisting of representatives from our Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Committee and Parish Team, as part of our preparation for our new parish plan. My thanks also to everyone who has responded to our parish survey, the results of which will be made avail-

able to the entire parish and will be seriously considered at our coming meeting. Your prayers are greatly appreciated!

Reflection on Sunday's Gospel—Listen ~ God promises. Jesus calls.

This summary prepares you to hear God speaking or to reflect after listening to the Word of God. In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah, speaking for God promises us ~ The Lord of hosts will prepare a banquet; remove the shroud enwrapping all nations; destroy Death for ever; wipe away the tears from every cheek; take away his people's shame; for the Lord has said so. Our response ~ We exult, and we rejoice, our God has saved us. Is 25:6-10

In the Gospel, Jesus told this parable to the chief priests and elders. Mat 22:1-14

'The *kingdom of heaven* may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent servants. Call those who had been invited, but **they would not come**. He sent more servants. "Tell those who have been invited - I have my banquet all prepared. Come to the wedding."

But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business. The rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. His troops destroyed those murderers and burnt their town.

Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; invite everyone you can find to the wedding." These servants collected together everyone, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

The king came in to look at the guests. He said to one person not wearing a wedding garment, "**How did you get in here without a wedding garment?**" The person was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind this one and throw this one out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." (Jesus challenges us) *For many* are called, but few are chosen.

Our response is to pray the psalm ~ **The Lord is my shepherd**; there is nothing I shall want. If I should walk in the valley of darkness, no evil would I fear. You have prepared a banquet for me. Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. Ps 22(23)

In the second reading, **Paul prays for us** ~ There is nothing you cannot master with the help of the One who gives you strength. God will fulfil all your needs, in Christ Jesus, as lavishly as only God can. Glory to God, our Father, for ever and ever. Amen. Phil 4:19-20

Supporting Missionary Disciples

Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel....The Many Faces of the Eucharist

Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." (Mt 22:42)

Christians argue a lot about the Eucharist. What does it mean? What should it be called? How often should it be celebrated? Who should be allowed to fully participate?

So, there are lots of views on the Eucharist.

- For some it is a meal, for others it is a sacrifice.
- For some it is a ritual act, sacred and set apart, for others it is a community gathering, the more mess and kids the better.
- For some it is a deep personal prayer, for others it is a communal worship for the world.
- For some its very essence is a coming together, a communion of those united in a single denominational faith, while for others part of its essence is its reaching out, its innate imperative to wash the feet of those who are different from ourselves.
- For some it is a celebration of sorrow, a making present of Christ's suffering and the thus the place where we can break down, for others it is the place to celebrate joy and sing alleluia.
- For some it is a ritual remembrance, a making present of the historical events of Jesus' dying, rising, ascending, and sending of the Holy Spirit, for others it is a celebration of God's presence with us today.
- For some it is a celebration of the Last Supper, something to be done less frequently, for others it is God's daily feeding of his people with a new manna, Christ's body, and is something to be done every day.
- For some it is a celebration of reconciliation, a ritual that forgives and unites, for others unity and reconciliation are pre-conditions for its proper celebration.
- For some it is a vigil act, a gathering that is essentially about waiting for something else or someone else to appear, for others it is a celebration of something that is already present, something that is asking to be received and recognized.
- For some it is understood to make present the real, physical body of Christ, for others it is understood to make Christ present in a real but spiritual way.

- Some call it the Lord's Supper, others call it the Eucharist, others call it the Mass.
- Some celebrate it once a year, some celebrate it four times a year, some celebrate it every Sunday, and some celebrate it every day.

Who's right? In truth, the Eucharist is all of these things, and more. It is like a finely-cut diamond twirling in the sun, every turn giving off a different sparkle. It is multivalent, carrying different layers of meaning, some of them in paradoxical tension with others. There is, even in scripture, no one theology of the Eucharist, but instead there are various complementary theologies of the Eucharist.

For instance, we already see variations among the apostolic communities as to how they understood the Eucharist, what it should be called, and how often it should be celebrated. Some early communities called it the Lord's Supper, connected its meaning very much to the commemoration of the Last Supper, and celebrated it less frequently. But the apostolic community that formed around John connected its theology and practice very much to the concept of God feeding his people daily with manna and they celebrated it every day, given that we need sustenance daily.

As well, we see some of its paradoxical elements right within its central symbols, bread and the wine: bread is both is symbol of joy, togetherness, health, and achievement (the smell of fresh bread and the primal beauty of a loaf of bread) even as it is made up of broken kernels of wheat who had to be crushed in their individuality and be baked in fire to become that bread. Wine is both a festive drink, the drink of celebration, of wedding, even as it is crushed grapes and represents the blood of Jesus and the blood and suffering of all that is crushed in our world and in our lives.

How does one put this all together?

During my theological training, I took three major courses on the Eucharist and, afterwards, decided that I didn't understand it. But the fault was not in courses, which were excellent. The fault, which is not a fault at all but a marvel, lies in the richness of the Eucharist itself.

In the end, it defies not just theology professors, but metaphysics, phenomenology, and language itself.

There is no adequate explanation of the Eucharist for the same reason that, in the end, there is no adequate explanation for love, for embrace, and for the reception of life and spirit through touch. Certain realities take us beyond language because that is their very purpose. They do what words cannot do. They also are beyond what we can neatly nail down in our understanding.

And that is true of the Eucharist. Any attempt to nail down its full meaning will forever come up short because it will always eventually get up and walk away with that nail!
